Efforts to abolish child labor in southern cotton mills and put a stop to enslavement of little ones has been given a serious setback in the opinion of the United States supreme court holding the federal law forbidding interstate shipment of the products of child labor void. A majority of the court holds that the control of manufactured articles intended for interstate shipment is wholly within the powers of the various states. "If it were otherwise," the court says, "all manufacture intended for interstate shipment would be brought under federal control to the practical exclusion of the authority of the states, a result certainly not contemplated by the framers of the constitution when they vested in congress the authority to regulate commerce among the states." Grim evidence of the rapid reduction in the "thin gray line" of old Confederate soldiers is told in the report from Austin that the amount of pension for each survivor on the rolls for the current quarter is \$20, the largest amount yet paid in one quarter. The increase is made possible by the many deaths of pensioners that have occurred since the last apportionment of the pension fund. The pension commissioner estimates that fully 500 gallant old soldiers have had "taps" sounded over their last resting place in the last three months and that the increasing death rate will make possible a payment of \$23 to \$25 to each survivor at the end of the next quarter.
