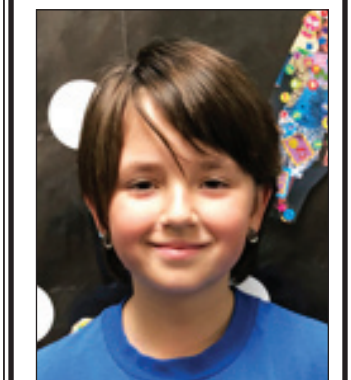

When that approach is adopted by new generations of community members, a legacy of stewardship has taken root and has become part of the culture of a town.

Townspeople, who constantly consider and try to better their community, made meaningful contributions to the betterment of it and help ensure their town perpetually thrives. They also demonstrate that level of care to others around them, including the community's youth.

Although the process of attempting to establish a culture of stewardship within a community is not an easy endeavor, it is one that is worth the effort because of all the benefits it offers. Not only to the community itself, but its members, as well. The question is: If you think your town could benefit from efforts to promote and establish a stewardship movement, why not talk to your friends, relatives and community leaders about starting one?

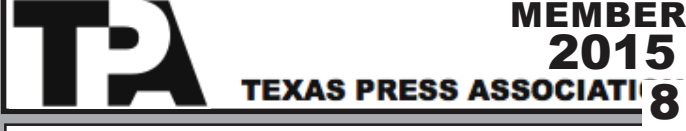

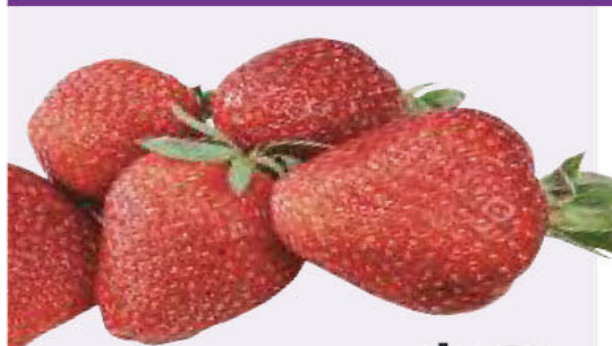
