USPS BOARD ANNOUNCES RATE INCREASE FILING At its mecting November 1 in Washington, D.C. the
USP Board of Governors announced that it has authorized the Postal Service to file a request for a general rate increase with the Fostal Rate Commission. While the filing
requests an increase in the cost of a First Class requests an increase in the cost of a First-Class stamp from 20 to 23 cents. Boird Chairman Robert L. Hardesty
emphasized the fact thai the request for a rate increase will not mean that Americans immediately have to pay 23 cents
to mail a First-Class letter. 10) maia a first-Class letter.
Hardesty repeated a statement he made this summer that no rate increase will take effect until October 1. 1984, at the earliest. The Board's action merely the Postal Rate Commission, which has 10 months to mate a recommended decision. Mailers and other interested parties will participate in the Commission's proceeding and make their views known. The Governors will then carefully
review the Commission's recommended decision based the entire record of its proceeding. Hardesty also noted that the requested increase is wel
