

Merely (from Page 1) consumption of these things often does not convey the benefits I am hoping for. In fact, it often works against me and is counterproductive, filling my space, or worse, my mind, with things that aren't pertinent to what I am needing to do. And if I don't have the capacity to deal with them immediately, they make their way into a receptacle (tangible or metaphorical), for me to look in to or deal with later. The problem with that is they have at that point already nestled their way into my head somewhere, and it is often below the level of my awareness. There they remain, contributing to clutter and consuming both space and, perhaps the scarcest resource, a portion of my attention, which I did not intend to devote to them at that point in time. Thereby they stifle my freedom. The irony of this is that these accumulations often have this adverse effect without my noticing it, and, sometimes they even call me back to search for more— as though the space in my subconscious were too desolate, and its occupants wanted some company — as though Pavlov himself were calling the shots.

I am losing the path here. What I thought I might say when I began is that I have found the best thing I can do to help my situation is to practice elimination. I have at times been somewhat reluctant to do this, especially with respect to things that I think might be helpful to me sometime, but the times when I am able to work on eliminating things rather than adding things, I realize that the resulting benefits tend to far exceed any of those benefits I had anticipated the accumulations would deliver. It is a bit counterintuitive. It seems to fit well with the many paradoxes of life.

Panhandle Groundwater Dist. Celebrates 65 Years

WHITE DEER, TX. (Feb. 8, 2021) – In 1955, a group of conscientious farmers and ranchers realized the need to protect the underground water supply that is so necessary to this area. In August of that year, more than fifty landowners, in and around Panhandle, Texas, submitted a petition to the State Board of Water Engineers in Austin, stating their desire to form an underground water conservation district south of the Canadian River in the Panhandle of Texas. The State Board of Engineers conducted a public hearing in the city of Panhandle, on October 5, 1955. As a result of that hearing, an

election was called for January 21, 1956. The election results showed 360 votes for creating the district, and 74 votes against it. Thus, due to the concerns of these landowners, Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District #3 came into being. (In May 1999, the 55th Texas Legislature, through H.B. No. 2199, officially changed the District's name from Panhandle Ground Water Conservation District No. 3 South of the Canadian River, in Texas, to Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District).

The first directors of the district, also chosen at that election, were A. L. Stovall, President; Raymond Durrett, Vice-President; C. Russell McConnell, Secretary; and John Harnly, Director.

The first meetings of the newly created district were held in the County Commissioner's room in the Carson County Courthouse, in Panhandle. In February 1956, A. J. Weiser was hired as part-time manager and the meeting place was moved to the First National Bank building, in Panhandle.

Today, the District has grown to consist of Carson, Gray, Donley, Roberts, Wheeler counties, along

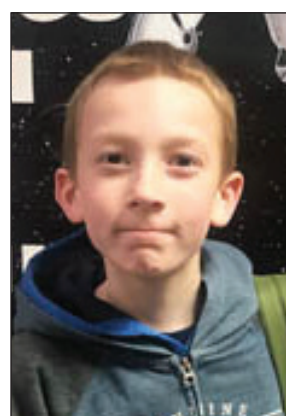

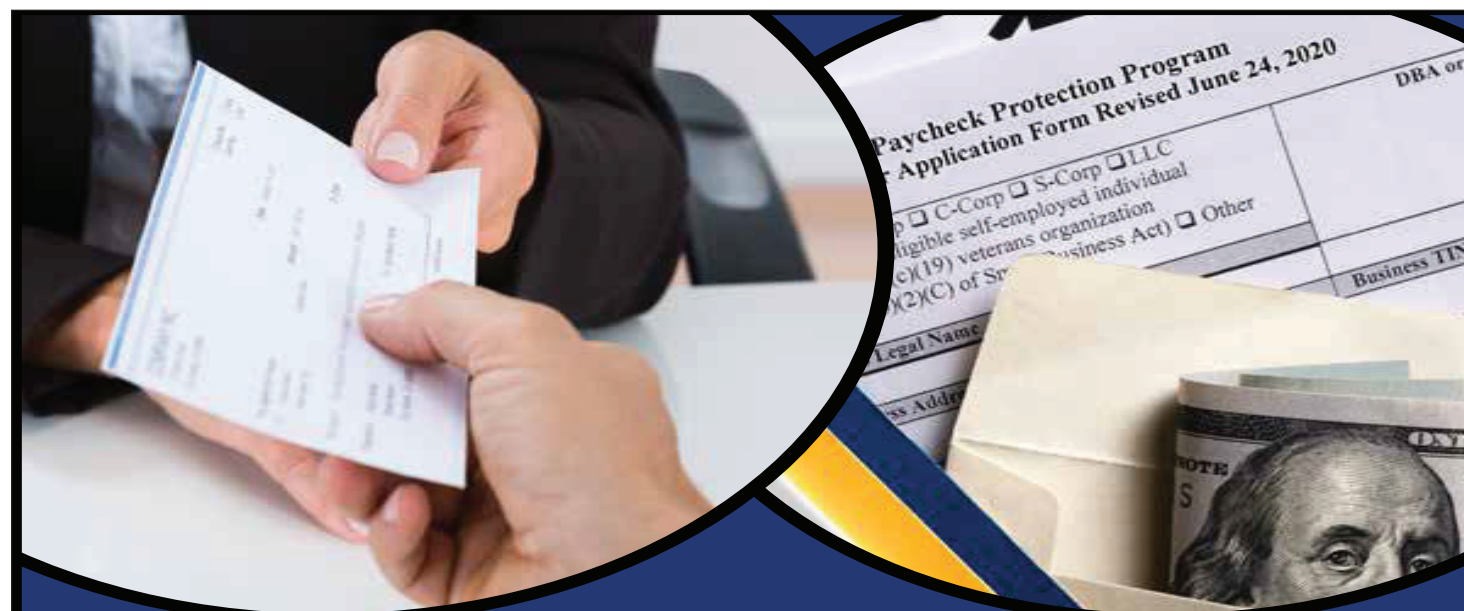

Burn Ban

Order Prohibiting or Restricting Outdoor Burning

WHEREAS, the Commissioners' Court finds that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County that all outdoor burning is prohibited in the unincorporated area of the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of this Order, unless the restric-

tions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by the Texas Forest Service or this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code Sec. 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for:

- (1) Firefighter Training;
- (2) Planting or harvesting of agricultural crops;
- (3) Burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Sec. 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Sec. 153.047, Natural Resources Code;
- (4) Public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations;

Welding is allowed by commercial/professional welders under the following guidelines only:

- (a) A spotter is required for each welder, each cutter, each grinder or for any activity that causes or may cause a spark.
- (b) A diameter across the welding area shall be a

minimum of 25 feet and clear of vegetation, if possible, and kept wet. The welding diameter must be three times the height of the actual welding. Example: if welding is occurring ten (10) feet off the ground, a diameter of thirty (30) feet must be protected.

(c) A minimum of 200 gallons of pressured water must be available on site.

(d) Each welding vehicle must have at least one (1) fully charged 10 lb. Class ABC chemical fire extinguisher on site.

(e) If the work area cannot be cleared of vegetation, proper precautionary measures must be taken (example: protecting brush, etc., by utilizing fire resistant tarps).

(f) Each site will have cellular telephone communications for emergency response.

(g) Welding in an enclosed area is acceptable.

In accordance with Local Government Code Sec. 352.081(h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.

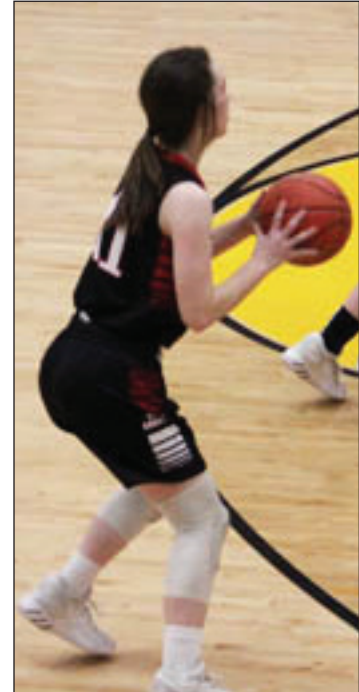

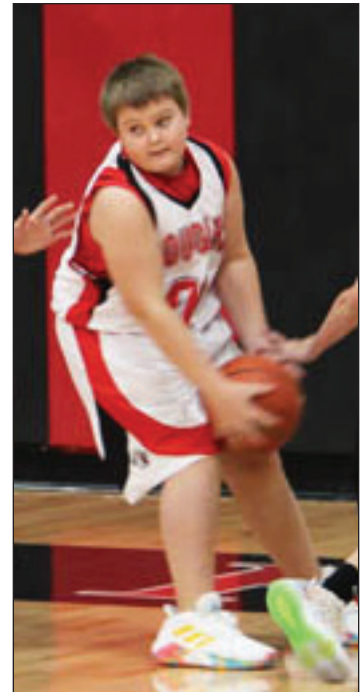
