## Merely Mustard

Last week I killed a rattlesnake near my home. It was well after sundown and I had not seen the snake when I was walking around my vehicle. I would not have known the snake was there at all if I had not heard the faint buzzing sound that a small rattlesnake can make. Afterward, I was reflecting on the irony of the whole situation, and thinking that in a way, one could make an argument on behalf of the snake (and if there were ever a near-literal application of the word "devil's advocate", I'd say it would describe a person who argued on behalf

of a rattlesnake's rights) – that I committed an injustice against the snake who, in exchange for a warning (a courtesy, the devil's advocate might say), received two rounds of .22 caliber bird shot.

It is true that the snake did nothing to harm me, although it could have easily bitten me as I walked past it in the dark. And further than merely refraining from harming me, the snake warned me as to its presence, a double-courtesy which cost it its life. However, reverse the scenario, and imagine the snake had not rattled or

docilely remained in place as I walked past. Imagine it had bitten me instead. Would that not have been an injustice toward me, who was doing no harm to the snake? So I would argue, if I were defending myself against the devil's advocate. But, I would imagine that suppositions are not necessarily effective defenses in a court of law. So perhaps I should have allowed bygones to be bygones. But could not the warning rattle also be considered a threat? If so, and insofar as the threat bore the potential of serious bodily harm, I would be well

But, attorneys, never satisfied (only an attorney, or a toddler, would attempt to make an argument or question about the meaning of the word "is"), would not rest with the reasoning offered by the preceding paragraph. The devil's advocate might say that I committed the initial injustice of encroaching upon the snake's native habitat, with the placement of my dwelling. But that argument is easily turned around - I could, and would, make the same accusation of the snake. There is no question that I have been here longer than the snake, who, judging by its size, could not have been more than a couple years old.

In all seriousness, I did contemplate how the snake had done me multiple favors, by not biting me, by rattling, and thus providing me both the notice that it was there along with the opportunity to remove it from my driveway. And for all of these favors I ended its life. Well, so be it. Who's to say that it would not later bite me, or that if it had been sunny and thus warmer (and thus the snake more energetic), that it would not have passed up the opportunity to strike? There are some people who say, "The only good snake is a dead snake." I am not one of those people. However, I have found a friend's words to be generally true concerning the usefulness of rattlesnakes: "A bull snake can do every [useful] thing a rattlesnake can do."

I now acknowledge the bit of irony that last week I was talking about allowing certain predator species to remain in the home, and this week I

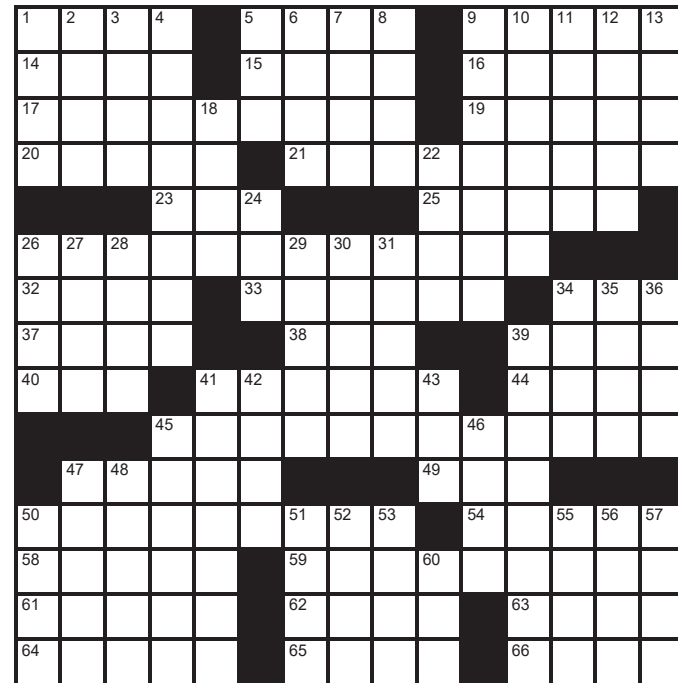

**Panhandle Tidbits**  
**MOBEETIE TORNADO**  
**....May 1, 1898**

The first reported tornado in the Panhandle was in Mobeetie on May 1, 1898. Below is an interview with Big Johnnie Jones from the book Memory Cups by Millie Porter

"The cyclone was the most terrible Wheeler County memory. We were living in the Cap Willingham house, built by Judge Patton. That first day of May was so hot and still, and that night the cloud was upon the town before anyone knew it. Our house was not disturbed, but just west of us several people were killed and injured. Judge Exum was the first I found. I wanted to move him to my home, but he said he was resting fairly comfortably and to leave him and see about the others. We buried him May 4th. Anna Belle Masterson had spent the night with her grandparents. I took her to the Jail. Her back had been injured. She was just a little girl, so I took her in my arms and carried her, but in the dark and over the rough ground I stepped

into ruts and holes and made her suffer terribly. "Next I went to the Masterson home. (It was the old Rising home.) Their house was of adobe framed up on the outside as many of them were. None of the others were seriously hurt, but the baby, who had been sleeping in a bed with a high headboard was dead. This headboard had been broken by the storm and bent over the bed, and the adobe wall had piled over on top of it. The baby had probably smothered to death, as there was no sign of injury on it. One strange thing was that there was a piece of glass on its chest next to its skin, but not a cut or scratch.

"The year-old baby of the Palmer family across the street was blown half a block. Its cries led people to it. Its head was badly

injured and it died before morning.

"We made all efforts possible to find every one. The Huselby House was gone and nothing could be found of the family. Next morning there were several people found to have taken shelter in one of the business houses that had escaped destruction. I went up there and was talking with a woman and asking how they fared, and asked if the Huselby family were safe or did anyone know. She told me they were all unharmed. Then I found that I was talking to Mrs. Huselby herself. She was so disheveled and her face covered with dirt and blood, her hair down, and I had not recognized her.

"Uncle Johnnie Stroker was dead when we found him, as was also a Mr. Wright. Mrs. I. N. Bowers, Sr., had been living down south and had married this Reverend Wright, and they had just come back to Mobeetie when this happened. Zula Bowers had married Frank Mulkins, and her mother and family were staying with them for a few days until they could find a house. Even the rock foundation of the home looked like a blast had been set off in it. Pearl Bowers, the youngest girl, was very slender. The next day it was reported that she had been blown through a seven wire fence. One fellow jokingly remarked, 'That's nothing; as skinny as she is, she could do that and never touch a wire.'

"Mother-like, the first thing Zula did was to see about her baby. It was quite limp, and with the surprising calm that seems to possess people at such a time, she carried it to her brother Newt and said, 'Here, Newt, take the poor little thing, it's dead.' He took the baby and began shaking it about and found it was merely sound asleep. Not another one was really hurt except the old man.

"There were five fatalities and several more whose death was indirectly laid to the cyclone, among them Mrs. Easley who ran an eating house, and the Postmaster, Jack Montgomery. My wife took care of Mrs. Montgomery when her son, Jack, was born a few months after his father's death."

"That was the second

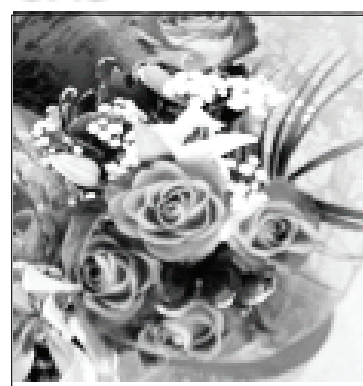

cyclone I had been through in Wheeler County, but the first one had not killed anyone and we had been able to laugh about most of it after it was over, but not this one."

The tornado of May 1, 1898 destroyed thirty-two homes and caused damage to all buildings including the courthouse and jail. The roof of the jail needed new shingles. Abraham Finsterwald was hired as contractor to perform the labor. The needed materials were freighted in by wagons. The Sheriff had to recover County material that had been blown around and keep the floor mopped when it rained.

The business district was destroyed. The population of Mobeetie in 1898 was over 1,000 people, but after the disaster began a steady decline. *from Millie - Porter's Book - "Memory Cups"*

It takes place on a "diamond," or four bases arranged in a square. There aren't real diamonds involved, so players won't get distracted by bright stones.

The pitcher stands in the middle of the square, and aims his throw at one of the bases, called home plate. The catcher stands behind the plate to catch the ball.

But next to the plate stands an offensive team member - the batter - who holds a giant wood stick. His job is to hit the ball in places defensive players are not. Confused yet?

The pitcher's job is to throw the ball in such a way that the batter misses it. So, he throws pitches called a fastball, curve, screwball, slider, or knuckleball. If he makes the ball too easy to hit, the offensive team will love him. However, his own team will not, and they will remove him from the game, and put in another pitcher.

Some defensive team members stand next to the bases, while others stand elsewhere. Some might say they are "outstanding in their field." These players try to catch the ball hit by the batter.

So, the batter hits the ball, and runs around the bases. If he touches all bases correctly, he scores a run. If he runs them randomly, he is considered "wacky," and is also called out. After three offensive players are called out, the other team gets a chance to bat.

One other thing...each team has a different uniform. That way the home team fans know which players to insult.

I would still like to play baseball myself, but I was terrible at it. I asked one of my coaches what position I should play, and he recommended "left out."
