Please come and support these students and at the same time, enjoy this humorous and touching story.



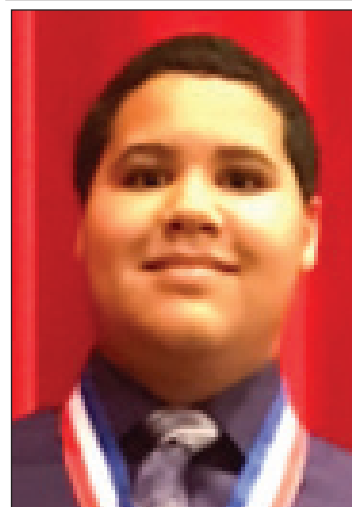

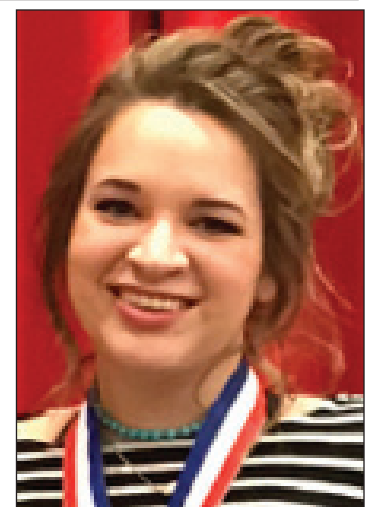

Community Care: Determined—Actual or Implied—Corruption Costs

On occasion, some form of malfeasance is discovered within a community and its leaders' decisions and actions

come under scrutiny. The most famous case in recent years occurred in Bell, California, in 2010. After all investigations were complete, seven Bell

officials were convicted on various charges of corruption and were given sentences that ranged from probation to 12 years in prison. The guilty

verdicts confirmed, the Bell officials sense of duty was to themselves, despite the vow they took to honorably serve their city and its residents best

interest.

Once many community corruption cases are discovered, they are found to share two

**BULL SELECTION,
FERTILITY AND
MANAGEMENT**

Spring is here and it is time to buy new bulls and manage the ones you have on hand. Select bulls based on production goals for the herd. Base decisions for selection on economically important traits. Also manage health and nutrition of bulls to ensure appropriate growth and maintenance. Producers should have the bull in good physical shape before the breeding season begins. Yearling bulls should weigh at least 1,000

pounds, be gaining weight and be in a body condition score of 6 before turning out with cows. Bulls that are purchased and are too fleshy or fat may need to lose some weight or be conditioned slowly before turning out for breeding. Two-year olds and older should also be in a body condition score of 6. On a cow to bull ratio, ranchers can use this as a rule of thumb for young bulls: number of cows=age of bulls in months. Older bulls can usually breed 25-35 cows, possibly more if pastures are small and breeding season is extended. After bulls pass the age of 6 years old, semen quality and libido begins to decrease and ranchers should think about purchasing new herd bulls. Plan ahead and have your bull fertility tested

and breeding soundness exam done this spring. Bulls should be tested to make certain they are capable of impregnating cows. Producers need to pay close attention to their herd sire. Remember, a cow that does not breed only loses the producer one calf, but an infertile bull could mean the loss of 20 to 30 calves, an economic disaster that few ranchers can afford. Producers should normally have their herd sires fertility tested by a veterinarian 45-60 days before breeding season begins, but it is never too late. The cost and time of the testing is relatively cheap compared to a whole calf crop. Many things can affect a bull's fertility; these include nutrition, bull maturity, overuse of the bull, the environmental conditions,

sexually transmitted diseases and many others. Observe for factors that may affect ability of bulls to impregnate cows. Some of these can be injury to legs, feet, eyes, hips, and reproductive problems. Watch the estrus cycles of your cows. If you notice a cow coming into heat more than once, it might

common traits – an inherent policy of secrecy and an intent to discourage and avoid civic engagement. These same traits can also contribute to ongoing allegations of wrongdoing, which can compromise the economic, social and moral integrity of communities where they are allowed in much the same way actual corruption does.

Officials who want to avoid any implications of corruption are implementing measures that make all community transactions readily available to the general public. Modern technology makes the process of being transparent simple

and inexpensive for all communities. Civic information published on community web sites, social media pages or other related online sources provides many benefits to communities of all sizes.

Transparency and the ongoing public oversight it enables, provides constant incentive for officials to put what is in the best interest of the community ahead of their own personal desires and helps diminish the temptation for wrongdoing by public officials. Accessible information about official proceedings also promotes civic engagement by making it possible for residents to be well-informed about and engaged in their community, which is an

integral factor of democracy. When civic transparency is not embraced by community leaders, residents will naturally attempt to piece together the facts of official proceedings. This gives rise to a wealth of speculation, which clouds and distorts the truth. In this way, the absence of transparency creates confusion and is a tool to ensure chaos.

Community leaders who create conditions that spawn such chaos and then fail to address the questions and implications of corruption it creates violate the trust placed in them and disregard the sanctity of the position they hold. Doing so not only dishonors their community and its members, but also compromises the integrity of all officials, because they all are perceived as culpable. In a democracy, officials have a responsibility to be honest and forthright to residents about their actions and decisions.

There are important lessons to be learned from the Bell County and other corruption cases. Community leaders who fail to provide accurate information about their actions made in official proceedings willfully create chaos and rebuke accountability.

Therefore, the question is: Are community officials who do not provide accurate information about official proceedings and then fail to promptly answer questions spawned by that lack of information guilty of violating the oath of office they swore to honor and uphold?
