Parade and Citywide Yule Program Booby Trap Skyrocket Blasts Home; Planned For Thursday Afternoon

A community Christmas program complete with parade, Santa and his reindeer and candy for the youngsters is being planned here for 2 o'clock Thursday afternoon, Dec. 22.

Tentative plans for the big Yule program were discussed Monday night at a meeting of Chamber of Commerce and Ministerial Alliance representatives.
