Savings Bond Report Given

During the month of November, United States Savings Bond sales in Fisher county amounted to \$2,069, according to a report received from R. L. Springer, chairman of the Fisher county Savings Bonds Committee. To date, this county has purchased \$38,754 in Savings Bonds and this is 78 per cent of the 1966 goal of \$50,000.

During the first eleven months of 1966, Savings Bond sales in Texas amounted to \$139,381,146, which is 94 per cent of the state's goal of \$147.5 million. This is an increase of 5.2 per cent over the same period last year.

Nationally, the sale of Series E and H Savings Bond during November amounted to \$368 million. These sales were the highest for any November in 11 years; 9 per cent higher than a year ago. The January-November sales were \$4,488 million, 7 per cent over sales for the first 11 months a year ago and a 10-year record for any January-November sales since 1956," Chairman Springer stated.

Pranksters Are Molesting Mail Boxes in Rotan

"Mailboxes are protected by Federal law, and pranksters or vandals who damage or destroy the boxes or their contents may be in for a heavy fine or imprisonment." Postmaster Robert Phillips warned today.

The law states: "Whoever wilfully or maliciously injures, tears down or destroys any letterbox or other receptacle intended or used for the receipt or delivery of mail on any mail route, or breaks open the same or wilfully or maliciously injures, defaces or destroys any mail deposited therein, shall be fined not more than \$1000 or imprisoned not more than three years."

This applies to all mail receptacles and the mail in them, even though the boxes are bought by citizens and are their personal property, Postmaster Phillips emphasized.

Pranksters, and especially children who do not know any better, should be made to realize the seriousness of their actions. A \$1,000 fine or a term in jail is enough to take the humor out of any prank.

Often the mailbox damage is the work of youths, who do it for "kicks", but the courts have shown little sympathy for this "youthful means of expression." 2,641 persons were arrested in the year up to June 30, 1966 for damaging or destroying mailboxes.

Members will be urged to support a county safety committee to study local needs, to encourage good traffic law enforcement, and to call for effective safety education.

Huckaby was operating a front end loader, cleaning out a stock tank, when he ran it up a bank; the 25,000 pound machine fell back on him. This occurred on the C. D. Jones Ranch.

Born Oct. 17, 1937, in Rotan, he attended schools in Rotan and Snyder. He married Janith Hickerson of Plains April 10, 1955. He followed construction work in West Texas and New Mexico, working for Price Construction Co. He was a member of First Baptist Church of Seagraves.

Survivors include the wife; three children, Jack Jr., Rhonda and Gary of the home; the mother, Mrs. Ross Woolsey of Roby the father, Clem Huckaby of Tatum New Mexico three sisters, Mrs. Wendell Bockman of Anson; Mrs. Joe Cobb of Del Rio and Mrs. John Garner of Abilene; three brothers, James Earl, Jerry Don and Ricky, all of Tatum, N. M.; and the grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Dalton Huckaby of Rotan.

At the same time Hobbs gin had reached 8,025, with about 500 bales on the yard, awaiting ginning. Cotton men say there is considerable cotton still in the fields.

County 4-H - FFA Livestock Show Scheduled In Roby Saturday 7th

The Fisher County 4-H and FFA Livestock Show will be held, Saturday, January 7. The show is sponsored by the Fisher County Jr. Livestock Show Association.

Following rules for the show:

1. Only 4-H Club members and Future Farmers of America presently enrolled in Fisher County clubs and chapters will be eligible to exhibit animals fed under supervision of the County Agent or Vocational Agriculture Teacher in county.

2. All animals must be on the ground no later than 9:00 A.M. January 7, unless animal was in the Odessa Show. However, animal may be put in stalls and pens Friday before show, but individual will be responsible for his or her animal.

3. Judging will start promptly at 9:30 A.M. January 7. Judging will be in the order listed below.

4. Animal must be weighed at the show in the presence of the division superintendents, and put in classes so they will be a credit to the show.

5. A certificate of registration on each beef heifer must be available prior to judging.

6. Ribbons will be awarded the top ten places in each class. Money prizes will be awarded each exhibitor in each class, but only two money places will be awarded any individual in any class. Ribbons only will be awarded Pens of Three in all divisions.

7. All owners of property or others having same in charge shall care for, guard and protect and preserve the same as the Fisher County Fair Association does not undertake to do so, and it shall not be held responsible for any loss or damage to said property.

8. Judges' decision will be final in all cases.

9. If only one animal in a class ribbon and placing will be on merit of animal.

10. Second place animal to Grand Champion will show for reserve champion.

11. Showmanship Awards: Trophies will be awarded, in each of the four divisions, to the boy or girl who in the opinion of the judges does the best all-around job of presenting his or her animal. These 4 trophies are being made available by the Fisher County Young Farmers Chapter.

Judging Order: Purebred Dairy Heifery: Class 1; Cows in Milk — Only first calf heifers, Class 2; Yearling Heifers not in milk; Class 3; Heifers under 12 months; Jerseys — Holstein Class 4. Same as Class 1; Class 5, Same as Class 2; Class 6. Same as Class 3

Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Dairy Animal (of both breeds) Swine:

1. Pigs under 75 or over 240 pounds will not be allowed to show. 2. Barrows and open gilts will be allowed to show.

Class 7: Feeder Pigs; 75 lbs. to 159 lbs. (all breeds within this weight) - DUROC Class 8: Lightweight pigs 160 lbs to 180 lbs.; Class 9: Middleweight pigs, 181 lbs - 200 lbs. Class; 10: Heavyweight pigs, 201 lbs to 240 lbs, Class 14 Pen of 3 any weight. Other Breeds and Crosses Class 11: Lightweight pigs; Class 12: Middle weight pigs; Class 13: Heavyweight pigs.

Grand and reserve champion (will be picked from light middle or heavy weight of Classes 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, or 13).

2. All steers will be weighed at the show grounds, and weight classes broken so that the same number of seters will be in each class.

Angus Steers: Class 29: Lightweight; Class 30: Heavy weight; Hereford Steers: Class 31: Light weight; Class 32: Heavy weight.

Grand and reserve champion of the steer show (will be picked from mclasses 29, 30, 31, and 32.)

Class 33: Commercial Steers (will be graded at Sweetwater the same day and this results will be used for the county placing.)

Choice - Blue ribbon; Good - Red ribbon; Medium - White ribbon.

Judge: Bill Scott, Vocational Agriculture Teacher, Abilene High School.
