



renovation of the old elementary building including electrical, mechanical, and interior work went to Monterey Construction Company of Lubbock, Monterey Construction was also awarded the contract for renovation of the band hall. Their total bid for the two projects was \$250,900. Other bidders included: Jerry Gailey Construction Company, Ed Lampe Construction Com-Claude Martin and Sons, Pharr and Pharr Enter-Company, and Wardroup and Associates.

Gasoline bids were received from Phillips 66 and Consumer Fuel. sumer Fuel was awarded the contract with a low bid of \$1.10 per gallon. Borden Milk Company was again awarded the milk bid for 1980-81 school year with a bid of . 1525 per carton. Bell Milk Company submitted an identical bid.

Insurance bids for the school fleet of buses, trucks, and cars were submitted by Hubbard Insurance, Becton Insurance, and DuBose Insurance. Hubbard 'nsurance was the low bidder with a total of \$3, 165.




