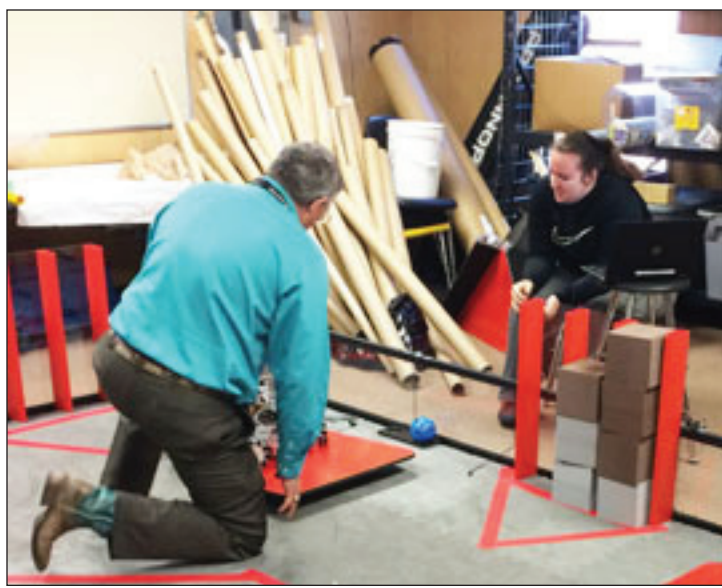

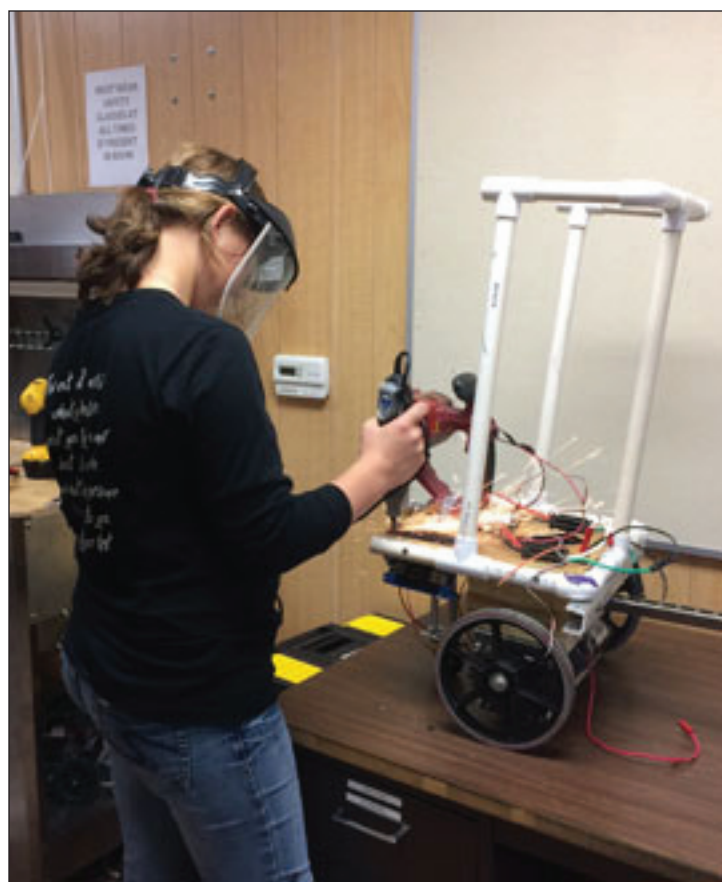

**Traffic Death Is Reported In County**

The Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) was called to a one-vehicle crash this morning on I-40 in Wheeler County, resulting in the death of two people.

At approximately 8:00 a.m., Andrew Derosia, of Jacksonville, Florida, was driving a 1999 Ford Explorer east on I-40, approximately five miles west of Shamrock. Derosia veered off the road and over-corrected the steering which caused him to lose control of the vehicle. The vehicle rolled over multiple times in the center median before coming to a rest on its' top. A passenger, identified as 29-year-old-Jeremy Lassere, of D'berville, Mississippi was ejected from the vehicle, resulting in his death.

Derosia and Lassere were pronounced dead on scene by Wheeler County Justice of the Peace, Rick Walden.

The other passenger, identified as 21-year-old-Paxton Key(female), of Long Beach, Mississippi, was airlifted to the hospital in Amarillo with life-threatening injuries.

Lassere was not wearing a seat belt. Derosia and Key were wearing seat belts.



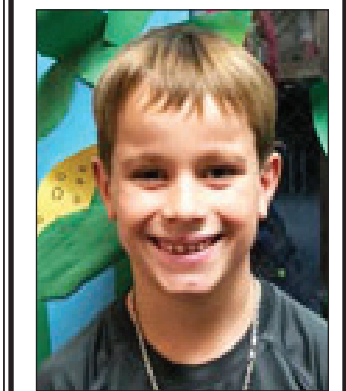
