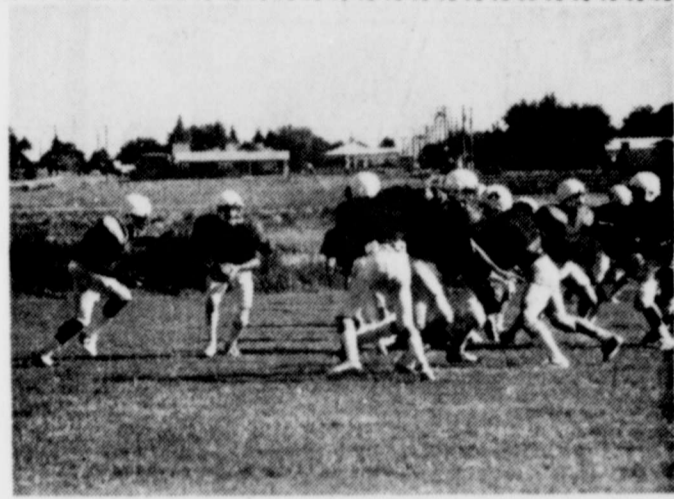

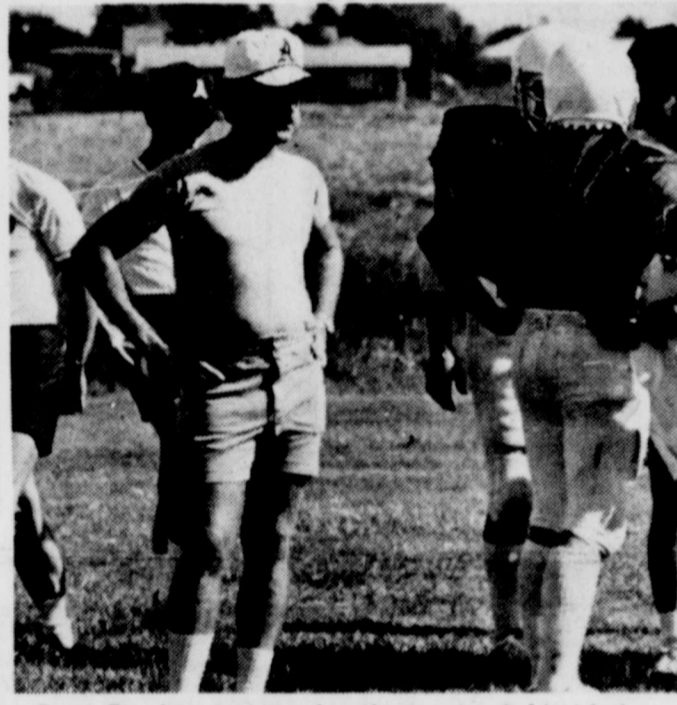

## School Board Accepts Bids At 8/4 Meeting

Bid items highlighted the regular meeting of the Abernathy Board of Education on August 4, 1980.

The Phase II bid of the renovation of the old elementary building including electrical, mechanical, and interior work went to Monterey Construction Company of Lubbock. Monterey Construction was also awarded the contract for renovation of the band hall. Their total bid for the two projects was \$250,900.

Other bidders included: Jerry Galley Construction Company, Ed Lampe Construction Company, Claude Martin and Sons, Pharr and Pharr Enterprises, Sam J. Smith Construction Company, C. B. Thompson Construction Company, and Wardrop and Associates.

Gasoline bids were received from Phillips 66 and Consumer Fuel. Consumer Fuel was awarded the contract with a low bid of \$1.10 per gallon. Borden Milk Company was again awarded the milk bid for 1980-81 school year with a bid of .1525 per carton. Bell Milk Company submitted an identical bid.

Insurance bids for the school fleet of buses, trucks, and cars were submitted by Hubbard Insurance, Becton Insurance, and DuBoise Insurance. Hubbard Insurance was the low bidder with a total of \$3,165.

Student insurance was again awarded to Heritage Insurance of San Antonio. Each parent will be given a letter concerning policies, coverages, and deadlines for purchasing student insurance after school begins.

The board voted to place its unemployment insurance with a cooperative group administered by the Texas Association of School Boards.

Wording changes in the Junior High Handbook were accepted as presented. Also adopted was a policy concerning liability coverage for board members and school employees.

August 14th at 8:00 p.m. was set as the date for a public hearing on the intent to adopt a tax increase. It was pointed out that this was not a tax increase, but school income increase based on increased mineral values. Taxes will not be increased for home owners, farmers or businesses.

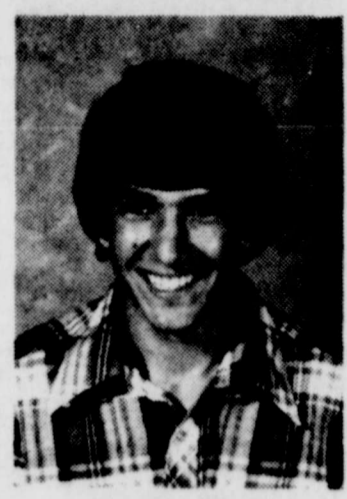

The suit claims "wrongful death" as the result of the company "negligence". The Abernathy resident claims in her suit that the defendant failed to stop at a stop sign because of excessive speed instead of brake failure.

Mrs. Perez also has filed a petition for a temporary restraining order and for a temporary injunction to prevent UPS employees from altering the condition of the truck involved in the collision until a hearing is held to consider her request.

A hearing was scheduled for Aug. 18 in Judge William Shaver's 140th District Court to consider Mrs. Perez motion for permission to inspect and photograph the UPS truck.

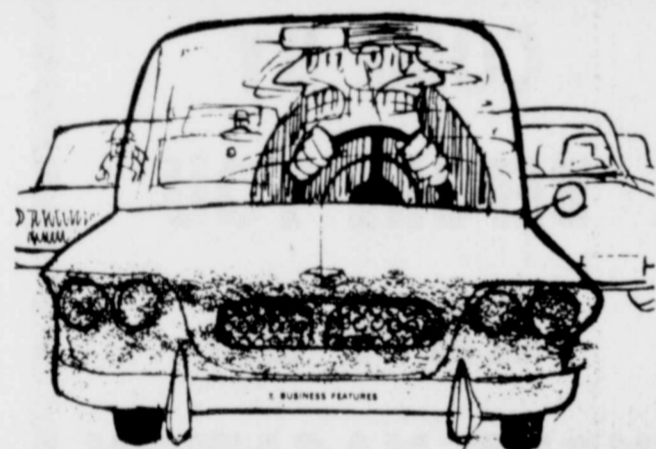

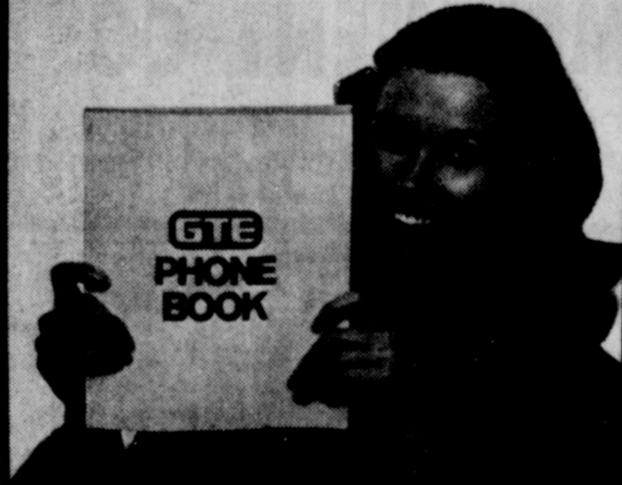
