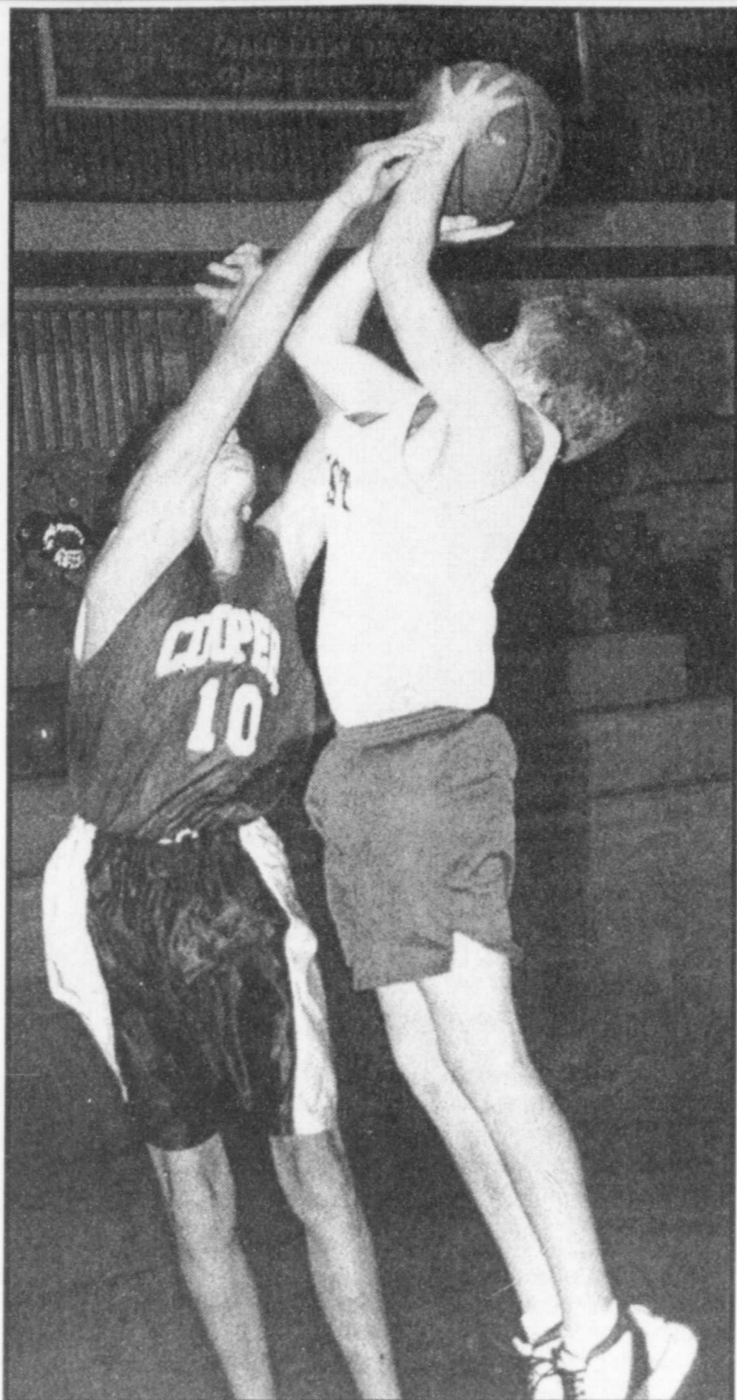

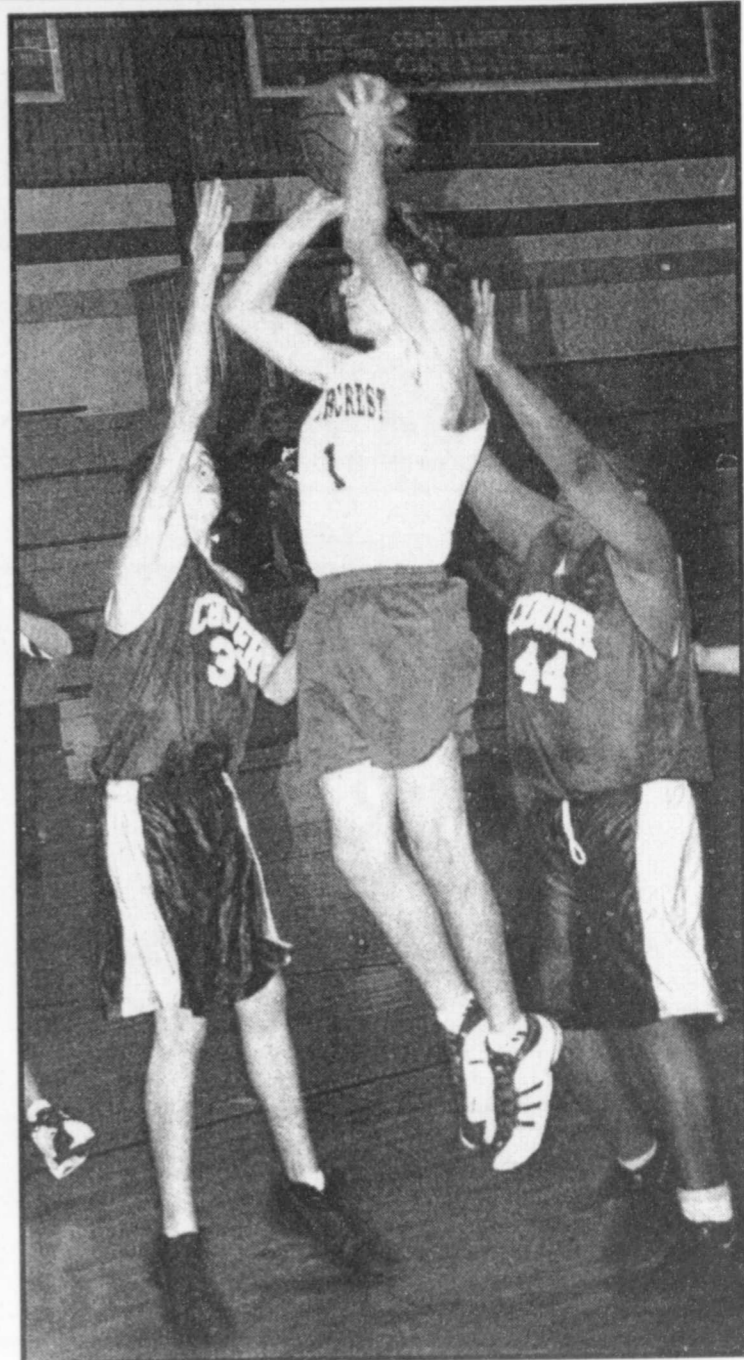

The prospective bridegroom is the son of Mrs. Ann Collins of Starke, Florida and Robert Templeton, Jr. of Iola, TX.

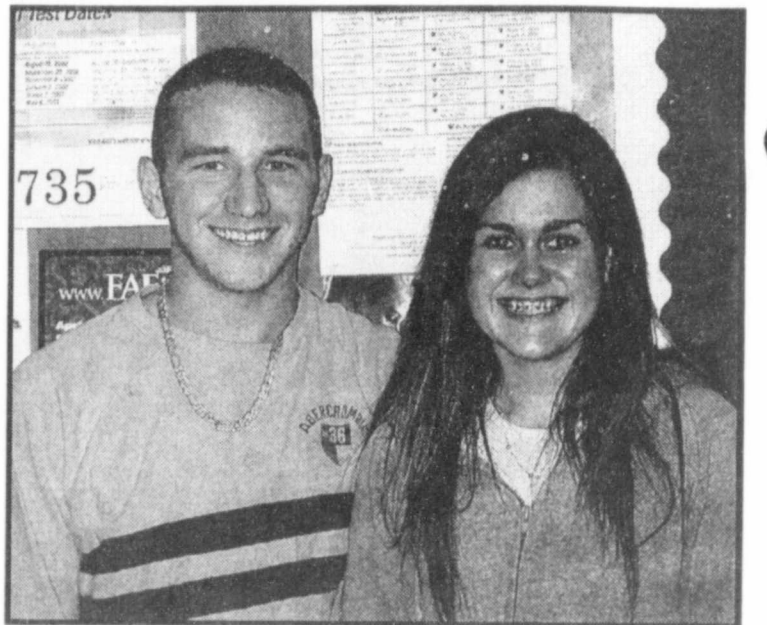

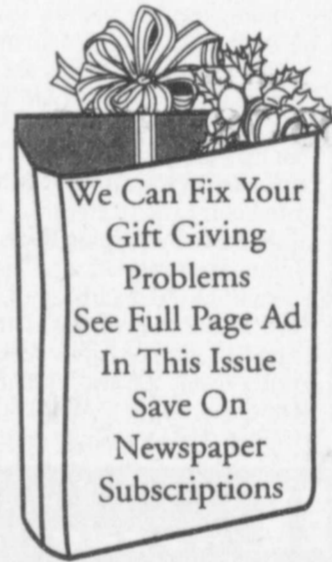
County Committee.

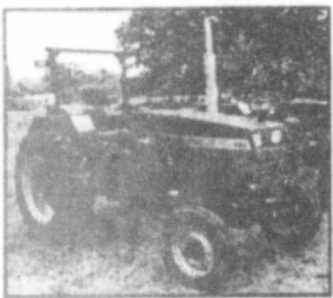

It was taken at 11:21 a.m. On November 24, 1963, two days after the assassination of then U.S. President John F. Kennedy in Dallas. Oswald was, of course, accused of the assassination. 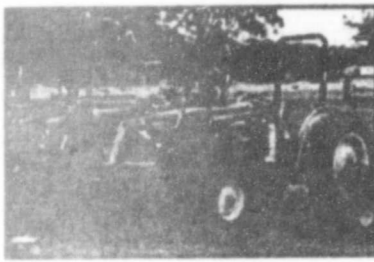

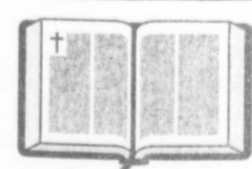
