Fort Elliott's Gatlin Goad Won The UIL Class 1A State Individual Championship

Fort Elliott's Gatlin Goad as well as the Canyon and Panhandle teams highlighted a soggy University Interscholastic League boys state golf tournament Monday and Tuesday around the Austin-area.

Goad turned in the top performance over the two-day, 36-hole tournament. Despite sitting through hours of rain

delays at the Lighthouse Country Club in Kingsland the senior captured his first ever UIL Class 1A state individual championship firing a 72-75—147.

“This means so much to me,” Goad said. “My family came down and supported me like they have since I was little. This is something I've been working toward my en-

tire life, and it was special to reach this goal.”

Goad shot a 1-over par 72 during Monday's first round. On Tuesday, he reached the ninth hole before an hour rain delay, and by the time he reached the 14th hole the horn sounded again for an even longer stoppage.

I sometimes wish there were some master plan, some course that had been charted out to follow, where all one needed to do to make progress was to stay on the path, checking off the boxes at the way stations, or connecting the dots like a dot-to-dot picture book. This concept came first to mind concerning this column, for which there is no master plan, nor a cohe-

sive theme or string of ideas. But as I was thinking about it, it also seems applicable for life in general — the desire for a clear objective or destination.

Generally we have indications about which way we ought to be heading, but often the detailed path is obscured, like a trail through a forest that has to be discovered little by little. Occasionally

the lack of a clear path is a psychological load, and it can give the impression that the path will never be discovered, or that you will never reach where it is you want to be. This is a particularly tempting thought when it appears that others have found a path to walk and are walking it, even while everything seems as yet camouflaged. Sometimes in bouts of frustration such as

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about June 21st, 2021 the City of Wheeler will submit a request to the Texas Department of Agriculture for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Section 104(f) of Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 as amended, to undertake a project known as City of Wheeler, Water System Improvement Project #7220501: The City of Wheeler shall replace the elevated water storage tank and water lines to comply with Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) regulations. Contractor shall construct a new one hundred thousand gallon (100,000 gal.) elevated storage tank including project site acquisition, seven hundred fifty linear feet (750 l.f.) of eight inch (8") water line, electrical controls, pavement repair, and all associated appurtenances, to include Administrative and Engineering services and fees.

Construction of the water tank shall take place at the southwest corner of Kiowa Street and Seventh Street. Construction of the water line shall take place at the alleyway between Comanche Street and Kiowa Street, from Sixth Street to the alleyway north of Fairlane Drive.

Estimated Cost: \$275,000 (Grant Funds) and \$857,382 (City Matching Funds – City of Wheeler's General Fund) for a total project cost of \$1,132,382.

A public meeting is not a contested case hearing.

OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEARING. Following the close of all applicable comment and request periods, the executive director will forward the application and any requests for reconsideration or for a contested case hearing to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The Commission may only grant a request for a contested case hearing on issues the requestor submitted in their timely comments that were not subsequently withdrawn. **If a hearing is granted, the subject of a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of fact or mixed questions of fact and law relating to relevant and material water quality concerns submitted during the comment period. TCEQ may act on an application to renew a permit for discharge of wastewater without providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing if certain criteria are met.**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR ACTION. The executive director may issue final approval of the application unless a timely contested case hearing request or a timely request for reconsideration is filed. If a timely hearing request or request for reconsideration is filed, the executive director will not issue final approval of the permit and will forward the application and requests to the TCEQ Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting.

MAILING LIST. If you submit public comments, a request for a contested case hearing or a reconsideration of the executive director's decision, you will be added to the mailing list for this specific application to receive future public notices mailed by the Office of the Chief Clerk.
