# Wedding Solemnized

Guests were registered by Leeta Barnes.

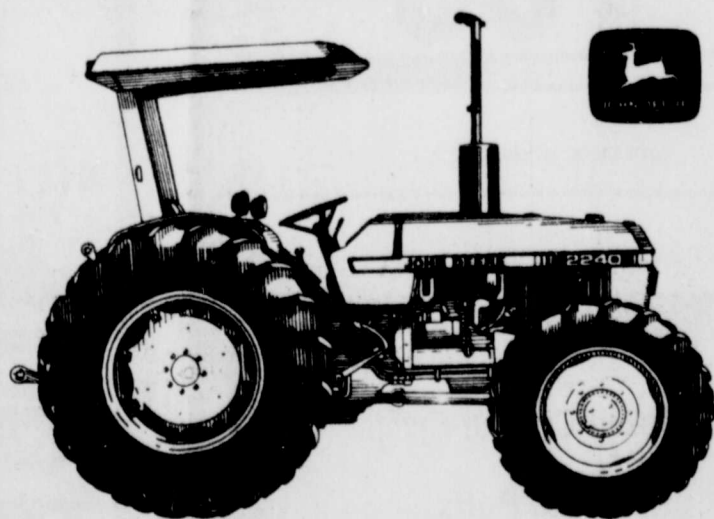
For going away, Mrs. Barron wore a pink gown with floral trim and shirital hem. Her corsage was of matching daisies.
