

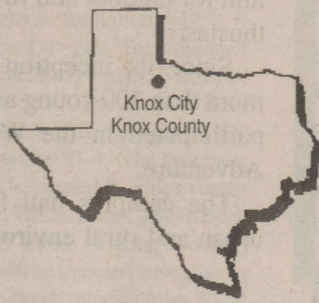

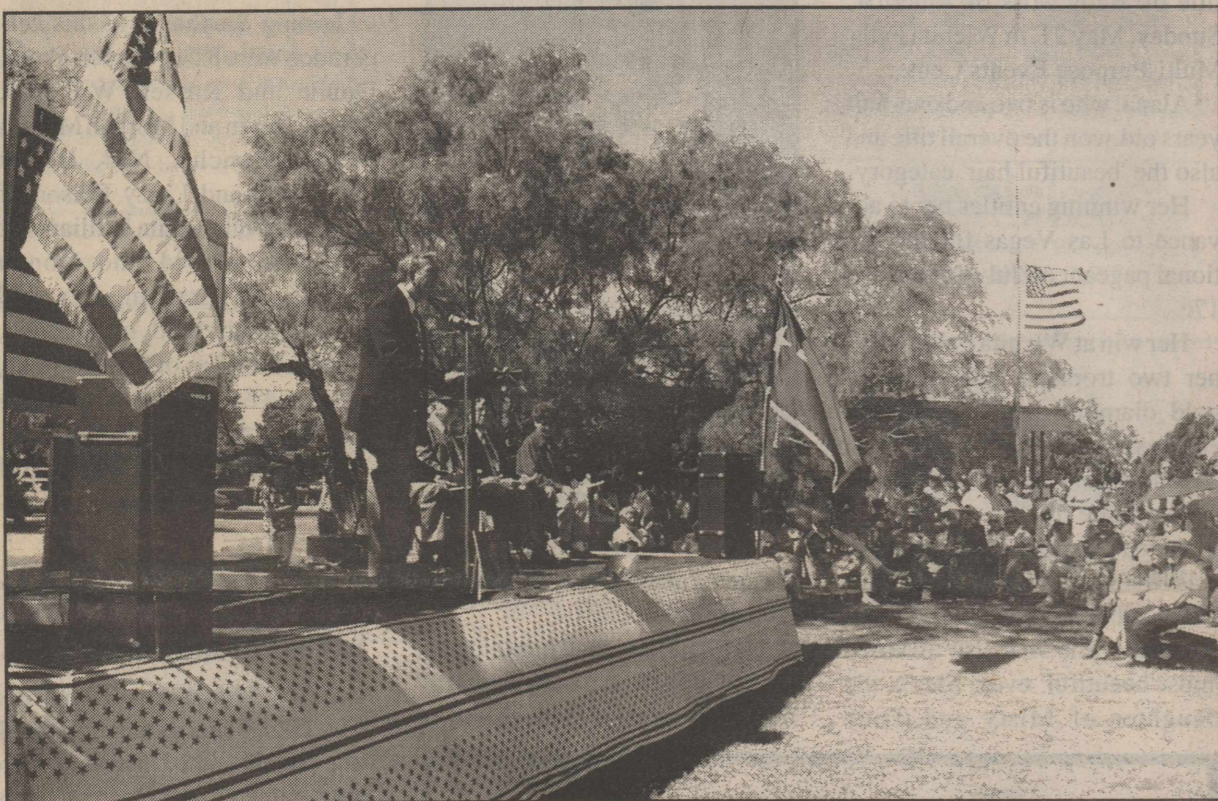

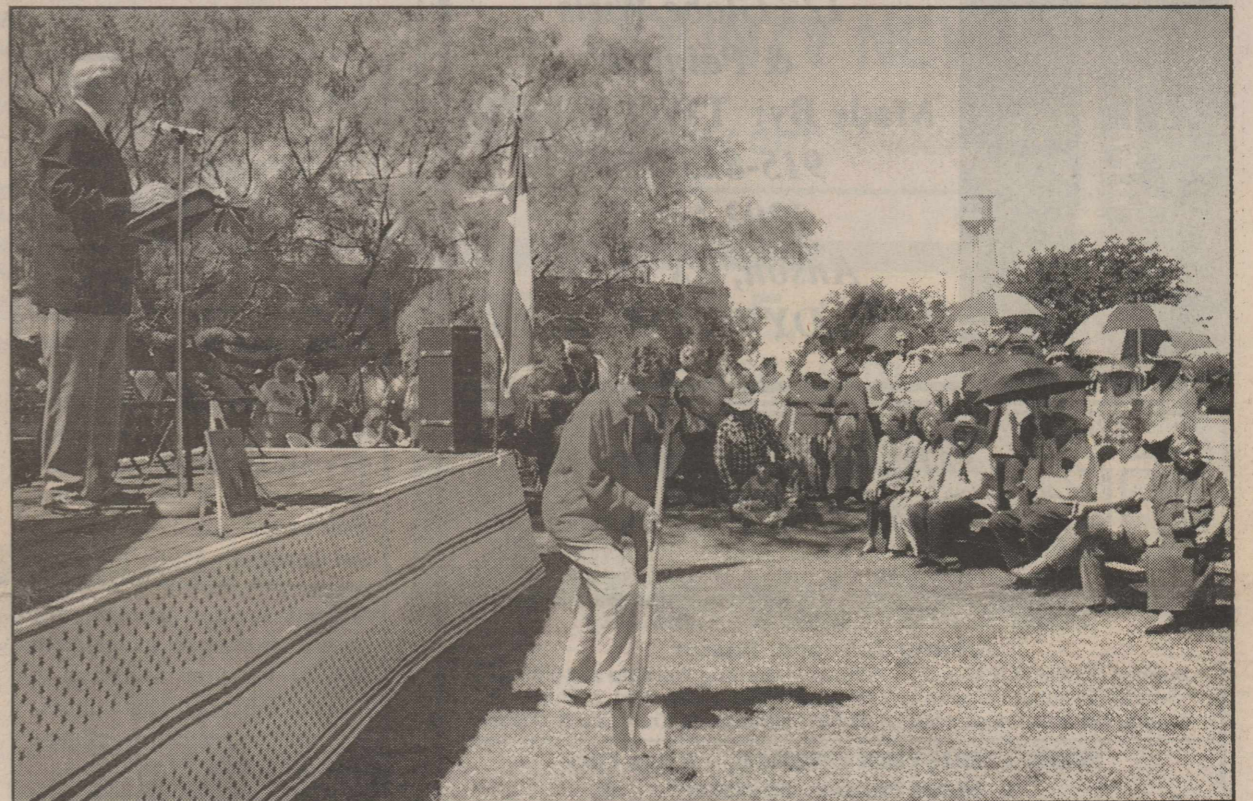

Mangis granddaughter is valedictorian at Prosper High

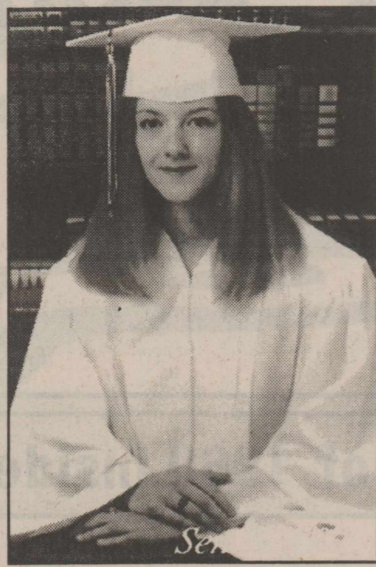

all 50 states, some Canadian provinces, and several foreign countries.

The Whittington Adventure occurs twice each year in the form of two, two-week sessions. During each session, 48 young adults between the ages of 13 and 17 are

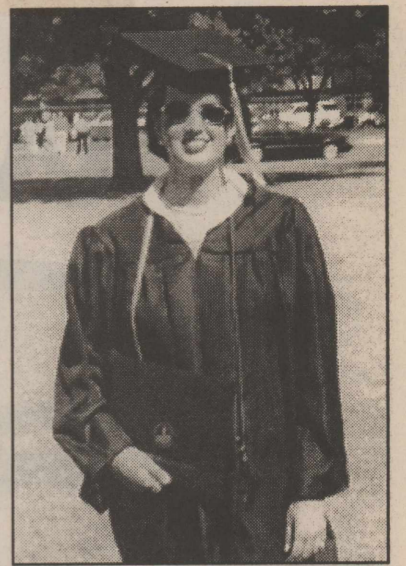
introduced to a curriculum that includes emphasis upon the development of hunting ethics and responsibilities, map reading, orienteering, outdoor survival, staling and field dressing.

Every camper will be required to learn and demonstrate firearms handling, safety and shooting skills in rifles, pistols, shotguns, muzzleloaders and archery.

Campers exhibiting appropriate leadership skills will be encouraged to return to future Whittington Adventure sessions as Counselors-in-Training.

The NRA Whittington Center is open to the public year round and consists of 52 square miles of mountains, plains, rugged canyons and rolling meadows, located 10 miles southwest of Raton in north-west New Mexico.

Hester. Tancy also qualified for the national contest.

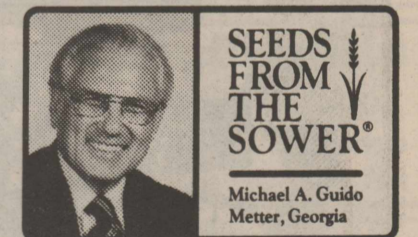
National pageant participants will be judged on a baby's natural beauty, personality and charm.
