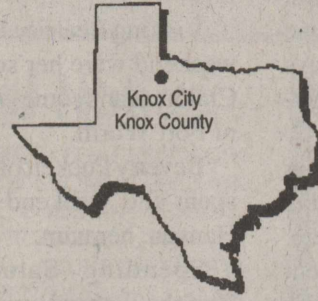


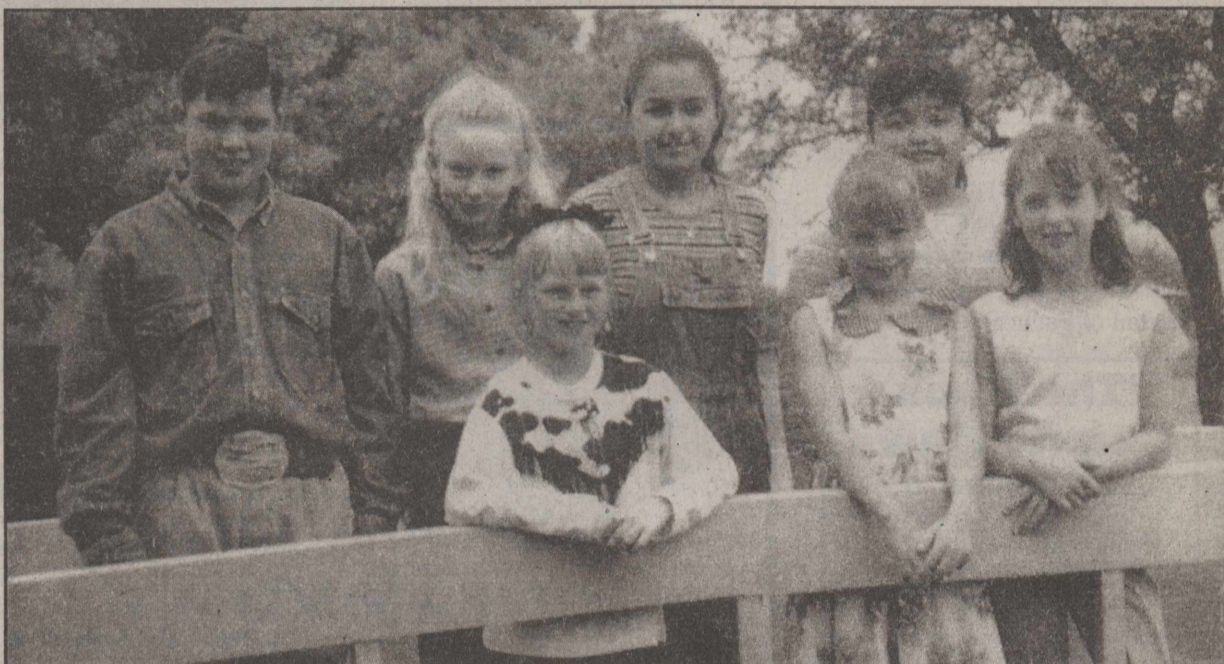

Groundwater level reports are still down

The Haskell-Knox Underground Water Conservation District has completed its annual survey of water levels in observation wells in Baylor, Haskell and Knox Counties.

This survey along with data obtained from the Texas Water Development Board gives an indication of the status of the Seymour Aquifer in three counties.

As a matter of public education, the well levels relative to this time last year are Baylor County, -1.61 feet; Haskell County, -1.47 feet except for an area 2.25 miles southeast of O'Brien where the water level is still down ten feet from April 2000; and Knox County, -0.3 feet.

This information is furnished to the citizens of Baylor, Haskell and Knox Counties to help in planning water conservation practices during the coming spring and summer months. The record rainfall has been experienced during the winter months has helped to alleviate some of the effects of the drought. This water level information indicates that the drought is far from over. As this is written, April rainfall will end up with a deficit of over 1.5 inches.

Another drought indicator is the level of water in Miller Creek Reservoir. The lake is at 47.5% of capacity and 9 feet below the spillway level.

The Knox City Child Development Center is taking applications for the enrollment of three and four year old children for the Head Start program that will begin in the fall.

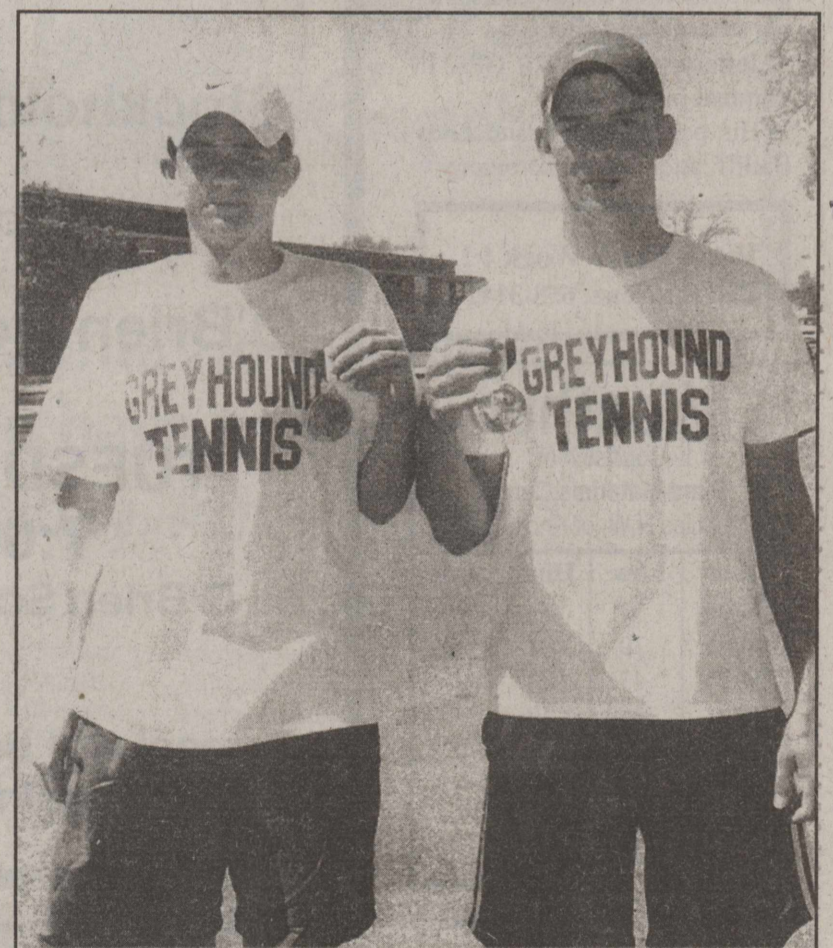
A special Round Up day for recruitment will be held at the Knox City Child Development Center on May 10, from 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

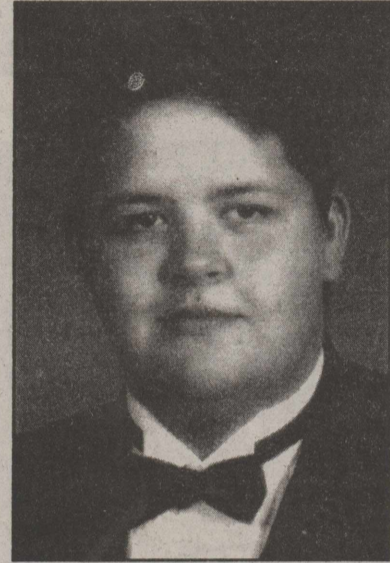

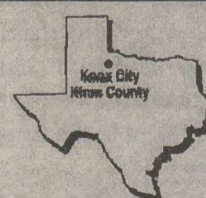



Veterans News Notes

Questions and Answers...

Q: VA recently said it would give benefits to the children of Vietnam veterans with leukemia. What kind of benefits? How do I apply?

A: The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is in the early stages of putting together a package of benefits for victims of a rare form of leukemia whose parents served in Vietnam. No one knows what those benefits will be. It will take several months before veterans can begin applying for the new benefits. But two things are clear: First, the parent must have been physically present in Vietnam during the war. Second, the child must have a certain kind of leukemia, acute myelogenous leukemia (AML). This is not the most common form of leukemia. The Institute of Medicine reported April 19 it has evidence that AML is more common in the families of Vietnam veterans than among their peers who served elsewhere during the war years. Researchers believe the disease in children was caused by a parent's exposure to Agent Orange and other toxins in the combat zone.

Q: I got a "certificate of eligibility" from VA to buy a home using my GI Bill benefits. Then the deal fell through. Do I have to get another certificate when I try to buy another home? Is there an expiration date?

A: The "certificate of eligibility" is the form that VA provides to show a veteran is eligible for the home loan benefit. Veterans can obtain the application for a certificate and information about where to send it by calling the VA at 1-800-827-1000. Generally, the certificates are valid until used. However, a certificate issued to a person while on active duty is only valid while the person remains on active duty. For persons qualifying based on service in the reserves or National Guard, eligibility expires Sept. 30, 2007.

Q: Does VA still sponsor the Golden Age Games for senior athletes?

A: Absolutely. The games will be held outside Dallas in Duncanville, Texas, June 10-15. The games are open to all veterans 55 or older, who are currently receiving care at a VA medical facility. Jointly sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars, the games allow participants to compete in swimming, bicycling, horseshoes, bowling and much more. For information, contact your local VA medical facility.

A letter of interest to Vietnam Veterans...

Dear Mr. Gillispie, I am a graduate student at UT Southwestern Medical Center of Dallas, who is doing a research project in conjunction with the VA Medical Center of Dallas. The study examines the effect of chronic PTSD on interpersonal relationships. I was given our name as a veteran's service officer by the Texas Veterans Commission. I am contacting you in hopes that you will be able to help me with this project. I am in need of male Vietnam theater veterans to participate in this study, that is men who were in Vietnam, or its surrounding waters or air space between 1965-1975. I need veterans who have NOT been diagnosed with PTSD, as well as, some who have been diagnosed with PTSD. The study involves filling out 5 questionnaires which have a multiple choice format. The questionnaires usually take approximately 45 minutes to one hour to complete. All results are kept confidential and any publication of results will be done as group findings. The veterans name or individual results WILL NOT be published, the veterans can remain anonymous if they choose not to request results by following certain procedures. Or if they choose, they can receive group and/or their individual results. Since we are still collecting data it will be 6 months or more before study results are available. There is no cost to the participants all the necessary postage comes with the packets, all they need to do is complete the questionnaires and drop them in the mail. Unfortunately, there is no monetary compensation for participating in this study but it does provide them an opportunity to help their fellow veterans. The results of the study will hopefully prove useful to counselors who are working with veterans and others with chronic PTSD.

I am hoping you can put me in contact with or suggest a means for me to contact Vietnam veterans in your service area. In the past, I have contacted eligible veterans through using membership lists, attending organizational meeting and social functions. When I use group membership list, I mail a letter which explains the study and includes a postcard (similar to the one enclosed for your response to this letter) on which the veteran indicates his willingness to participate. If he indicates an interest in the study, I contact him with more details and provide him with a packet of questionnaires. If he is not interested he is not contacted further. I would greatly appreciate any help you could provide or suggestions you might have for other resources or veterans groups. I am willing to attend organizational meetings or whatever is necessary to contact these fellows. Knowing how busy everyone is, I have enclosed a postcard in an attempt to make your response easier. Thank you for any help you can provide. Please feel free to write me at the address above or call 214 590-8211 or 817-467-5473 for more information or answers to any questions you may have. Thanks again for your time and consideration.

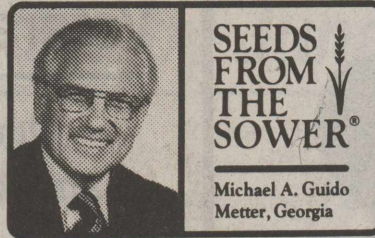

Don't be content with just being stuffed. Become a real Christian. How? By receiving the Lord. The Bible says, "He that has the Son has life." Receive Him, won't you?

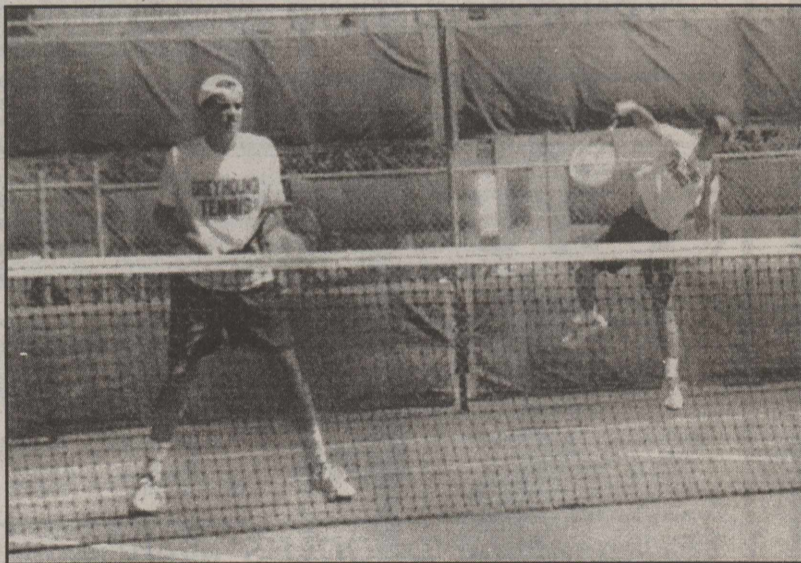
Knox Co. Aging Center to hold fundraiser Sunday, May 13
