About 50 people attended the event. Barbecued brisket, baked beans, salads and a wide variety of other foods, including desserts were served.





High point was Rydell Minter with 14, Brandon Oats 11, Trevor Upchurch and Michael Madewell 10 each and Randy Barber 9.




LADY PATRIOTS Lori Malone and Shawonna Rhoades blocked a Rains

#### Prairiland Students Participate In Problem Solving Competition

Thirty-four Prairiland students from grades 6-9 participated in the Texas Future Problem Solving Competition on Thursday, February 1 at the high school library.

During the past few weeks, these students had conducted research into this year's state-wide competition topic, poverty. Working in teams of four, they had investigated the most recent information concerning poverty in the United States and had examined that information to determine which trends would apply of projected to the future. At the timed two-hour competition on Thursday, the teams worked to solve a problem associated with poverty in the year 2010. They applied the following problem solving process: Step I: Brainstorming Possible Problems (20 required); Step II: Identifying an Underlying Problem; Step III: Brainstorming Alternative Solutions (20 required); Step IV: Choosing Criteria for Evaluatin Solutions (5 required); Step V: Evaluating Alternative Solutions (10 required); Step VI: Describing the Best Solution.

The teams compiled their ideas into a booklet which was sent to the Texas Future Problem Solving headquarters in Austin for evaluation.

The Future Problem Solving Program, which is part of Prairiland's gifted and talented curriculum, is

designed to provide students with the opportunity to explore the exciting topics from the vantage point of their impact on the future. Some of the topics in recent years have included space travel, birth defects, acid rain, immigration, the elderly, energy sources, children and the law, nutrition, employment and terrorism. A major strength of theprogram is the development of students' critical and analytical thinking skills as they use the information they have acquired to approach real-life problems that will confront American society and the world in the future.

The calf is raised by the winner for special showring competition in the Astrohall at the following year's show.


To date, the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo calf scramble has put 11,483 animals valued at more than \$2.4 million into the hands of Texas youth.


