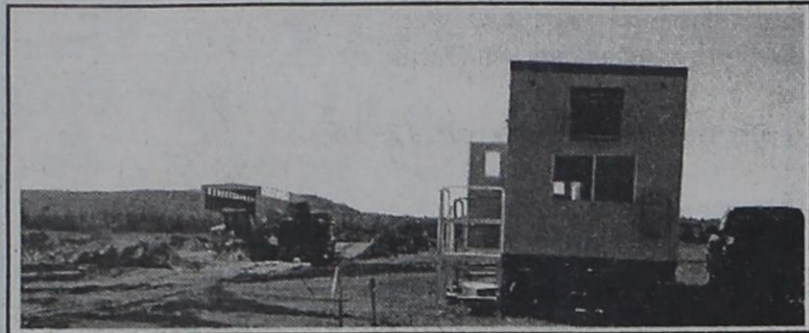

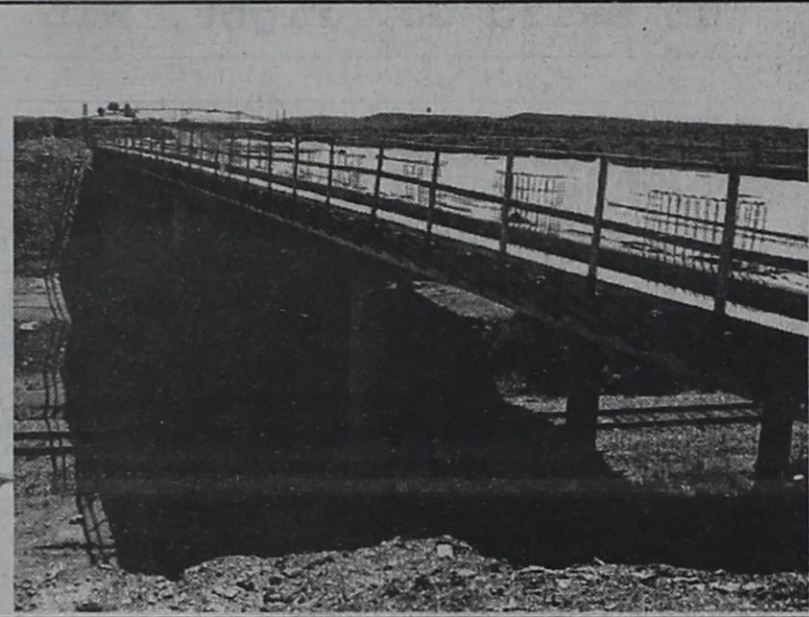

The scholarship established in memory of Cross Plains native Jack Scott is available for students from Callahan County. The fund was established by his daughter and son-in-law, Mary Scott and Lynn Nabers of Austin. Jack Scott passed away in 2003.

The scholarship is a tribute to Scott's commitment to education and his desire to see students from Callahan County have the opportunity to earn college degrees.

"My dad was passionate about wanting students from Cross Plains and the surrounding area to be able to attend college," said Mary Scott Nabers. "He would be enormously pleased to know there is a fund in his memory that

Jack Scott was born September 14, 1909, in Baird, Texas, to George B. and Adelia Scott. His maternal grandparents, the J.B. Cutbirths, moved to the Baird area in 1876 before Callahan County was organized. The Scott family dates back to 1890 when the F. T. Scotts, Jack's paternal grandparents, settled in Cottonwood, Texas.

As a young man, Jack attended school in Baird and Cross Plains until his junior year when he transferred to the West Texas Military Institute in San Antonio for two years. Upon graduation, he enrolled in Hardin-Simmons University in Abilene. He graduated in 1930 and during his tenure there served as editor of the campus newspaper, *The*

**BAIRD-** Howard Nolen, 67, of Baird, died Tuesday, Sept. 12, 2006 in a local hospital.

Visitation and a memorial service was held Thursday, Sept. 14, 2006 at 7 p.m. in the Parker Funeral Home chapel. Interment followed on Sunday in Fairview, Tennessee.

Howard was born on May 27, 1939, in Tennessee, where he was raised. He married Emma Savage on January 15, 1960, and they moved to Texas from Oklahoma in 2000. Music and woodworking were his favorite pastimes. He loved spending time with his family and his dog, Bubba. A truly loving and kind man who helped everyone he knew, he will be greatly missed and warmly

remembered.

Howard is survived by his wife, Emma of 46 years; three daughters, Connie Martin, Chris McCauley, and Carol (and Darin) Albergucci of Baird; six grandchildren, Chelsea, Chandler, and Noah Albergucci, Sarayah and Skip Martin of Baird, and Jessica and Jason Fleetwood; three great-grandchildren, Jaida, Jaxson and Jordayn of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma; three sisters, June Tidwell, Joan Tidwell, and Linda Hall; and three brothers, Jimmy, J.C., and Kenneth Nolen, all from Tennessee.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Jim and Edith Nolen; a sister, Jewell Bradley; and three brothers, Claudie, Eugene, and Herman Nolen.

**Brand.** After graduation, he went home to Cross Plains and persuaded the local bank to allow him to purchase an interest in the newspaper on credit. He became the editor of the *Cross Plains Review* at the age of 20 and by 1940, he bought the business.

In 1933 Jack married Juakana (Kanie) Westerman, a native of Cross Plains. The couple had a remarkable marriage that lasted for 67 years. Juakana Scott died in 2000 after a courageous one-year battle with cancer.

Jack spent most of his life as a newspaper editor in Central Texas. He was editor and publisher of the *Cross Plains Review* and numerous other weekly publications in the area. He served as mayor of Cross Plains for almost a decade and was active in numerous civic organizations until the age of 90.

After Jack retired from publishing he spent time teaching students at Cross Plains High School. Occasionally during those years, he considered himself to be a full-time teacher. At other times, he simply made himself available for specialized lectures, substitute teaching and assistance with special projects. Until he left Cross Plains to move to Austin, he counseled students periodically in his home. He wrote many letters of recommendation to colleges and universities and on occasion helped accumulate funds for students who were struggling to pay college tuition.

Jack also loved the banking industry and served for many decades as a director of Citizens State Bank. He was also involved in oil and gas exploration and ran a small cattle operation near Cross Plains. ###

Clovis, N.M.—The New Mexico/Texas Dairy Highlights meeting has been scheduled for Oct. 11 at the Clovis Civic Center in Clovis, N.M., a Texas Cooperative Extension specialist said.

Dr. Ellen Jordan, Extension dairy specialist, said the joint meeting with Texas A&M University and New Mexico State University is a way for producers to learn about the latest research and demonstration results from the two Universities that they might use in operating their dairies.

The Oliver Stone film "World Trade Center" will open at the Majestic Theater in Eastland on Friday, Sept. 22, and show through Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Monday nights. "too soon" make a movie like this, but Stone indicates it is a tribute to all the first responders to that event. This is a gripping, thought-provoking picture - historical in nature.

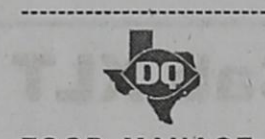

### Living Well The Burden of PTSD

Research leads to new treatment strategies.

Post-traumatic stress disorder has been observed in U.S. veterans of all war eras. However, careful documentation of PTSD and research into its causes and treatment did not begin until after the Vietnam War. Researchers have made notable progress since then in understanding the condition. As a result, many combat veterans and others with PTSD are benefiting from new methods of treatment.

PTSD can occur following exposure to combat, natural disasters, serious accidents, personal assaults or other traumas. Patients often relive their traumas through flashbacks and nightmares. They may sleep poorly and feel detached from others. Anxiety and de-

pression are common.

Aside from these psychological symptoms, the disorder is marked by identifiable changes in brain chemistry. VA researchers were the first to document these changes and to show how reminders of trauma trigger the brain's stress circuits.

Physical problems such as headaches, gastrointestinal disorders, dizziness and chest pain are common in PTSD patients. Health experts have come to recognize that strong links between our psychological and physical health. Such is clearly the case with PTSD.

By the Numbers. The National Vietnam Veterans Readjustment Survey, conducted in the late 1980s, found that about 15 percent of male and 8 percent of female Vietnam War veterans were diagnosed with PTSD at the time of the study. Lifetime prevalence of PTSD among these veterans was about 31 percent for men and 27 percent for women.

Another major survey by

sociologists in the early 1990s, estimated that nearly 8 percent of all Americans—5 percent of men and more than 10 percent of women—experience PTSD symptoms at some point.

New attention has been focused on PTSD since the Sept. 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Public-health officials in the United States and other nations are concerned about the impact of terrorism on emergency-response workers and the public in general. A study by the New York State Psychiatric Institute found a heightened risk of PTSD among people who simply watched television coverage of the attacks.

Interestingly, VA and Yale University researchers who studied the medical records of veterans with PTSD were surprised to see, on average, an improvement in symptoms in the six months following the Sept. 11 attacks. The researchers wrote in a journal article: "It is possible that these veterans benefited from the shared feelings of national unity, pride and patriotism in the months after Sept. 11 as well as from

the normalization of PTSD-like reactions by the news media and a sense of mastery at having past experience in coping with trauma."

Treatment Strategies. Psychotherapy has shown some promise as a PTSD treatment. A recent study of male Vietnam War veterans compared trauma-focused group therapy, in which patients try to work through their troubling experiences by reliving them under controlled conditions, with present-centered treatment, which teaches patients techniques for coping with problems but does not focus on their trauma. The trial found benefits for both methods, especially trauma-focused therapy, though only about 40 percent of participants showed clinically significant improvements.

A study at 10 VA medical centers and one Army hospital is now comparing the same treatments in women. The research is particularly timely because of the numbers of women serving in Iraq. The study is coordinated by VA's Vermont-based National Center for PTSD, one of the world's leaders in PTSD research and treatment.

Antidepressants and anti-anxiety drugs have proven useful for treating specific PTSD symptoms. Studies by Dr. Murray Raskind of the VA Puget Sound Health-Care System have shown that prazosin—a drug originally approved for hypertension—may reduce nightmares among PTSD patients. And a team that included VA researchers in Manchester, N.H., found that the beta-blocker propranolol may help prevent PTSD after a trauma.

Much remains unknown about PTSD. VA scientists and clinicians are forging ahead to better understand and treat PTSD, for the benefit of our courageous veterans and all Americans with the disorder.

## FEAR

Thomas Macaulay tells of a visitor who came to see the Duke of Argyle a few hours before his execution. The Duke had opposed some legislation destructive to freedom. The visitor was told that he could not see the Duke because the Duke was asleep. The visitors did not believe what he was told, so he insisted on entering. The door of the cell was quietly opened and fast asleep on his bed lay Argyle in his irons.

The story sets in contrast the frantic fear of unbelief and the quiet calm of a great faith. Fear bewilders the mind, paralyzes the will, and throws dread over the soul. Faith enlightens the mind, unifies the will, and liberates the soul. Faith holds us steady in life or death.

Faith and fear are contrasted perfectly by Harry Emerson Fosdick in *Fear and Faith*. He says: "Fear imprisons, faith liberates; fear paralyzes and faith empowers; fear disheartens, faith encourages; fear sickens, faith heals; fear makes useless, faith makes serviceable--And most of all, fear puts hopelessness at the heart of life, while faith rejoices in its God."

Robert Louis Stevenson said: "Keep your fears to yourself, but share your courage with others."

Karle Wilson Baker talked about fear and courage in his poem, *Courage*, when he wrote:

"Courage is armor a blind man wears;  
The callused scar of out-lived despairs;

Courage is fear that has said its prayers."

Gathered about the chancel of a church one Saturday a group of people were gathered. A two-year old child appeared at the doorway and the father told him to come on in. The child replied, "I'm afraid," and would not enter. Then the child's father walked down the aisle, took his son by the hand, and walked the child down the aisle. Someone remarked, "It's easier to walk when holding the Father's hand, for then fear is gone."

The way appears easier for each of us, and our fears are lessened when we take the Father's hand, and walk with Him. As for tomorrow, we do

not know what hazards or hardships we may face. There may be tarnished dreams, ill health, a lost job, the death of a loved one, and truly we cannot know of our tomorrows. But of this we can be confident: God who has walked with us in our uncertain yesterdays will go before us and be with us in the unknown tomorrows. God is always there seeking to share life with us. His presence provides us with courage.

The bull moose has antlers which sometimes measure about five feet across. They stay near the water in spring and summer, but move into the dense forest to find shelter during other seasons. This is when the bull moose shed antlers in order to allow free movement through the trees. We too, must shed our fears and doubts in order for us to

move forward and explore the full potential territory of our future.

Sometime we feel fear as Christ did on the Mount of Olives, but faith is always stronger than fear.

In **Contrast of Worry**, O.S. Marden writes: "We lend power to the things we fear! Fear is nothing more than a sense of being unable to cope with an expected crisis. Fear is born of ignorance. We fear, because we are not awake to our divine possibilities; we have discovered only a small part of our power, our resources; the vast reservoirs of strength and plenty that lie within us unfathomed." He also writes: "We are always headed toward our fears, just as we are toward our hopes and our ambitions."

St. Francis De Sales wrote *Safekeeping* in which he said: "Do not look forward to the charges and chances of this life in fear; rather look to them He is your keeper. He has kept you hitherto. Do you

but hold fast to His dear hand, and He will lead you safely through all things, and, when you cannot stand, He will bear you in His arms. Do not look forward to what may happen tomorrow.

Our Father will either shield you from suffering, or He will give you strength to bear it."

Angelo Patri said "Education consists in being afraid at the right time."

Dogs react differently to storms. Some dogs curl up in a tight ball and others bark furiously. Do we stand up to our fears or are we confused and frightened?

In Psalm 91:5 we read: "Thou shalt not be afraid for the terror by night; nor for the arrow that flieth by day." God's love will protect us from life's insecurities if we "put on the whole armor of God."

In II Timothy 1:7 we read: "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power and of love and of a sound mind." Near Macon, Georgia, two Black sisters, Annie and Ellen, lived in a small frame house. When questioned about being afraid when they were in their house in the woods alone were they ever afraid. They answered emphatically that they were never alone, for Jesus was always with them.

In Eastland, my Grandma Jon had lots of blooming bushes with their fair share of bees, which darted here and there. I was terrified of bees, but watched as she would go out and break off a perfect cluster and never get stung by the bees. Years later I came to understand that Grandma Jon had not taken dominion over the bees, but she had taken dominion over her fear.

"What time I am afraid, I will trust in thee." Psalm 56:3. Talk about your fears to someone you trust. Everyone is afraid of something.

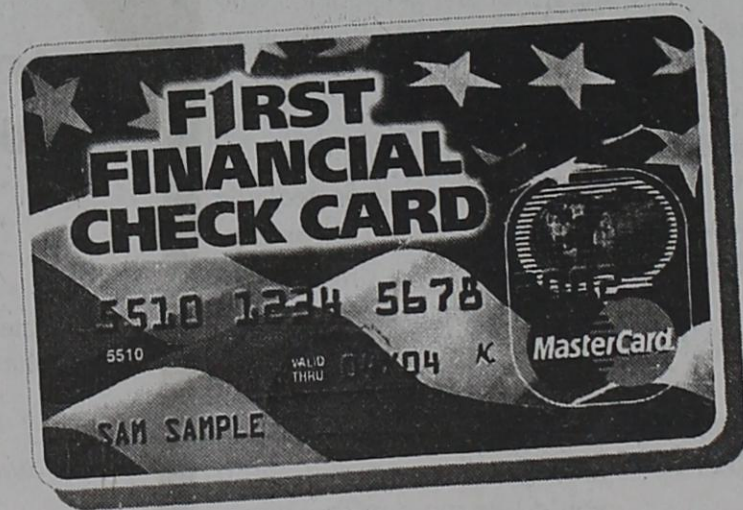

I continue to get questions regarding the upcoming bond election so I guess I will keep this explanation in this article till the election so that everyone can refer to it and have several opportunities to read about it. I may add to it from time to time to cover other questions I have been asked. If the bond passes, it will have no effect on senior citizens that have had a ceiling set on their taxes. It will also have no effect on homestead exemptions. Last year, your school tax rate was \$1.45 per \$100.00 dollars evaluation. So, on a \$50,000.00 home, the school tax was approximately \$725.00. This year the tax rate was lowered to \$1.3257 and the approximate tax on the same home will be approximately \$662.85. This is a savings of approximately \$62.15, if your home did not increase

in value. If the bond passes, we will not do anything until we see if the Legislature (begins in January) rolls forward the existing debt allotment for schools (EDA). We have to have EDA money to actually do the project. Assuming the state rolls forward the EDA program and the district issues the bonds, the state will be picking up approximately 65% of our debt service payable on the bonds. Our part of the debt service would be approximately .32 cents per hun-

dred dollars evaluation. The state has said they are lowering the maintenance and operations tax rate to \$1.00 next year. Based on this \$1.00 maintenance and operations tax rate, coupled with our .04 cents enrichment and the .32 cents for payment of the bonds, the district's total tax rate will be approximately \$1.36 for the 2007-2008 school year if the bond passes. This would make the school tax on a \$50,000.00 home approximately \$680.00, approxi-

mately \$45.00 lower than the 2005-2006 taxes. The amount of the proposed bond issue is \$5,000,000.00 and the term is thirty years. If you have any questions, please call me. Remember, it takes community involvement for a school to be successful and you are welcome to get involved at Gorman ISD anytime. This is your school; these are your children; and these children are your future! Your input is always welcome. Come help us shape the future.

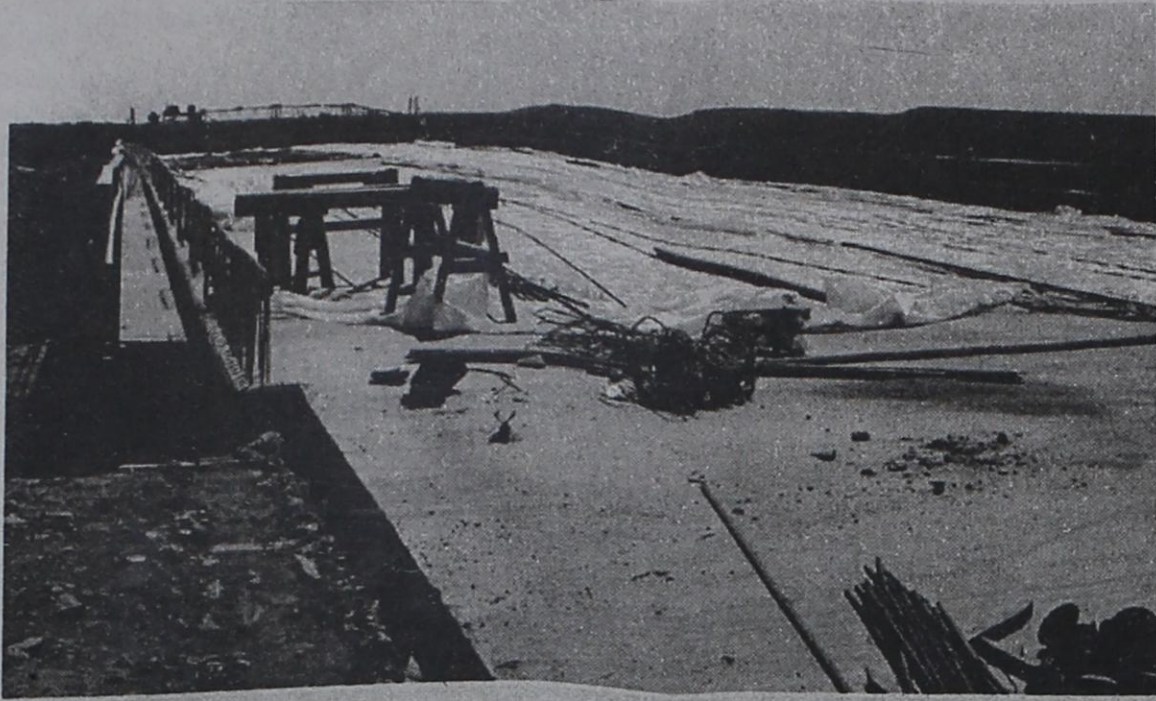

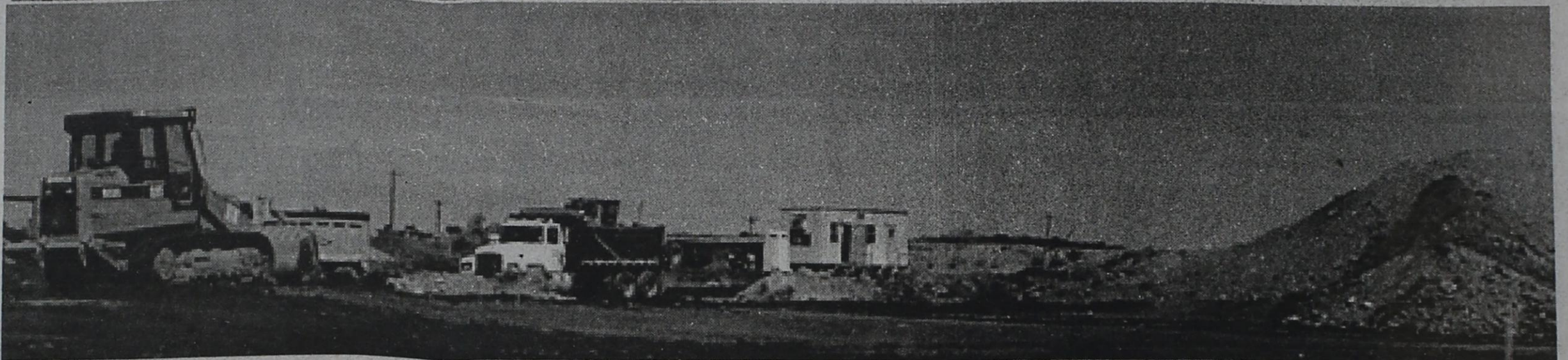
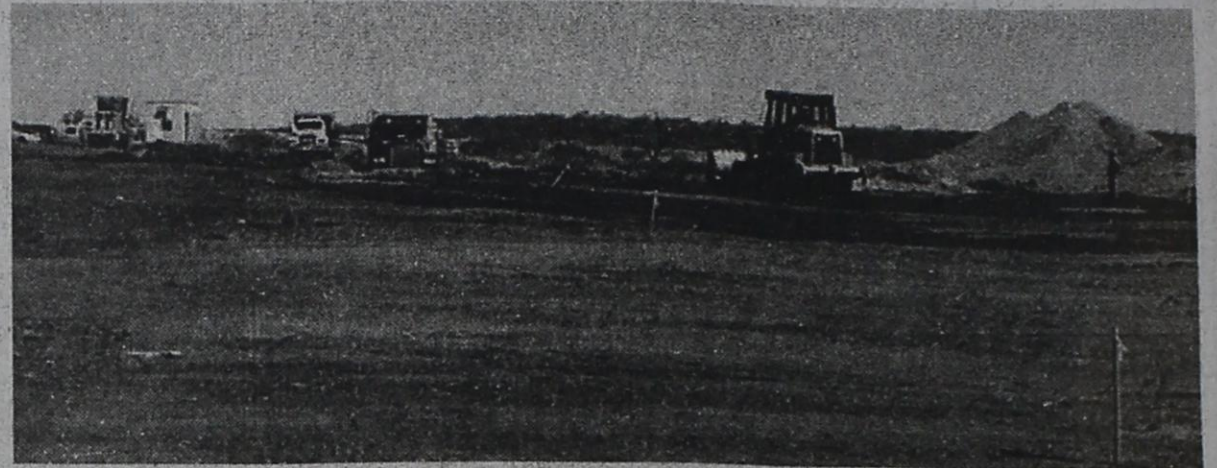
