## Filing Deadlines For Local Elections

On May 5, 2018, local voters will go to the polls to elect members to area school boards, Wheeler City Council and North Wheeler County Hospital Board. Filing deadlines for names to be placed on the ballots for these positions is now open.

**Parkview Hospital.**  
Two places on the Parkview Hospital Board are to be filled with the upcoming election. Positions are: Precinct 1 and Precinct 2. Roger Brown and Tommy Puryear presently hold these places on the board. Qualifications: A resident

of the voting precinct, owns property in the district subject to taxation and is more than 18 years of age at the time of the election.

Individuals wishing to file by mail may do so now.

**City of Wheeler**

The Mayor and two city council members are to be elected in the May 5 election. Bob McCain is presently serving as Mayor; he has filed for re-election. Place 2 is held by

Don Rose; he also has filed. Stacy McQueen has also filed for re-election to place 4 on the board.

Applications to file may be obtained at the City office, located at 505 Alan L. Bean Blvd. between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

**Wheeler I.S.D.**

Qualified persons (including current board members) interested in filing for candidacy may do so at the Wheeler ISD

Administration Office, located in Wheeler High School at #1 Mustang Drive. Dates for filing are from 1-17-2018 through 2-16-2018. Office hours are 8:00am-3:30pm Monday through Friday. The election is set for May 5, 2018.

Qualifications are: Must have been a resident of the State of Texas for one year AND have lived in the Wheeler ISD District for six months pri-

Mayor McCain called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. Don Rose made a motion to approve the November minutes as written. The motion was seconded by Carol Porton. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 0 against, 2 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Carol Porton motioned to approve the payment of monthly bills. Seconded by Don Rose. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 0 against, 2 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Maria Del Carmen Castanon, with Rosa Monsivais translating, approached the Council with a request to place a mobile home at 207 E. 3rd St. Ms. Castanon completed the application for variance and presented the Council with all of the necessary paperwork required in Mobile Home Ordinance 220. After thorough review of all documents presented, Don Rose motioned, seconded by Kendall Hefley to grant permission to Ms. Castanon to place her mobile home at 207 E. 3rd St. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 0 against, 2 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Ed Hennig was not in attendance. No action taken.

Charles Kuntz presented the financial statements along with a list of budget amendments for the current year. Carol Porton motioned to accept the budget amendments as presented. Kendall Hefley seconded the motion. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 0 against, 2 absent, and 0 abstaining.

Kristen Moudy gave the EDC and Chamber report.

Vinnie Ruiz gave the monthly maintenance report. The Council reviewed the annual Law Enforcement Contract. Don Rose made the motion to renew the contract beginning January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. The motion was seconded by Kendall Hefley. Motion carried with 3 in favor, 0 against, 2 absent, and 0 abstaining.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m. under the motion from Don Rose, seconded by Kendall Hefley. Motion carried.

### Graveside Rites For Marcia Rives

Marcia Joyce Rives, 92, of Shamrock died Friday, January 26, 2017. Graveside services were Monday, January 29, 2018 at 11:00 AM in Shamrock Cemetery; Doug Rives, officiated.

Marcia Joyce Cox Rives was born June 12, 1925, in Plano, Texas, to Dr. John M. and Helen Lea Short Cox. She passed away January 26, 2018, in Wheeler, Texas. Her family moved to Shamrock, Texas, in 1926, when Marcia was a year old. Marcia attended Shamrock Schools until she graduated from high school. She married E. M. "Curley" Rives in 1942. Shortly thereafter, Curley joined the Navy and trained for his ultimate service in the Marshall Islands during WWII. Marcia followed Curley during his training to North Carolina and finally to San Francisco where he deployed to serve with the Seabees. For a young woman, traveling from coast to coast was quite an experience. Marcia held various jobs in California during the four years that Curley was serving in the Navy. After the war, in 1945, Curley and Marcia moved to Albuquerque, New Mexico, and later to Shamrock, Texas, in 1950 residing in the Twitty community to run the family farm. Marcia attended West Texas State University and later worked for Ashland Chemical Company for twenty-eight years. She attended First Baptist Church in Shamrock all of these years and was the director of the Medium Adult Sunday School Class for twenty-five years. She loved her church and the Lord. Many cookies left her kitchen destined for activities at the church.

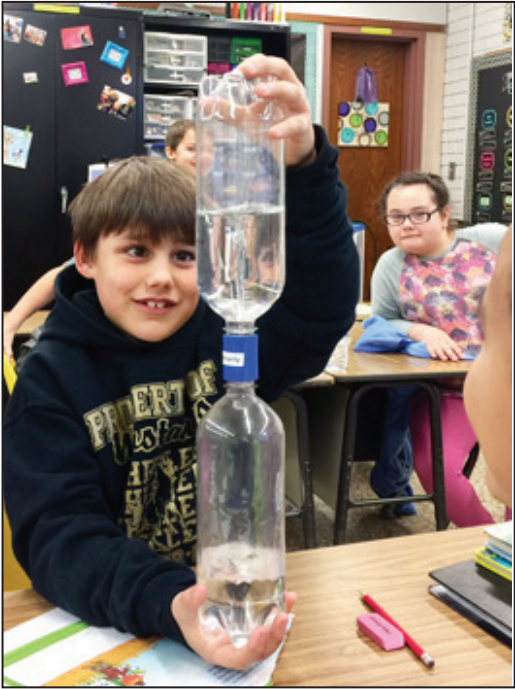

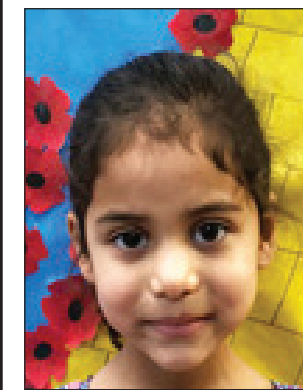

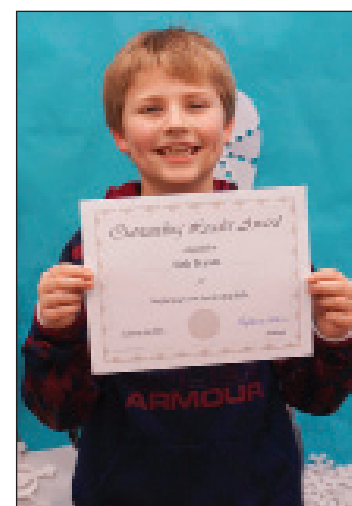

**CONTRACT w/W.C.S.O.**

THIS AGREEMENT this day made and entered into by and between the County of Wheeler, Texas, hereinafter referred to as PARTY OF THE FIRST PART, and the City of Wheeler, Texas, a municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as PARTY OF THE SECOND PART, and for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises as contained herein.

WITNESSETH, Party of the First Part will provide for the Party of the Second Part a 24-hour dispatch system and will provide 24-hour police protection for all residents of the City of Wheeler, Texas, and enforce the Code of Ordinances of the City of Wheeler, Texas. Party of the Second Part will pay to the Party of the First Part the sum of FOUR THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED ONE DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-ONE CENTS (\$4,401.71) per month for such services up to a maximum of FIFTY-TWO THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY DOLLARS AND FIFTY-TWO CENTS (\$52,820.52) annually.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS of this contract shall be binding on the parties hereto for a term of one year beginning JANUARY 1, 2018 and ending DECEMBER 31, 2018. This agreement may be terminated by either party providing the other with at least THIRTY (30) DAYS written notice. In such event, this contract may be renegotiated if desired.

In this age of ever-increasing levels of isolation perhaps the most significant factor for small communities is the benefits of collaborative efforts among members of unrelated groups to accomplish common goals. This is a more practical and effective method in small communities, because the membership of one singular group may not be sufficient to even attempt to accomplish a goal. As the saying goes, there is power in numbers.

This poignant, yet relevant quote by an anonymous author sums up success nicely: "Success is never an accident; it is always the result of accurate information, thoughtful plans, intelligent decisions and skillful execution. It represents the wise choice of many alternatives."

This concept is understood and embraced within sports, business and warfare – how things are done, matters. The question is, when will known and proven successful methods be applied to increasing the vitality of the small communities Americans live in?

(hereinafter "County"), acting by and through their duly authorized governing bodies desire to enter into an Interlocal Agreement;

WHEREAS, City is a duly-organized political subdivision of the State of Texas and is engaged in the administration of City government and related services for the benefit of the citizens of Shamrock; and

WHEREAS, County is a duly-organized political subdivision of the State of Texas and is engaged in the administration of County government and related services for the benefit of the citizens of Wheeler County, which includes City; and

WHEREAS, this Agreement is entered into pursuant to and under the authority of Chapter 791 of the Tex. Gov't Code, also known as the Interlocal Cooperation Act; and

WHEREAS, City and County believe that by working together they can best utilize resources to provide services for citizens of the City and County; and

WHEREAS, City and County wish to memorialize their mutual desire for City to provide 911 dispatch services for all citizens of Wheeler County, and

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of and conditioned upon the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, City and County do mutually agree as follows:

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS**  
The effective date of this Agreement shall be the 1st day of October, 2017.

2. This Agreement shall remain effective for a period of one (1) year from the effective date, except that it shall be automatically renewed for additional one year periods at the end of each annual time period, unless either party gives the other party at least 30 days notice in writing of the party's intent not to renew, or to terminate.

3. City shall furnish, at its own expense, all equipment, personnel, licensure, certification and services necessary to operate, staff and manage the 911 dispatch operations for City

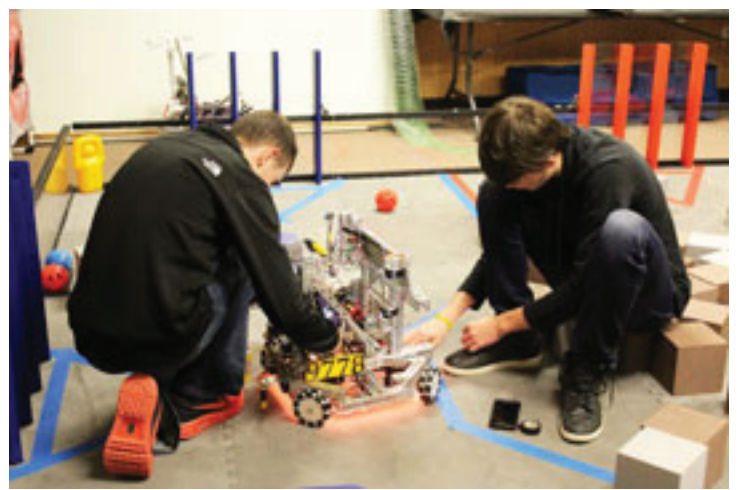
