The board accepted a bid of \$34,423 from Lydick Roofing, to re-roof Abernathy High School. Three other bids were submitted by Texas Roofing, Ajax Roofing, and Hamilton Roofing companies, but were not accepted because all were over \$36 thousand.

Immunizations Required For Elementery Students

convention.

Section 2.09 of the Texas Education Code requires that all children entering Texas Elementary schools must have been immunized against certain diseases. The following is a list of required immunizations:

Children less than five years of age enrolled in pre-school programs are required to have three doses of oral polio, three doses of DTP vasccines and one dose each of measles, rubella and mumps vaccine.

Children enrolled in kindergarten through grade five should have at least three doses of oral polio vaccine with

the provision that one dose must have been received after age 4. At least three doses of DTP but one dose must have been received after age 4.

All students must have received measles vaccine after age 1 or provide a history of measles illness. One dose of Rubella vaccine is required. Mumps vaccine is required for all

students through eight years of age or

A copy of the student's original birth certificate will also be needed for enrollment this fall.




