Eleven members of the Kelton FFA Chapter participated in Wildlife, Entomology and Plant ID CDE's this spring. Kelton students obtained knowledge and life skills that will be used in their education endeavors and future career success.

Kelton FFA practiced in many contests in the area. Kelton members participated in the Collingsworth NRCS, Angelo

State Invitational, Tri-County, WTAMU, Clarendon College, Valley and Hackamore Ranch Judging Contests.

Lesly Alvarado, Colton Galvez, Dulce Pena and Hugo Rivera participated in the Wildlife CDE. The Wildlife CDE is a contest where students identify plants, animals, habitat management practices, safety, and game laws. The

Kelton Wildlife team place 7th at the Region 1 Wildlife Contest held at the Matador Wildlife Management Area south of Childress.

The Kelton FFA Entomology team members are LeighAnne Cook, Jacob Maxwell, Brett Hennig, and Aliyah Lopez. In the Entomology CDE, students apply the fundamentals of entomology and develop skills in identifying common insects and their significance to people and agriculture. Small towns have a reputation of being boring for many reasons, including a limited number of events and activities. Although that reputation may be accurate in many small communities, such is not an absolute. There are many outdoor endeavors that can be inexpensive and fairly easy to plan and hold, like cornhole or horseshoe tournaments. Through the power of social media, these type of activities can be organized in a matter of minutes. To have one, all that is required is an appropriate

Food festivals also can create interest and participation within a community. In some towns, social and civic groups use food festivals as primary forms of fund raising. Food festivals are especially fun if each participant offers unique or exotic foods that are not

normally available locally.

Community fairs, much like county fairs of days gone by, are being revived in many towns. Fairs give all members of the community an opportunity to present items they make, create or grow. These events are especially beneficial for small business owners or those who may be considering turning a hobby into a tangible business. The feedback received at fairs can help these individuals gain valuable feedback and gauge customer interest.

All of these examples can include participants of all ages and can get neighbors talking to each other. Given modern concerns about social isolation, such efforts can offer untold benefits. The question is: If your community could benefit from new events or activities, will you contact your mayor to request that the process be started?

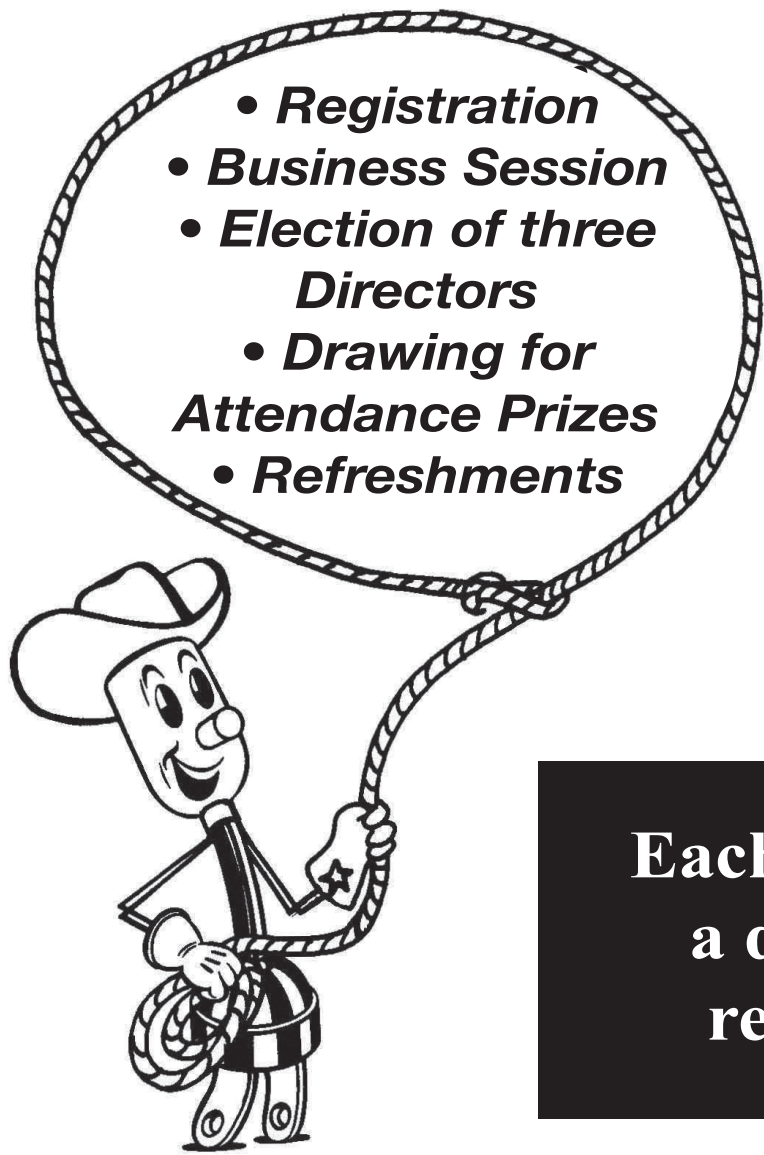

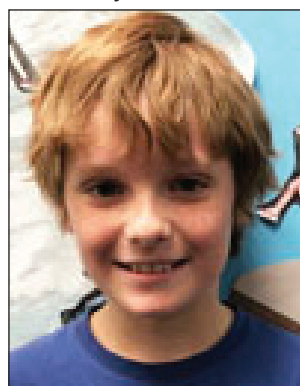

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in the Kelton Independent School District on Saturday, May 5, 2018, in obedience to an order duly entered by the Board of Trustees of Kelton Independent School District dated February 12, 2018, which order reads substantially as follows:

ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION TO BE HELD BY THE KELTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, MAKING PROVISION FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION, AND RESOLVING OTHER MATTERS INCIDENT AND RELATED TO SUCH ELECTION

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of Kelton Independent School District (the "District") finds and determines that it is necessary and advisable to call and hold an election (the "Election") for and within the District on the proposition hereinafter set forth;

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that said Election shall be held on a uniform election date established by Section 41.001(a), Texas Election Code (the "Code"), as required by Texas law;

WHEREAS, the Board has, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 45, Texas Education Code, the power to issue bonds for the construction, acquisition and equipment of school buildings (including the rehabilitation, renovation, expansion and improvement thereof), the purchase of the necessary sites for school buildings and the purchase of new school buses; and

WHEREAS, the Board, pursuant to the applicable provisions of the Code, has agreed to enter into a joint election agreement with Wheeler County, Texas (the "County") and the Wheeler County Clerk (the "County Clerk") for election services entered into in accordance with the provisions of Section 271.002, as amended, Code; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is necessary and convenient to call and conduct a school building bond election to obtain voter authorization of the issuance of school building bonds.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE KELTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT:

Section 1. Findings. The statements contained in the preamble of this Election Order are true and correct and are hereby adopted as findings of fact and as a part of the operative provisions hereof.

Section 2. Election Ordered: Date and Hours. The Election shall be held for and within the District on Saturday, May 5, 2018 (the "Election Day") which is a uniform election date under the Code, as amended, and is seventy-eight (78) or more days from the date of the adoption of this order, in accordance with the Code. All resident, qualified electors of the District shall be entitled to vote in the Election. The Board hereby finds that holding the Election on such date is in the public interest. The hours during which the polling places shall be open for voting on May 5, 2018 shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Section 3. Election Precinct, Voting Location and Voting Hours on Election Day. SECTION 2: The school election precincts hereby established for the purpose of holding the Election and the polling places hereby designated for holding the Election in the school election precincts are identified in Exhibit A to this Order (which is incorporated herein by reference for all purposes) or at such other location as hereafter may be designated by the Presiding Judge. On Election Day the polls shall be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Section 4. Voting Locations, Dates and Times. Early voting by personal appearance shall be held at the location, at the times and on the days set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein, or at such other locations as hereafter may be designated by the County Clerk. At least 78 days prior to the scheduled Election Day, the President of the Board of Trustees, the Superintendent of Schools, or the respective designees thereof will identify and formally approve the appointment of the Presiding Judge, Alternate Presiding Judges, Election Clerks, and all other election officials for the Election, together with any other necessary changes to election practices and procedures and can correct, modify, or change the Exhibits to this Order based upon the final locations and times agreed upon by the District to the extent permitted by applicable law.

A. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified voters of the County to act as clerks in order to properly conduct the Election. To the extent required by the Code, as amended, or other applicable law, the appointment of these clerks must include a person fluent in the Spanish language to serve as a clerk to render oral aid in the Spanish language to any voter desiring such aid at the polls on Election Day. If the Presiding Judge appointed actually serves, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall serve as one of the clerks. In the absence of the Presiding Judge, the Alternate Presiding Judge shall perform the duties of the Presiding Judge of the election precinct.

B. On Election Day, the polls shall be open as designated on Exhibit A.

C. The main early voting location is designated in Exhibit B to this Order (which is incorporated herein by reference for all purposes). The individual named as the Early Voting Clerk as designated in Exhibit B is hereby appointed as the Early Voting Clerk to conduct such early voting in the Election. The Early Voting Clerk shall appoint the Deputy

Early Voting Clerks. This office or place shall remain open to permit early voting each day, with the exception of official State holidays, as stated in Exhibit B. Early voting shall commence as provided on Exhibit B and continue through the date set forth on Exhibit B, all as provided by the provisions of the Code, as amended. Permanent branch and temporary branch offices for early voting by personal appearance shall be maintained at the locations and times designated on Exhibit B during the early voting period noted above.

D. An Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby established for the purpose of processing early voting results. The individual designated in Exhibit B as the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board is hereby appointed the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board. The Presiding Judge shall appoint not less than two (2) resident qualified voters of the District to serve as members of the Early Voting Ballot Board.

Section 5. Proposition. At the Election the following proposition (the "Proposition") shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the District in accordance with law:

KELTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSITION A

"SHALL THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES (THE "BOARD") OF THE KELTON INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT (THE "DISTRICT") BE AUTHORIZED TO ISSUE BONDS OF THE DISTRICT, IN ONE OR MORE SERIES OR INSTALLMENTS, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,500,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS FOR THE CONSTRUCTION, ACQUISITION, AND EQUIPMENT OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS IN THE DISTRICT (INCLUDING THE REHABILITATION, RENOVATION, AND IMPROVEMENT THEREOF), THE PURCHASE OF THE NECESSARY SITES FOR SCHOOL BUILDINGS, AND THE PURCHASE OF SCHOOL BUSES, WHICH BONDS SHALL MATURE, BEAR INTEREST AND BE ISSUED AND SOLD IN ACCORDANCE WITH LAW AT THE TIME OF ISSUANCE; AND SHALL THE BOARD BE AUTHORIZED TO LEVY AND PLEDGE, AND CAUSE TO BE ASSESSED AND COLLECTED, ANNUAL AD VALOREM TAXES ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY IN THE DISTRICT SUFFICIENT, WITHOUT LIMIT AS TO RATE OR AMOUNT, TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON THE BONDS AS THEY BECOME DUE, AND THE COSTS OF ANY CREDIT AGREEMENTS EXECUTED IN ANTICIPATION OF, RELATED TO, OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE BONDS, ALL AS AUTHORIZED BY THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, INCLUDING PARTICULARLY (BUT NOT BY WAY OF LIMITATION) SUBCHAPTER A OF CHAPTER 45, TEXAS EDUCATION CODE, AND CHAPTER 1371, TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE, TOGETHER WITH ALL AMENDMENTS AND ADDITIONS THERE-

Section 7. Mandatory Statement of Information.

If the issuance of bonds is authorized by voters, taxes sufficient to pay the annual principal of and interest on the bonds and the costs of any related credit agreements may be imposed. Such bonds may be issued to mature over a specified number of years not to exceed 40 years. Based upon market conditions as of the date of this Election Order, if the bonds are authorized and sold at an estimated interest rate of 2.75% per annum, the estimated total tax rate of the District is expected to be approximately \$.08 per \$100 of taxable assessed value, which represents the sum of (i) the most recently adopted tax rate for operations and maintenance, which is \$.9700 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation, plus (ii) the estimated tax rate for voted debt obligations of the District, including the bonds, which is expected to be approximately \$.08 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation. This estimated total tax rate is derived from projections obtained from the District's financial advisor and the Angelina County Appraisal District and is provided without any assurance that such projections will be realized. At the time that bonds are issued, the actual total tax rate will depend upon, among other factors, prevailing interest rates, the amount of each individual issuance, the assessed value of real property in the District and general market conditions.

As of the beginning of the District's current fiscal year, the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the District's general obligation debt obligations was \$0; the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the District's general obligation debt obligations was \$0; and the District's ad valorem debt service tax rate as of the date of adoption of this Election Order is \$0.00 per \$100 of taxable property. As of the date of adoption of this Election Order, the aggregate amount of outstanding principal of the District's general obligation debt obligations is \$0.00 and the aggregate amount of outstanding interest on the District's general obligation debt obligations is \$0.00.

The findings contained in this Section are only estimates provided for Texas statutory compliance and do not serve as a cap on any District ad valorem debt service tax rate. The statements contained in these findings (i) are based on information available to the District on the date of adoption of this Election Order, including projections obtained from the District's financial advisor, (ii) necessarily consist of estimates and projections that are subject to change based on facts, circumstances and conditions at the time that bonds approved pursuant to this Election Order are issued and (iii) are not intended to limit the authority of the Board to issue bonds in accordance with other terms contained in this Election Order. Accordingly, actual tax rates, interest rates, maturity dates, aggregate outstanding indebtedness and interest on such debt will vary and will be established after the bonds are issued. To the extent of any conflict between this subsection and other terms of this Election Order, such other terms control.

Section 8. Persons Qualified to Vote. All resident, qualified electors of the District shall be eligible to vote at the Election.

Section 9. Joint Election.

The District has agreed to participate in a joint election with the County also holding an election on Election Day and has contracted with the County Clerk for election services.

Section 10. Officers. The Board authorizes the President, Board of Trustees, the Superintendent of Schools, or the respective designee of either of such parties, to negotiate and enter into one or more joint election agreements and/or similar contracts or agreements if desired or if required to comply with applicable law, as permitted and in accordance with the provisions of the Code, as amended. In addition, the Board authorizes the President of the Board of Trustees, the Superintendent of Schools, or the respective designee of either of such parties to make such technical modifications to this Order that are necessary for compliance with applicable Texas or federal law or to carry out the intent of the Board, as evidenced herein.

Section 11. Conduct of Election. The Election shall be held in accordance with the Code, except as modified by the Texas Education Code, and the Federal Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, including particularly Chapter 272 of the Code pertaining to bilingual requirements.

Section 12. Notice of Election. Notice of the Election shall be given in English and Spanish by (i) publishing a substantial copy of this Election Order one time, not earlier than the thirtieth day nor later than the tenth day prior to the date set for the Election, in a newspaper published in the District; (ii) posting a copy of this Election Order on the bulletin board used for posting notices of Board of Regents meetings and in three public places within the boundaries of the District not later than the 21st day prior to the date set for the Election; (iii) posting a copy of this Election Order on Election Day and during early voting by personal appearance in a prominent location at each polling place; and (iv) posting this Election Order, together with the notice of Election and the contents of the Proposition, on the District's website during the 21 days before the Election.

Section 13. Notice of Meeting. The Board officially finds, determines, recites and declares that written notice of the date, hour, place and subject of the meeting at which this Election Order is adopted was posted on a bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public at the District's administrative offices for at least seventy-two (72) hours preceding the scheduled time of the meeting; that a telephonic or telegraphic notice of such meeting was given to all news media who have consented to pay any and all expenses incurred by the District in connection with providing such notice, both as required by the Open Meetings Law, Chapter 551, Texas Government Code, as amended; and that such meeting was open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Election Order and the subject matter thereof was discussed, considered and formally acted upon.

Section 14. Authority of Superintendent. The Superintendent of the District shall have the authority to take, or cause to be taken, all actions reasonable and necessary to insure that the Election is fairly held and returns properly counted and tabulated for canvass by the Board, which actions are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 15. Authorization to Execute. The President or Vice President of the Board are each authorized individually to execute and the Secretary of the Board is authorized to attest this Election Order on behalf of the Board; and the President and Vice President of the Board are each authorized individually to do all other things legal and necessary in connection with the holding and consummation of the Election.

Section 16. Severability. If any provision, section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Election Order, or the application of the same to any person or set of circumstances is for any reason held to be unconstitutional, void, invalid, or unenforceable, neither the remaining portions of this Election Order nor their application to other persons or sets of circumstances shall be affected thereby, it being the intent of the District in adopting this Election Order that no portion hereof or provision or regulation contained herein shall become inoperative or fail by reason of any unconstitutionality, voidness, invalidity or unenforceability of any other portion hereof, and all provisions of this Election Order are declared to be severable

for that purpose.

Section 17. Effective Date. This Election Order is effective immediately upon its passage and approval.

Sección 7. Declaración de información obligatoria.

Si los votantes aprueban la emisión de bonos, se pueden imponer impuestos suficientes para pagar el capital y el interés anuales de los bonos y los costos de cualquier convenio de crédito relacionado. Dichos bonos se pueden emitir para vencer durante una cantidad de años especificada que no exceda los 40 años. La Junta autoriza al Presidente, a la Junta de Síndicos, al Superintendente de Escuelas o a cualquiera de sus respectivos representantes designados, a negociar y celebrar uno o más convenios de elección conjunta y/o contratos o convenios similares si así lo desean o si es obligatorio para cumplir con la ley aplicable, según lo permitido por las disposiciones del Código y sus enmiendas, y en conformidad con ellas. Además, la Junta autoriza al Presidente de la Junta de Síndicos, al Superintendente de Escuelas o a cualquiera de sus respectivos

Sección 11. Celebración de la Elección. Sección 13. Aviso de asamblea. La Junta halla, determina, detalla y declara oficialmente que se colocó un aviso por escrito con la fecha, la hora, el lugar y el asunto de la asamblea en la cual esta Orden de Elección es adoptada, en una cartelera de anuncios ubicada en un lugar conveniente para el público en las oficinas administrativas del Distrito por al menos setenta y dos (72) horas antes a la hora programada de la asamblea; que se dio aviso telefónico o telegráfico de dicha asamblea a todos los medios de prensa que acordaron pagar cualquier y todo gasto incurrido por el Distrito en conexión con la entrega de dicho aviso, ambos como lo requiere la Ley de Asambleas Públicas, Capítulo 551 del Código de Gobierno de Texas y sus enmiendas, y que dicha asamblea estuvo abierta al público según lo requiere la ley en todo momento

Sección 14. Autoridad del Superintendente. Sección 16. Divisibilidad. Si cualquier disposición, sección, subsección, oración, cláusula o frase de esta Orden de Elección o la aplicación de las mismas a cualquier persona o conjunto de circunstancias es por alguna razón considerada inconstitucional, nula, inválida o inaplicable, ni las partes restantes de esta Orden de Elección ni su aplicación a otras personas o conjuntos de circunstancias se verán afectadas por ello, siendo la intención del Distrito al adoptar esta Orden de Elección que ninguna parte de la misma o disposición o norma contenida en la presente sea inoperativa o falle debido a cualquier inconstitucionalidad, nulidad, invalidez o imposibilidad de aplicación de cualquier otra parte de la misma, y todas las disposiciones de esta Orden de Elección se declaran divisibles a tales efectos.

Sección 17. Fecha de entrada en vigencia. Esta Orden de Elección entra en vigencia inmediatamente después de su aceptación y aprobación.

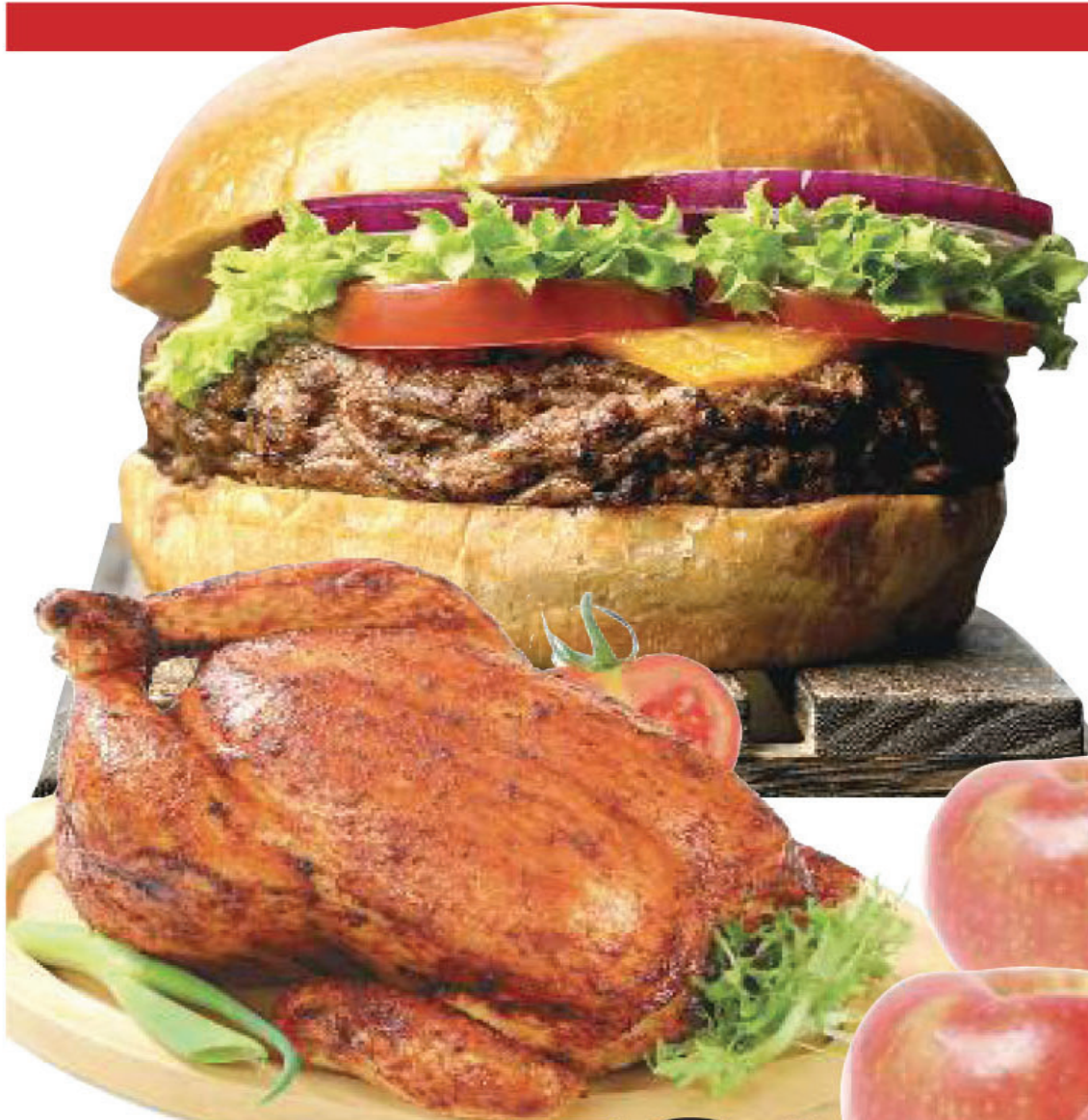
