## Groundbreaking For Aquatic Center

The City of Wheeler is holding a groundbreaking for the new aquatic center to be located just south of the existing swimming pool at 7th St. and Stanley St. This event will be held Tuesday, August 23 at 11:00 a.m. and is open to the public. The event will highlight the history of park projects in the City and discuss amenities that will be included in this project. The new aquatic center will include a pool with a zero depth entry, diving board, aqua play feature, restrooms and a concession building. The facility was funded in part through a Texas Parks and Wildlife Department grant, private donations, City funding, and in-kind services by Wheeler County. It is expected to be open Summer 2017.

## Parkview Hospital Board Meeting

Special Meeting  
July 20, 2016

A special called meeting of the Parkview Hospital Board was held on July 20, 2016.

MEMBERS PRESENT:

Tommy Puryear, Chairman; Pam Hibler, Vice-Chairman; Janie VanZandt, Secretary; Roy Laughlin, member.

OTHERS PRESENT:

Monica Kidd, CEO; Jace Henderson, CFO; Curley.

CALL TO ORDER AND PRAYER: Tommy Puryear, Chairman, called the meeting to order at 2 p.m. with a prayer.

SPEAKERS: The board heard presentations from two construction companies related to the remodel/addition project. First, representatives from Rogers-O'Brien Construction in Austin, TX, presented information about their company and their capabilities. Then Charlie Burger/CTB Associates (Albuquerque) and Phillip Waddell/Page & Associates (Amarillo) discussed their construction projects and abilities.

Lott Brothers Construction Company and Plains Builders were scheduled to be at the meeting but cancelled.

OPEN FORUM: Lynn Ramsey, Architect, from Shamrock has been hired to assist the board with the process of selecting a builder for the Parkview remodel/addition construction project. He reviewed with the board the steps in the process of selecting a Design Build firm as outlined by our attorney. Advertisements have been placed in the Amarillo and Wheeler papers (July 18 – August 1, 2016). The last date for questions will be August 1, 2016, and the response due date is August 10, 2016. Selection of up to five respondents will be done on August 23, 2016, with a September 8, 2016, deadline for the selected respondents to submit proposals. Then a finalist design builder will be selected on September 12, 2016.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING, JULY 11, 2016: The minutes of the July 11 meeting were reviewed. Pam Hibler made a motion to accept the minutes with one revision, Roy Laughlin seconded, vote was unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS – LOAN FOR PORTABLE X-RAY: Monica and Jace investigated leasing versus purchasing a new portable x-ray machine. There were no advantages to leasing and would actually cost more in the long run. The hospital is required to have digital x-ray equipment by 2017 and will be penalized financially if this is not attained. Pam Hibler made a motion to secure the USDA loan to purchase the portable x-ray machine (\$155,940.95) from GE along with a maintenance agreement (\$13,000/ (Continued Page 2)

**HARD LEARNIN'**

Last week, I told a little story about some construction jobs I worked on, and a couple of antics one of my working buddies did. Also, two or three years ago, how it is a good idea to be nice to your crane operator, if he's going to be furnishing you a ride up or down from where you're working. After all, he does have your life and well-being in his hands. In the

power plant where I worked, they would always try to do a lot of outdoors maintenance each summer. Since much of the steel structure was needing a paint job, they hired an outside contractor to do all that. One hot summer day, as they were painting on some steel next to the "lagoon," Donnie smarted off at Tim, the crane operator. Much to Donnie's surprise, Tim started swinging the cage around, stopping directly over the lagoon. Donnie thought Tim was just trying to tease him, so he smarted off again. That's when Tim started slowly lowering the cage toward the water. When Donnie was about neck-deep, Tim stopped and let him soak for a few seconds, then started lifting him up. On the way up, Donnie started letting him have it, so, Tim let him down in the water again for a minute or so. When he lifted him up this time, Donnie kept his mouth shut. After that, they went back to work, but Donnie understood who had the upper hand. Sometimes, that's good to know.
