Merely Mustard

Have you ever experienced déjà vu, the sensation that you have seen, heard, or experienced something before, while you are seeing, hearing, or experiencing it? Or have you ever had the sensation you have experienced déjà vu before? That is, have you ever felt déjà vu about having déjà vu? That could be an endless, circular line of questioning, so I shall leave it at that and return to the concept of a singular episode of déjà vu.

The experience of déjà vu is essentially an illusion. If

whatever it is has happened before, then it is fact and history, though perhaps poorly remembered, whereas if it hasn't happened before, but it seems that it has, then it is déjà vu, which seems to be a French way of saying 'the mind tricking the mind.' It is the mind's imagining something as being so familiar that it is almost real. But the phenomenon of déjà vu relies entirely on the presupposition that what we are sensing or experiencing is real in the first place, and happening in real-time. That is, to borrow a line

from the poet, the concept of déjà vu is reliant upon the claim that, "You know that this moment in time is for real."

But have you ever wondered about the accuracy of that claim? Have you ever wondered if what you are seeing, sensing, or experiencing is in fact real? Have you not ever wondered if everything that you see and believe to be real were just the construct of your own imagination? Sure, it seems real to you, but what if it were only that way in your head? Is it possible that that (Continued Page 3)

is true? Evidence seems to indicate otherwise – the existence of others, who appear to have their own experiences, seems to point toward the conclusion that not everything is the product of one's imagination – after all, if one was imagining the whole world as their own creation for themselves, why would it include people who didn't agree with or who opposed the imaginer, or why would it include inconveniences like hunger and thirst, or mosquitos, or grassburrs?
