Pope said: " A man should never be ashamed to own he has been in the wrong, which is but saying in other words that he is wiser today than he was yesterday."



UIL Schedules Altered Due To Swine Flu

AUSTIN, TX- On the recommendation of Dr. David Lakey, Commissioner of the Texas Department of State Health Services, and in consultation with Texas Education Agency Commissioner Robert Scott, the University Interscholastic League is altering its schedule of events due to the outbreak of the swine flu in Texas. Effective immediately, all UIL interscholastic competition is suspended until May 11

"The health and safety of our student activity participants is of the utmost importance," said UIL Executive Director Dr. Charles Breithaupt. "Taking every possible precaution to prevent the further spreading of this disease is an important contribution to the welfare of our great state, and altering the schedule of our events is a way to keep our participants safe."

As this is a fluid situation, the UIL tentatively releases the following schedule for UIL regional and state events affected by this situation.

Texas State Wind Ensemble Festival

The Texas State Wind Ensemble Festival, originally scheduled for May 9, has been cancelled. The UIL staff will consult with the 16 participating schools to determine whether or not to reschedule the event at a later date.

Golf State Tournament

The UIL golf state tournament will take place at the previously scheduled times beginning May 11.

Tennis State Tournament

The UIL tennis state tournament will take place at the previously scheduled times beginning May 11.

Baseball and Softball

No interschool games will take place until May 11 for either

UIL Academic State Meet Rescheduled The 2009 UIL Academic State Meet, originally scheduled for May 7-9 has been rescheduled due to the swine flu outbreak in Texas.

The revised dates for the Academic State Meet are May 25-26 for all conferences. The One-Act-Play competition for conferences 1A-3A will be held May 26-28. All contests will take place on the University of Texas campus.

A detailed schedule of the Academic State Meet will be posted on the UIL web site in the near future.

UIL Regional Track Meets Tentatively Rescheduled After collaborating with University of Texas officials and the twenty UIL regional track meet hosts, the UIL has tentativelyrescheduled the regional track meets to take place after interscholastic competition resumes on May 11. Additionally, the state track meet is scheduled to be held June 5-6 at Myers Stadium at the University of Texas at Austin. "The decision to suspend competition was not a decision we took lightly," said UIL Executive Director Dr. Charles Breithaupt. "Much effort and consideration was given to resurrect the regional track meets and change the dates for the state meet. With the cooperation of our regional sites and the University of Texas, we are now able to hold the regional and state track meets as we had originally intended."

May Is Motorcycle Safety and **Awareness Month**

In 2008, the DPS Motorcycle Operator Training Program trained a recordnumber 41,000 motorcycle operators, up from 33,697 in 2007. But all that training isn't enough to ensure the safety of motorcycle operators. Drivers of other vehicles, who share Texas roadways with 908,665 licensed motorcyclists, must make a conscious effort to look for motorcyclists.

Almost 400 motorcyclists were killed in crashes in 2007; preliminary fatality reports for 2008 also indicate an increase in fatalities. A high percentage of those crashes involved other vehicles. Most motorcycle crashes occur near intersections, largely because inattentive vehicle drivers fail to see the motorcyclist and give them the right-of way. "Because of its small size, a motorcycle can be easily hidden in a car's blind spots such as the door or roof pillars, or masked by objects or backgrounds outside a car such as bushes, fences and bridges." said John G. Young, coordinator of the DPS Motorcycle Safety Unit. "Take an extra moment to look for motorcycles, whether you're changing lanes or turning at intersections." To address the increase of car and motorcycle crashes on a local level, some Texas cities such as Arlington have began local public awareness events. The City of Austin has a motorcycle safety fair scheduled for May 9 to increase public awareness and remind drivers to look for motorcycles.
