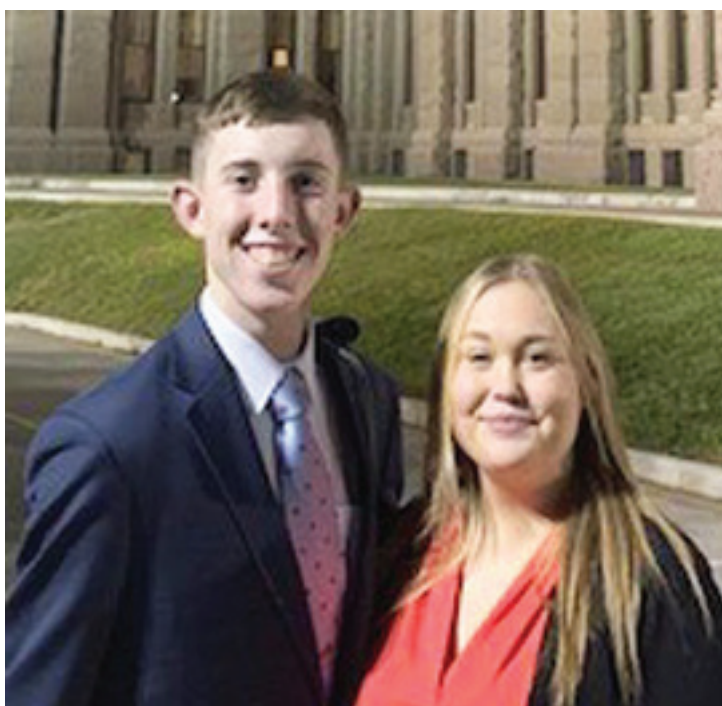
## STORM REPORT

## Louise Hogan Rites Are Read Jan. 24

Louise A. Hogan, 95, of Mobeetie, passed away on January 20, 2022 in Wheeler.

Services were at 2:00 PM on Monday, January 24, 2022 at the Mobeetie Museum Visitor's Center in Mobeetie with Rev. Tom Stribling, officiating. Burial followed at Old Mobeetie Cemetery under the direction of Carmichael-Whately Funeral Directors and Crematory.

Louise was born on April 1, 1926 in Mobeetie to William Almond and Estelle Evans Almond. After the passing of her father, she was raised by her grandparents, Dr. and Granny Redding and her Aunt Sissy until she was five years old. Louise's mother later married, Ruphert Orr, the only father Louise knew. She was known as "Dead Eye Annie" in her younger years for shooting the family rooster with a homemade bow and arrow. Louise graduated from Pampa High School in 1944. She married Robert "Chuck" Hogan Sr. on June 3, 1945 in Pampa. He preceded her in death on October 31, 2006. Louise was a longtime member of the First Baptist Church in Mobeetie, where she taught Sunday school and volunteered as the church treasurer. She later became a member of the First Baptist Church in Wheeler. Louise enjoyed volunteering with the Old Mobeetie Texas Association as the treasurer and on the board of directors. She was an amazing cook that made every holiday and birthday special with her delicious meals. Louise enjoyed painting and needle point when she wasn't too busy being ornery. She was a kind and godly woman that will be truly missed by all who loved her.

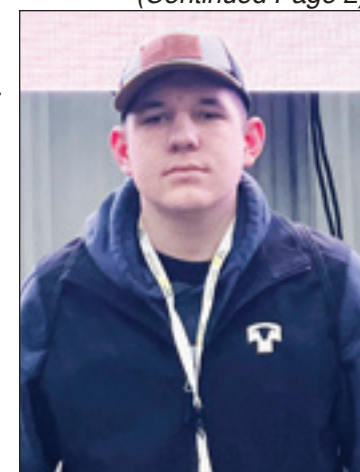
At 6:10 Kelli Hampton arrived.

# Merely Mustard

Last week I wrote a somewhat lengthy and possibly confusing piece concerning a quote I had read, that had come from a novel written by Kurt Vonnegut. The quote was, "Well, here we are, Mr. Pilgrim, trapped in the amber of this moment. There is no why." Over the course of a few paragraphs I made an objection to the philosophy which would claim that there is no 'why'. I had no intention of the piece taking the

direction it did; but it detoured abruptly early in the first paragraph, and at that juncture my choices were to try to wrestle it to the ground, an endeavor which experience has taught me usually ends poorly, or to follow where it was leading. I chose the latter, because it required less effort, and I figured it would come out clearer than the product of a wrestling match would. Also, I try to be open to the following of where things lead, if the path

is not rigidly established.

The concept of following where things lead acknowledges by implication a sort of omniscience that exists and courses throughout the universe. And the presence of such an omniscience completely invalidates the belief that there is no 'why'. How could something or someone who knows everything be unable to explain the 'why' for anything? To avoid appearing out of touch with the lot of

humanity I will acknowledge that I have been tempted to believe that there is no 'why', and that is about as bleak a belief as can be held. Here now I propose a caveat that serves as some means of explanation, a 'why', if you will, as to why Mr. Vonnegut might have believed there were no 'whys'. Vonnegut served in the European Theater during World War II, and if there were ever an environment

**Merely** (from Page 1) which would cause one to despair of any sense of 'why', I would imagine it would be war, where all concepts of humanity's goodness, along with the ideals of justice and

righteousness, would appear to be on the chopping block; where peasants slaughter other peasants in service of a far-off king, without ever knowing the reason, and often, without there being any justifiable reason. So it is; so

it has always been. In light of this I extend a great deal of slack, much more than I would deserve to receive, to Vonnegut for espousing (in reality or just in prose) the belief in the absence of 'whys'. He probably had more reason to hold such a belief than do I. Put in a more deliberately ironic way, his 'why' for believing there is no such thing as 'why' was nearer to being reasonable, than mine would be; he had a greater 'why' than I, for the lie that there is no 'why'.

Therefore, I conclude with a compromise, a sort of amendment to the work of a more talented writer than I, and one who had a greater 'why' to believe there is no 'why', than I. The ink is dried on the original quote and it should be allowed to rest in peace, like its author. But in application, in the effort to make sense of life and navigate its vicissitudes, and to reckon with the mysteries of human life and its thread in the tapestry that is our planet, which also is woven into the broader tapestry of the universe as we presently (in a limited way) know it, I would suggest employing as a guiding light a more useful (and probably more accurate) phrase, one that is peppered with a small dose of humility – as small as could be reasonably dispensed by one who is sufficiently lacking in humility to bother making a quote, much less modifying someone else's. I acknowledge that it does not flow as well or hit as hard as the original. I attribute that to the disparity of talent between the original author and this one. That is the 'why', though I can't explain it any more than he evidently would have been able to. Or, put another way, "Well, here we are...trapped in the amber of this moment. There is no why which lies within the grasp of my understanding."

But, here it is...my friends are retired and getting grey... they move slower and I see an older person in myself now. Some are in better and some worse shape than me... but, I see the great change... Not like the ones that I remember who were young and vibrant...but, like me, their age is beginning to show and we are now those older folks who we used to see and never thought we'd be.

Each day now, I find that just getting a shower is a real target for the day! And taking a nap is not a treat anymore... it's mandatory! 'Cause if I don't on my own free will... I just fall asleep where I sit!

And so... now I enter this new season of my life unprepared for all the aches and pains and the loss of strength and ability to go and do things that I wish I had done but never did!! But, at least I know, that though the winter has come, and I'm not sure how long it will last... this I know, that when it's over on this earth... it's over. A new adventure will begin!

Yes, I have regrets. There are things I wish I hadn't done... things I should have done, but indeed, there are also many things I'm happy to have done. It's all in a lifetime.



So, if you're not in your winter yet... let me remind you, that it will be here faster than you think. So, whatever you would like to accomplish in your life, please do it quickly! Don't put things off too long!! Life goes by quickly. So, do what you can TODAY, as you can never be sure whether this is your winter or not!

You have no promise that you will see all the seasons of your life... so, LIVE FOR TODAY and say all the things that you want your loved ones to remember.. and hope that they appreciate and love you for all the things that you have done for them in all the years past!!

"Life" is a GIFT to you. The way you live your life is your gift to those who come after. Make it a fantastic one.

Remember: "It is Health that is real Wealth and not pieces of gold and silver."
