The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, June 13, 2022, at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the following agenda items.

Merely Mustard

Last week I began writing about the demand for order, present throughout all of the natural world, and to which nature's laws are bound. Man also is subject to the demands of order, and whether or not man chooses to live in a way that acknowledges and honors the demands of order, order will express itself. Man can either have the dignity of co-operating with the laws of nature, or be tyrannized by these same laws. The order and flow of life can either be man's servant, or its master. Regardless, this reality can be observed easily enough: which provides more tranquility and peace (not to mention satisfaction) – reading a book held in your hands, or reading what people have written on Facebook (which I continue to maintain might be a creation of evil, or at the least, easily co-opted by evil, though I've not found many people willing to agree with me on this)?

The clear winner here is a good book. And if the book delivers tranquility, peace, and satisfaction, it follows that the person who has experienced these blessed states of being will sleep better than the one who has exposed him or herself to the poison which is so pervasive on the aforementioned web page (not to mention the blue light exposure emitted by whatever screen one uses to ingest the poison).

If this sounds dramatic it is unintentional—there is enough drama in the world without my needlessly contributing to it. But the point is that there is a call to order, and I am trying to keep my eyes open to it, because it expresses and asserts itself everywhere, and overlaps all facets of life. What I thought was a call to rest I now acknowledge is just one facet of the call to order. What I have expressed thus far is a poor attempt to grasp it; essentially it is an attempt to articulate for myself my findings, and my sense is that I have done a poor job. One could say that the attempt to describe order has been disordered, which is a good indicator I should stop.
