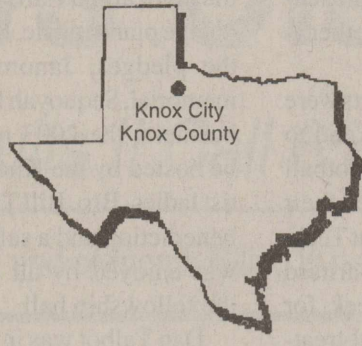

The District 9A Champion Knox City Greyhounds will travel to Memorial Stadium in Wichita Falls this Friday night to take on the Windthorst Trojans for the Area Championship title and trophy.

Coming off a bye week in the Bi-District round of the class 1A playoffs, the 'Hounds appear to be well rested and focused after defeating Munday the Friday before last to claim the district title.

The game on Friday night is set to begin at 7:30 p.m.. Knox City will be the home team at Memorial Stadium, with fans sitting on the west side of the stadium under the pressbox. Ticket prices have been established at \$5.00 for adults and \$3.00 for students, and the stadium will open for seating at 6:30 p.m.

While Greyhound supporters hope that everyone in Knox City will try to make the game, KVRP

97.1 FM in Haskell will be broadcasting the game for those unable to make the trip to Wichita Falls.

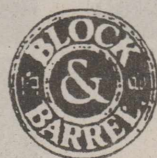

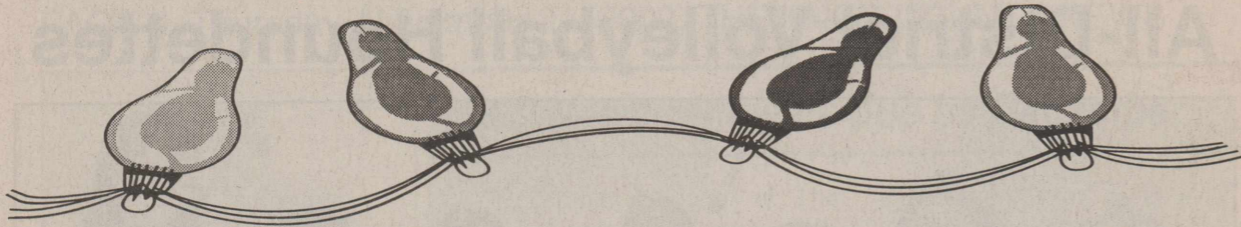

Light Up Knox City!

"It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas . . . in Knox City!" Have you seen the new lights in the downtown block of Knox City? The Fire Department and the Chamber of Commerce worked together to make an idea into a reality. The Board of Directors of the Chamber of Commerce came up with an idea to 'light up Knox City' for the Holiday season. Looking for a way to encourage people to stop and shop in our local community, the idea of dressing up the town was conceived at the August meeting.

Realizing the amount of work that would be involved, the Chamber sought advice and help from the Fire Department. Together, the two volunteer organizations worked to make the idea into the reality you can see now. Meeting first on Saturday morning, November 9, a group of 16 eager and excited volunteers began the task on top of the Chamber of Commerce building.

Within a short time, the group had the lights strung along the east side buildings and began the task of attaching them and connecting the electricity. The strong

winds and concurrent sand storm chase the group back down the ladder around 1 p.m.

The determined group agreed to meet again on Sunday afternoon to complete the project. On Sunday, 15 volunteers once again climbed the ladder and began stringing the lights on the west side buildings.

Encountering some new obstacles, the work began rather slowly. But thanks to the help of some of the local merchants, progress was soon made and the lights were up! The weary group was rewarded with a birds' eye view of the town when the lights came on at 6 o'clock, and a cheer was lifted by both the workers and the spectators. Not willing to quit before the project was completed, the group once again agreed to meet on Tuesday evening to light up City Hall. Ten volunteers met at 5 p.m. in City Hall, with renewed determination and once again climbed the ladder to the rooftop of our local government building. Within a very short time, the lights were all in place, and again the group was rewarded with a skyline view of Knox City dressed in beautiful white lights.

There were opinions expressed

to the Chamber that this project could not be accomplished, that no one would show up to help when the plea went out for volunteers. Our local Fire Department not only provided the equipment to help accomplish this task, but volunteered a combined total of 286 community service hours to this project. This group of men deserves a very hearty "Thank you" from this community for all the hard work that they volunteered. You may also note that this time was donated by all on their days off from their 'real jobs'. Please make the time to express your appreciation to both of these organizations. Both are made up of volunteers and are always looking for new members and sponsors.

The Chamber would also like to recognize PBH, Pumpers Supply, the Supply House, Duckwalls, and The Pizza Place for the extra help on Sunday afternoon. Without your efforts, we could not have completed this project!
