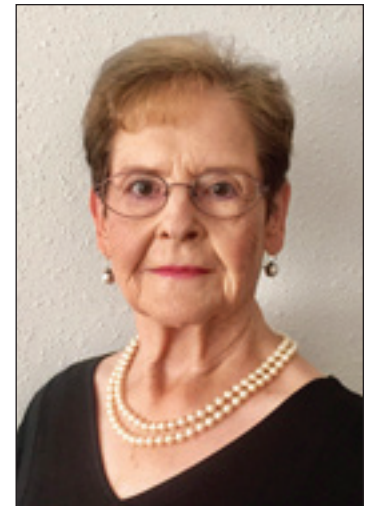

Historical Marker Dedication Day Sun., October 24, North of Wheeler

The “Custer on the Sweetwater” Historical Marker, three miles north of Wheeler on Highway 83, will be unveiled on Sunday, October 24, 2021 following a program, at 2:00 P.M.

To attend the dedication, follow the yellow and blue ribbons east on County Road 1 and onto the ranch road.

“Custer on the Sweetwater” is the story of the rescue of two white women from the Cheyenne Indians by the 7th Cavalry, lead by General

Custer.

The story of the rescue will be presented by Historian Rhonda Meriwether, who has researched the event for the past ten years. The unveiling was originally scheduled for 2020, but was rescheduled.

Historical Re-enactor Groups, Frontier Regiment of the High Plains, 7th Cavalry “Troop J” Living Historians and First Texas Light Artillery, Battery A, will be present.

Constitutional Amendments

Proposition 6 (SJR 19)

What it says: "The constitutional amendment establishing a right for residents of certain facilities to designate an essential caregiver for in person visitation."

What it means: The amendment would allow residents of nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, or state-supported living centers to designate an essential caregiver that may not be prohibited from visiting the resident, even during a pandemic.

Proposition 7 (HJR 125)

What it says: "The constitutional amendment to allow the

surviving spouse of a person who is disabled to receive a limitation on the school district ad valorem taxes on the spouse's residence homestead if the spouse is 55 years of age or older at the time of the person's death."

What it means: Currently, disabled individuals may apply for a \$10,000 homestead tax exemption and a limit on school district property taxes, proposition 7 would amend the Texas Constitution to allow the legislature to extend a homestead tax limit for surviving spouses of disabled individuals as long as the spouse is over 55 years old and resides at the home.

Rep. Jake Ellzey (R) had this to say about the amendment, "The surviving spouse of a disabled homeowner

should not be saddled with an unexpected large increase in their tax bill. That only magnifies the tragedy of the loss of their spouse and if they are on a fixed income it even further compounds their difficulties. If a couple has a disability exemption for their homestead, when the disabled person passes away, the surviving spouse loses the exemption. HJR125 protects the surviving spouse from the loss of an important benefit."

Proposition 7 (HJR 125)

Proposition 8 (SJR 35)

What it says: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United States who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty."

What it means: Similar to proposition 7, this measure would amend the Texas Constitution to authorize a total residence homestead property tax exemption for a surviving spouse of a member of the armed services "who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty."

Currently, the constitution grants the exemption to the surviving spouse of a mem-

Merely (from Page 1) making plans and decisions, generally.

Why is this so? I am not sure, other than perhaps mental fatigue. I suspect there is biochemistry that I am not aware of, working behind the scenes in the form of some interplay of hormones, neurotransmitters, and circadian rhythms. But in any case, often the best thing to do is to postpone the use of mental faculties until the following day.

Some of my poorer decisions have been made at night, and for whom is that statement not true? Willpower is lower at night and it is easier to go off the rails in terms of conforming with any kind of stated intention such as diet, exercise, or any other form of discipline. Night is better suited for dining, relaxing, and visiting, and all of those are better off done earlier than later. Otherwise, you might find yourself in the ironic position where you are too tired to go to bed.

There is a book that was published in recent years that pertains to the opportune times to do various things. The book is aptly titled *When*, and subtitled (Have you noticed how so many books seem to have subtitles, and how there seems to be an unofficial competition as to who can write the longest subtitle for their book?) *The Scientific Secrets of Perfect Timing*. I've not read it but I have heard the author talk briefly about it, although I'm not sure I was listening to his comments at the right time of day.

Whatever the case, I am in agreement with the concept

of the armed services "who is killed in action." The amended version would also include service members who were fatally injured during military training or other military duties.

Prescription Drug Take Back Day

When used properly, prescription drugs can do wonders. They can make post-operative recovery an easier, less painful process, help manage mental and physical health conditions, and ease the burden for those who suffer from such conditions. When these medications are no longer needed, it is important to dispose of them safely.

On Oct. 25th the DEA is hosting Prescription Drug Take Back Day. This day helps people get rid of unused medications. It removes unnecessary access to prescription drugs, which helps prevent drug abuse and overdoses. The program was started in 2010 and has taken back more than 14 million pounds of unused or expired prescription medication.

Wheeler County Residents may drive through the Parkview Hospital ER Ambulance Bay and drop off any prescription medication for disposal.

If you're unable to make it to a disposal site this October, here are three steps you can take to manage unused medication:

- Monitor. Note how many prescription medications you have and how many pills are in each.
- Store. Keep medications in a secure place, like

a safe or locked cabinet that only you have access to. The same way you might protect valuables like jewelry or cash, you should do your best to protect prescription medications.

• Dispose. Your community may offer local drug take-back programs, or you may be eligible for mail back programs to dispose of prescription medications. You can also use the DEA's controlled substance public disposal locator to find year-round disposal options in your area.

Preventing drug abuse is a daunting task, but everyone can take an active role by getting rid of unused prescription medication. This October, do your part and clean out your medicine cabinet!

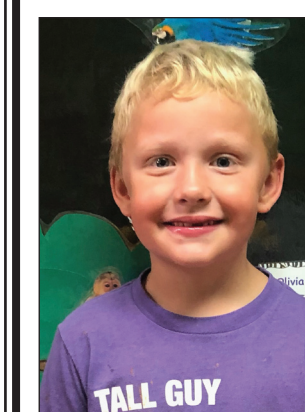

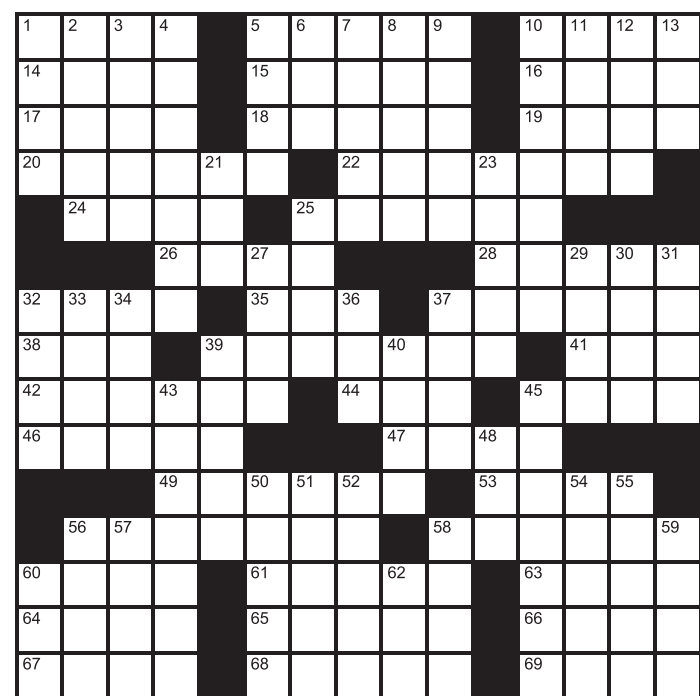

THE WAY IT WAS BACK THEN

In George Washington's days, there were no cameras. One's image was either sculpted or painted. Some paintings of George Washington showed him standing behind a desk with one arm behind his back while others showed both legs and both arms. Prices charged by painters were not based on how many people were to be painted, but by how many limbs were to be painted. Arms and legs are 'limbs,' therefore painting them would cost the buyer more. Hence the expression, 'Okay, but it'll cost you an arm and a leg.' (Artists know hands and arms are more difficult to paint)

As incredible as it sounds, men and women took baths only twice a year (May and October) Women kept their hair covered, while men shaved their heads (because of lice and bugs) and wore wigs. Wealthy men could afford good wigs made from wool. They couldn't wash the wigs, so to clean them they would carve out a loaf of bread, put the wig in the shell, and bake it for 30 minutes. The heat would make the wig big and fluffy, hence the term 'big wig.' Today we often use the term 'here comes the Big Wig' because someone appears to be or is powerful and wealthy.

Ladies wore corsets, which would lace up in the front. A proper and dignified woman, as in 'straight-laced'. . Wore a tightly tied lace.

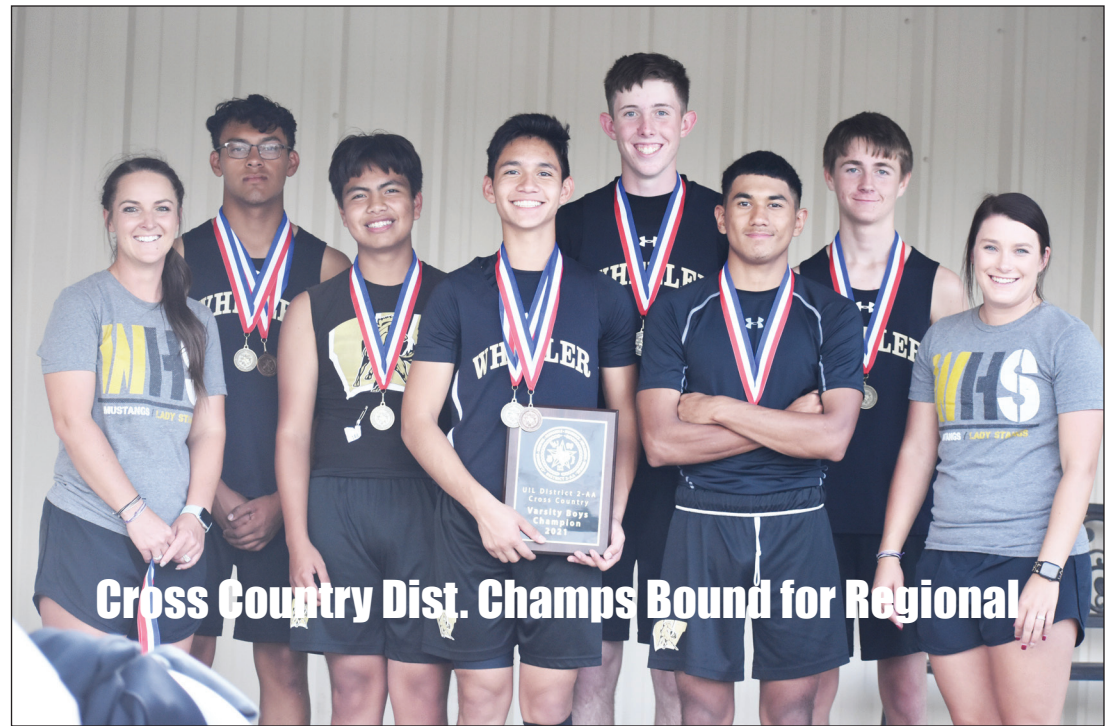

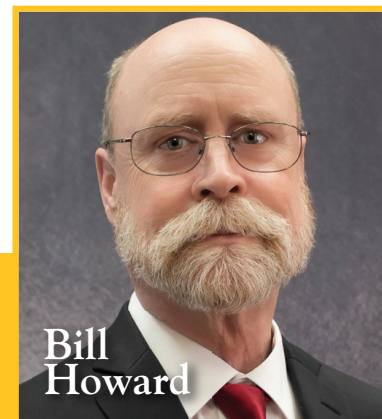
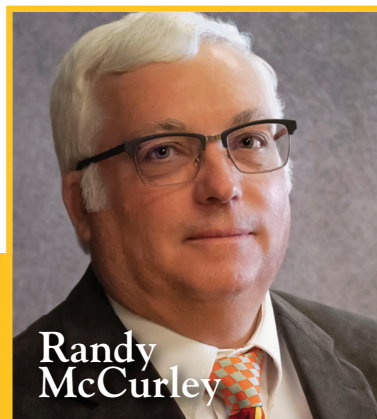
