established a modicum of fitness. In other words, one must work harder and harder to keep making incremental progress. So it is. It has been that way for quite a while; at least since the time when the phrase, "By the sweat of your brow you shall eat..." became applicable. This is the basis for the

recurring theme of my need to clear off my desk it inevitably tends toward disorder. There are two silver linings hidden within this bleak reality, however. First, each time disorder is overcome, hopefully we are learning something, or many somethings - solutions to problems, mistakes we may have made and what we can do to lessen the frequency of our making them in the future, etc. Second, the struggle to maintain order, to keep it in place once achieved, is much smaller than the struggle to achieve it in the first place. This is particularly true if disorder is rooted out at its early manifestations: once the desk begins to accumulate clutter, clean it off and examine what actions caused it to begin to be cluttered again. It is easier to clean off 15% of the surface area than it is 100%. It is much simpler to weed a garden when mind is more thoroughly the shoots of undesirable plants are just large enough to identify, than it is when they have outgrown and writing to end, and another outcompeted the desirable action to commence: I feel plant; the phrase, "nip it in the

bud" comes to mind. I write this having just spent an hour or more cleaning off a portion of my desk and the room in which the desk is located. It was the byproduct of a couple maintenance too much to do, doing things at the wrong time, distraction, frustration,
