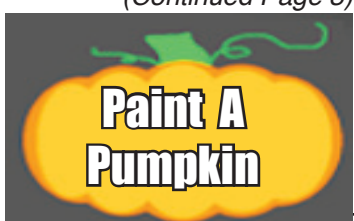

Kelli made the motion to approve July regular session minutes, as amended, to state that Tracy Tignor was absent. The motion was seconded by Kendall. The motion carried with all five in favor, 0 against, 0 absent and 0 abstaining.

I am periodically struck by the rediscovery that many of my problems are of my own making, and often the cause of these problems is simply not taking care of business – not doing what needs to be done when it needs to be done. This is the human condition and a temptation

for everyone. To phrase it an ironic way, it could be said that human nature works to prevent you from working as you need to.

I have begun to discover that the sense of being overwhelmed with things to do is accurate, but it is more of an indication of a problem that

has been compounded by a sequence of small failures, often small enough to be able to be overlooked, but which in aggregate amount to a large sensation of frustration. I am talking about small failures such as not putting things where they go, or not putting them up when I am finished

tum of success. I believe this momentum is the more important victory, because it is not possible to string together sequences of small victories without having the psychological benefits redound to the victor also. This psychological boost sets one up for further successes, gives confidence and boosts motivation, all of which enhance the possibility of routinizing the practice of winning the small victories of doing what needs to be done, however small, when it needs to be done.

Doing this can take a considerable time, and often there are other things that one might want to do with their time. But the principle of "pay me now, or pay me later" applies - one cannot exempt themselves from things that
