This past year our students continued to perform well above the State and Region 16 on State assessments. Ft. Elliott students excelled in athletics and academics at the District and Regional level. Ft. Elliott's One Act Play advanced to Regional. Our girls golf team qualified for State and competed well. Our agriculture students continued to excel in district and State competitions. All of these accomplishments set a new standard of excellence for this school year. In the next few weeks we will see our students and staff beginning the quest for even higher goals.

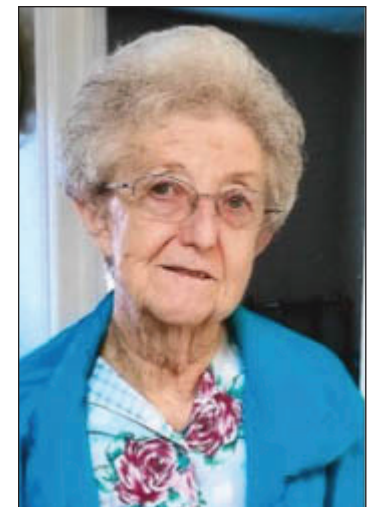
Cledith Burrell Is Buried On Aug. 1

Merely Mustard

Do you believe that less is more...the old, somewhat trite adage, most often delivered when someone makes an assessment that someone else is living in or striving for excess? Or is the saying not "less is more," but, "more is less?" If 'more' were the undesirable state to inhabit, and 'less' is the target, then "more is less" seems to land the follower of that maxim into a more desirable state than does "less is more" – if

pursuing less means you are destined for, or will achieve, or receive more.

In any case, there is a good measure of wisdom in the saying. Right now I am in a location on the pendulum's arc where "less is more" is quite applicable. I think it is one of the great paradoxes of life, that perhaps less is more. The thing that comes to mind most often concerning this statement is material possessions,

but it can be applied in any number of ways: work and labor efforts, the quantity of goals or endeavors one is pursuing, disciplines, exercise regimens, vehicles, options, and so on. There is always a fine line between having, pursuing, or achieving enough, and becoming caught in the vortex of 'more'. Generally this vortex is blinding and merciless until you get pulled down to the bottom of it, where

you are surrounded by so much 'more' that it is nearly suffocating, and the sack of rocks you have accumulated along the way becomes such a burden that you can hardly move.

But like any storm, the vortex generally plays out and subsides at some point, and when it does, a person can catch their breath and notice that the formerly-empty sack they were carrying is now full

DO NOT TOUCH." But invariably another traveler will think his rock sack is not full enough and pick them up. Let's hope that they, and we, are making progress down the fruitful path, as we pick up, discard, and pick up again, our burdens.

Texas Sales Tax Holiday is Aug. 5-7

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar is reminding shoppers they can save money on clothes and school supplies during the state's sales tax holiday on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, Aug. 5-7.

State law exempts sales tax on qualified items — such as clothing, footwear, school supplies and backpacks — priced below \$100, saving shoppers about \$8 on every \$100 they spend. The dates of the sales tax holiday and list of tax-exempt items are set by the Texas Legislature.

"Most Texans won't hear the back-to-school bell for another month, but it's never too early to take advantage of the opportunity to save money on everything from book bags to ballpoint pens," Hegar said. "With inflation driving prices higher on just about everything, this sales tax holiday provides Texas families some small relief managing the costs associated with kids heading back to the classroom. As the father of three school-aged children myself, I know how these expenses can add up."

The Comptroller's office estimates that shoppers will save \$112 million in state and local sales tax during this sales tax holiday.

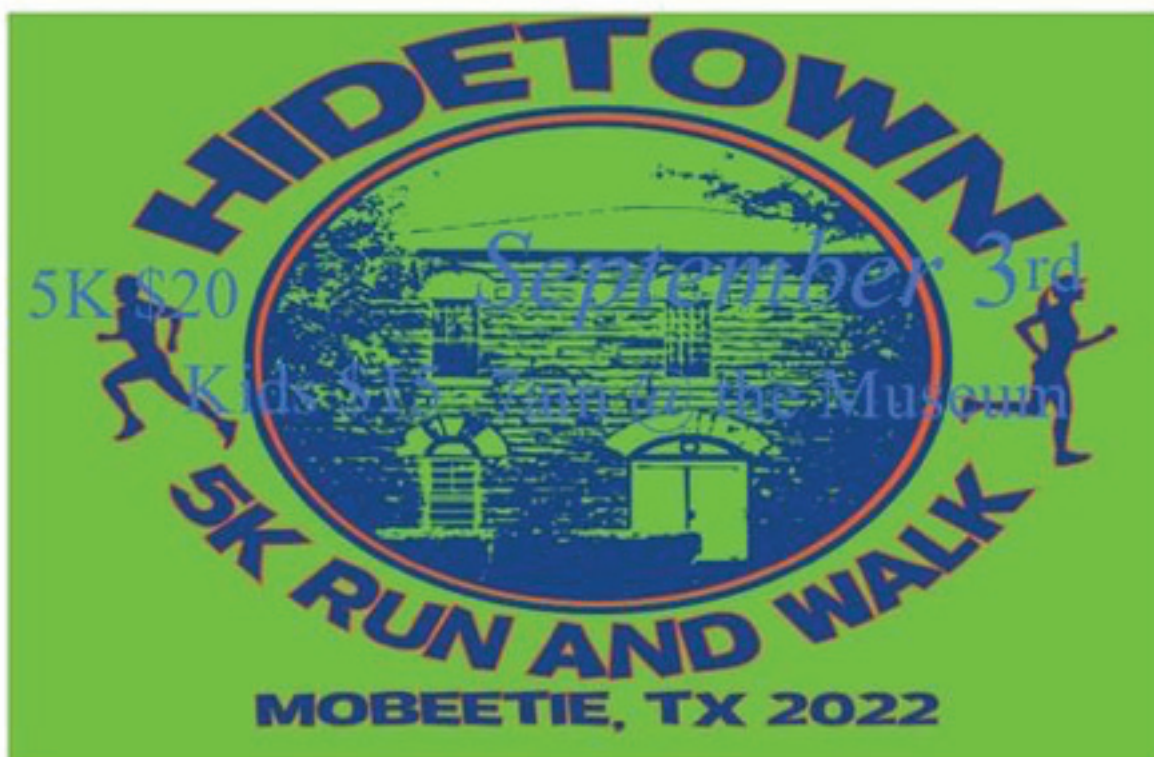

a year ago was once again in receipts from oil and gas mining, but receipts from the construction, manufacturing and wholesale trade sectors were also up by double digits for the eighth consecutive month.

"Receipts from retail trade and restaurants increased at a moderate pace, with some retail segments showing no growth or declining from a year ago as pent-up demand from the pandemic wanes and consumer spending priorities shift in response to inflation.

"Receipts from auto dealers and parts stores and home improvement stores exhibited double-digit growth, while receipts from general merchandise and online vendors grew more modestly. Receipts from clothing and apparel stores, home furnishings stores, and sporting goods and hobby stores were flat compared with a year ago, while receipts from electronics and appliance stores declined."

Total sales tax revenue for the three months ending in July 2022 was up 13.1 percent compared with the same period a year ago. Sales tax is the largest source of state funding for the state budget, accounting for 59 percent of all tax collections.

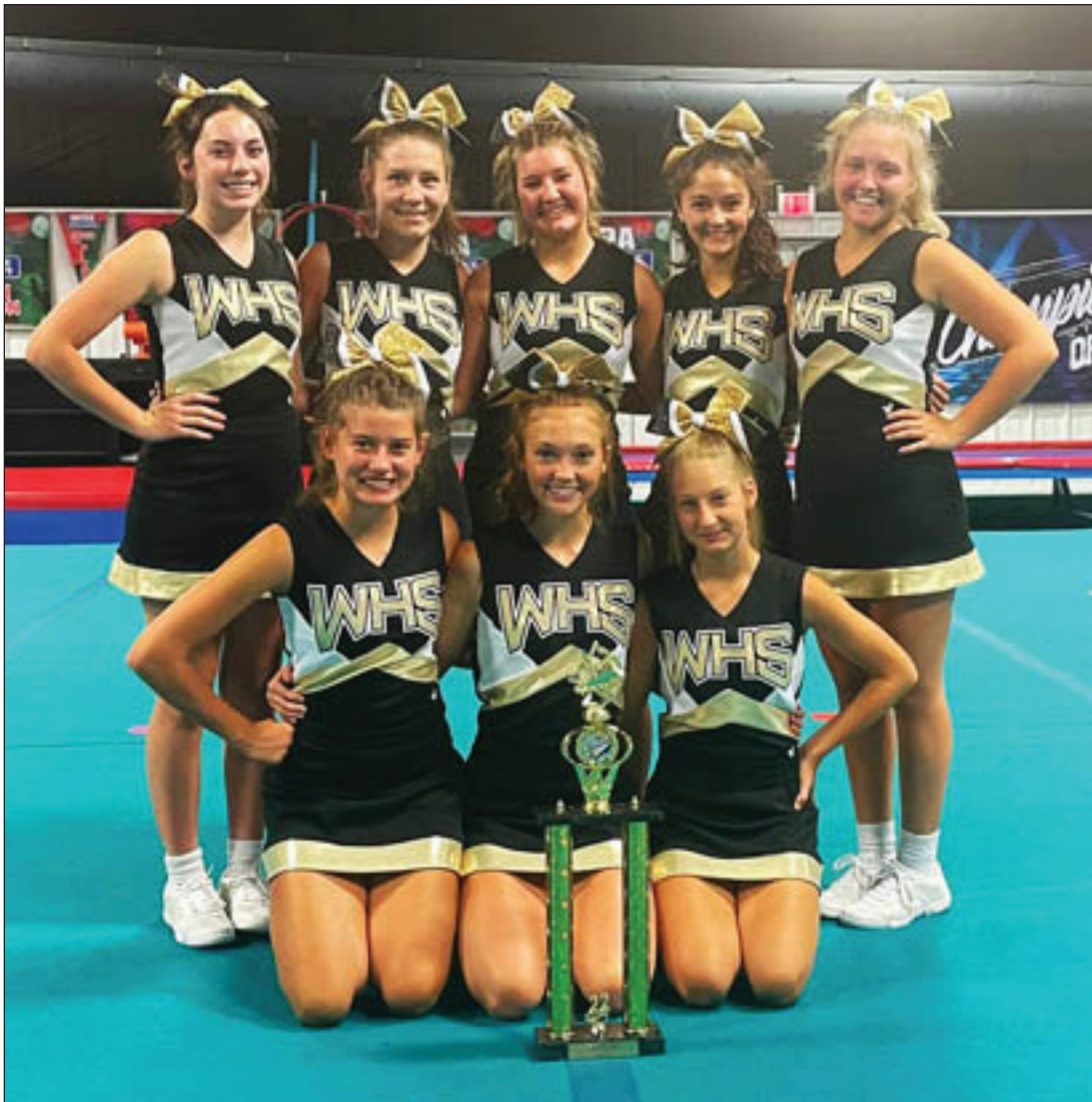
