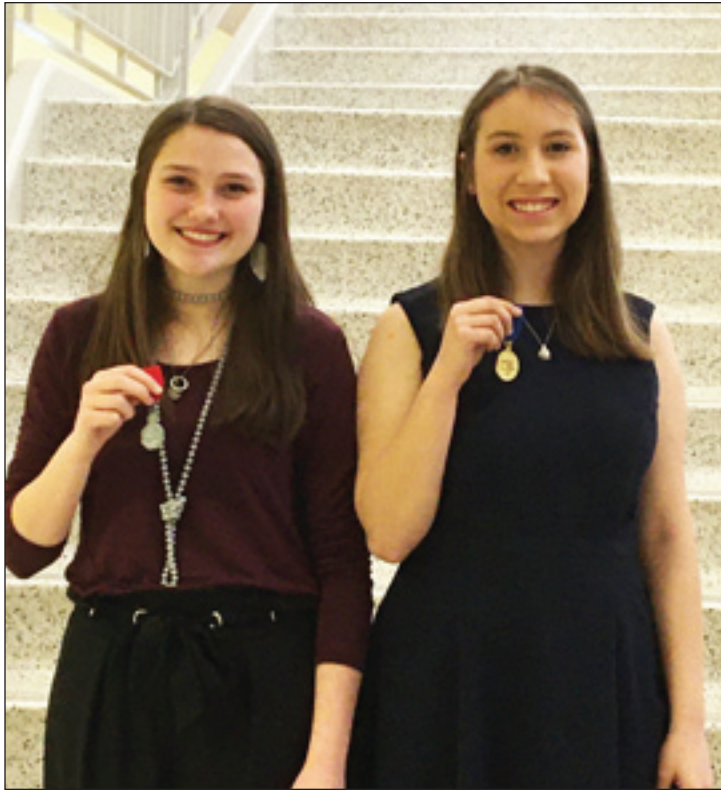

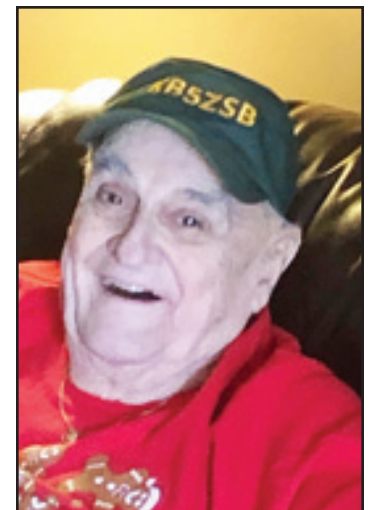
Graveside Rites Feb. 22 for Helton

Visitation was held at Robertson Funeral Directors in Wheeler on Friday, February 21, 2020, from 9AM-6PM.

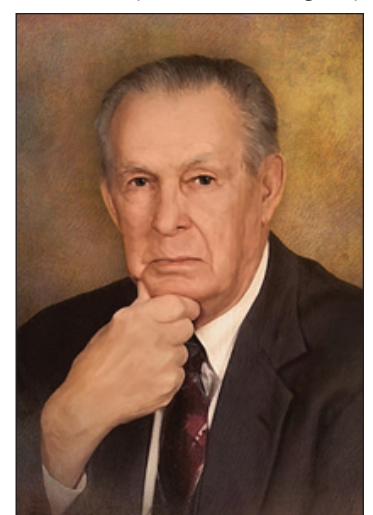

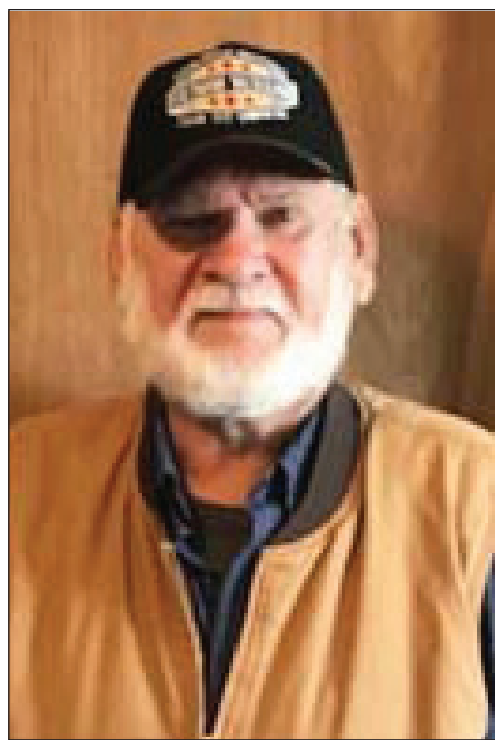
