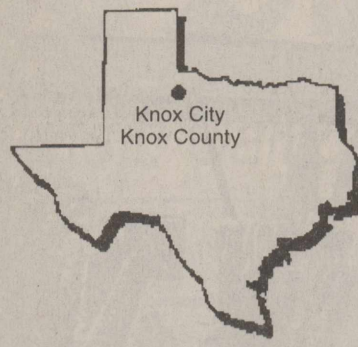

'Hounds wound Wildcats

Friday's 42-14 win over Crowell puts Knox City at three wins, no losses for District, 7-1 for season

Last Friday night's big win 42-14 over the Wildcats at Crowell elevated the Knox City Greyhounds to an overall 7-1 record for the season, while remaining undefeated in district action.

The Greyhounds totaled an impressive 608 yards of total offense with 442 yards on the ground on 51 carries, and another 166 yards through the air with 11 attempted passes, and 8 completions with no interceptions. Leading the Greyhound rushing game was senior Gemile Roberson, finally back at full strength after nursing an ankle injury for most of the season. Gemile rushed for a total of 135 yards on just 11 carries, including 2 touchdown runs of 38 yards and 5 yards.

Adding to the impressive ground yardage, senior Scooter Thompson ran for 66 yards on 9 attempts and one touchdown, junior Carlos Ruiz ran for 54 yards on 5 carries, senior Sedrick Roberson picked up 52 yards on 6 carries, freshman Quentin Spells ran for 52 yards on 7 carries, senior Dominique Collier ran for 52 yards on 8 carries and 2 touchdowns, freshman Derrick Magana carried the ball 2 times for 22 yards, sophomore Riley Spells picked up 11 yards on 1 carry, freshman Ben Simmons ran the ball one time for 1 yard, and senior Kendrick Green ran the ball 1 time for -3 yards. Knox City scored the first 42 points of the game, while picking up 24 first downs, compared to just 5 for Crowell.

Quarterback Sedrick Roberson passed the ball 10 times with 7 completions for 159 yards. One 15 yard pass to senior Kendrick Green added another touchdown. Backup quarterback Carlos Ruiz passed the ball one time for a 7 yard gain.

Knox City scored first in the first quarter after Dominique Collier broke several tackles to take the ball in from 3 yards out. He also added the extra point kick. In the second quarter, Scooter Thompson put the ball across the goal line from 4 yards out. Collier added another extra point kick for a 14-0 lead. Also in the second quarter, Kendrick Green scored after a 15 yard pass reception from quarterback Sedrick Roberson. Collier added the extra point for the 21-0 showing on the scoreboard. Just before the halftime, Gemile Roberson scored after a stunning 38 yard run right through most of Crowell's defenders. Collier added the extra point to make the halftime lead 28-0.

In the third quarter, Dominique Collier added yet another 7 points with a 1 yard run and the extra point kick. Gemile Roberson also scored again in the third quarter with a 5 yard run, followed by another extra point kick by Collier.

With just over 9 minutes left in the third quarter, Knox City's head coach Wayne Hutchinson substituted the junior varsity players into the game to allow them valuable experience at the varsity level. Crowell scored with a 45 yard run by Kenneth Benton, and the extra point kick was good. The Wildcat varsity scored once again in the fourth quarter when Cory Ford ran a fumble recovery in for 5 yards and 6 points. The extra point kick was good, and the score of 42-14 lasted until the end of the game.

The Knox City JV team moved the ball all way down the field late in the fourth quarter and appeared ready to score when the clock ran out. When the JV team was on the field, Carlos Ruiz picked up 54 yards on 5 carries, Quentin Spells had 52 yards on 7 carries, Derrick Magana had 22 yards on 2 carries and Ben Simmons picked up 1 yard on 1 carry. Quarterback Carlos Ruiz also completed 1 pass to Cameron Hutchinson for 7 yards.

'Hound defensive unit holds the Wildcats to a total of 177 yards offense in hard hitting game

Known for their tough brand of hard hitting football action, the KCHS Greyhound defensive unit appeared to Stun the Wildcat offense last Friday night at Crowell, holding CHS to just 177 yards of offense throughout the game, compared to Knox City's 608 yards on offense.

Playing just two and a half quarters before the KCHS Junior Varsity unit took the field, the Varsity Greyhound defense held Crowell to under a hundred yards rushing and scoreless throughout the first half. The Knox City Junior Varsity took over with just over 9 minutes left in the third quarter and also did a remarkable job of holding the much larger Crowell Varsity offense to under a hundred yards in the second half, despite a touchdown late in the third quarter and one in the fourth quarter by the Wildcats.

Leading the Greyhounds in tackles were senior Gemile Roberson with 7 and 2 for a loss, along with sophomore C.J. Bruce, who also had 7 tackles. Senior Scooter Thompson had 6 tackles with 2 hurried passes and 1 recovered fumble; senior Caleb Carver had 6 tackles and 1 hurried pass; freshman Cameron Hutchinson had 6 tackles; senior Sedrick Roberson had 5 tackles, with 1 sack and 2 hurried passes; senior Dominique Collier had 5 tackles, with 2 for a loss; senior Wes Parker had 5 tackles with 1 pass breakup; senior Logan Morrow had 4 tackles with 1 pass breakup and 1 sack; juniors Carlos Ruiz, Rickey Gonzales, freshmen Tomas Myers, and Ty Chisum each had 3 tackles; seniors Kendrick Green and Josh Ivie each had 2 tackles, as did sophomores Drew Barnard and Ben Simmons.

Freshman Quentin Spells had 1 tackle that was also a pass breakup. Freshman Derrick Magana, freshman Kylin DelValle, sophomore Cody Sanders, senior Sean Duncan, freshman L.B. Thompson, freshman T.J. Richardson, junior Brandon Espinosa, and sophomore Ricky Dale Smith each had 1 touchdown.

In addition to slowing down Crowell's ground attack, the Greyhound defense only allowed Wildcat quarterback Brady Cerda the opportunity to complete one of five passes with no yards gained. The 'Hounds also held the Wildcat offense to just 5 first downs throughout the game.

Once again, the yellow flags stalled the Greyhounds on occasion, with Knox City picking up 10 penalties for 90 yards, compared to Crowell's 5 yellow flags for only 35 yards.

Greyhounds to host the Rotan Yellowhammers this Friday night, kickoff set for 7:30 p.m.

The Knox City Greyhounds, 3-0 in district play, will host the Yellowhammers from Rotan here at Greyhound Stadium this Friday night. The kickoff for this district football game is set for 7:30 p.m.

All Greyhound fans are encouraged to come to the game and wear blue to support your Knox City Greyhounds, whose theme this year is "back in blue - with attitude".

Knox City enters the game with one loss for the season and no losses in district. Rotan has 2 wins and 6 losses this season, and has lost all 3 district games. Last week, they were defeated 42-12 by Hamlin, who Knox City defeated 15-13 in 3 overtimes to begin district action.

Dr. David Chase Eiland Jr.

Dr. David Chase Eiland Jr., a physician, teacher, beloved husband and father was born in Munday, Texas, on February 24, 1936, to Dr. David and Ned Harbin Eiland.

Dr. Eiland died on October 24, 2002, in Granbury, Texas. He graduated high school at age 16 and entered The University of Texas graduating in 1956. He completed his medical education at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School and internship at University Hospital in Little Rock, Arkansas.

After his untimely death, he returned to Munday and took over his father's practice. He continued his education and received his degree in Psychiatry from the University of Texas Medical Branch, Galveston in July 1969. He joined the faculty of UTMB after graduation and rose to the position of Dean of Students and Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs. Dr. Eiland was devoted to medical education and was extremely proud of physicians whose training he supervised. Dr. Eiland was an outstanding educator and the recipient of many honors during his career. During rehabilitation following serious illnesses, he nurtured his religious faith which he shared with others.

Dr. Eiland is survived by his wife, Dr. Karen Collins-Eiland of Granbury; a daughter, Dianna of Alexandria, Virginia; and sons, Dave Chase and James of Austin.

Services were held Monday, October 28, 2002, at 11:00 a.m. at Martin's Funeral Home Chapel with graveside services at 1:00 p.m., Tuesday, October 29, at Restland Cemetery in Dallas.

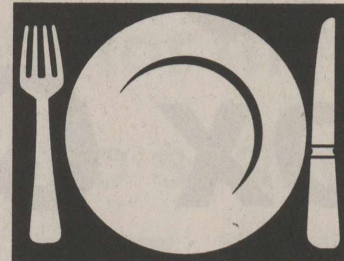

With scary ghouls and goblins on the way, the Texas Department of Public Safety is reminding Texans to be safe and responsible this coming Halloween.

"Halloween is a fun time for both children and adults, but oftentimes people act of drive carelessly or are not aware of their surroundings," Col. Thomas A. Davis Jr., director of the DPS, said.

On Halloween of 2000, there were 546 injuries and 11 fatalities in Texas. Motorists are urged to drive slowly in neighborhoods and to be on the lookout for trick-or-treaters.

Safety tips for pedestrians include:

- Look both ways before crossing roadways. Always walk, don't run.

- Cross the roadway at intersections and crosswalks when possible.

- Avoid toy guns and knives -- they could be mistaken for the real thing.

- Wear costumes that are light in color, and short enough to avoid tripping.

- Reflective material of some kind on the costume is strongly encouraged.

- Avoid masks - use face paint instead or better visibility and peripheral vision.

- Travel in groups with adult supervision.

- Do not enter the cars and homes of strangers. Avoid homes without visible porch lights.

- Carry a flashlight and make sure an adult accompanies small children. Exercise caution when crossing streets.

- Never trick-or-treat in unfamiliar areas.

- Take all treats home for an adult to inspect before eating anything. Never eat unwrapped candy.
