The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas met in regular session on Monday, March 28, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the following agenda items.

At 10:00 a.m. court reconvened to act on the seventeen items on the agenda.

- The court accepted the Wheeler County Treasurer's report in the amount of \$178,584.20.
