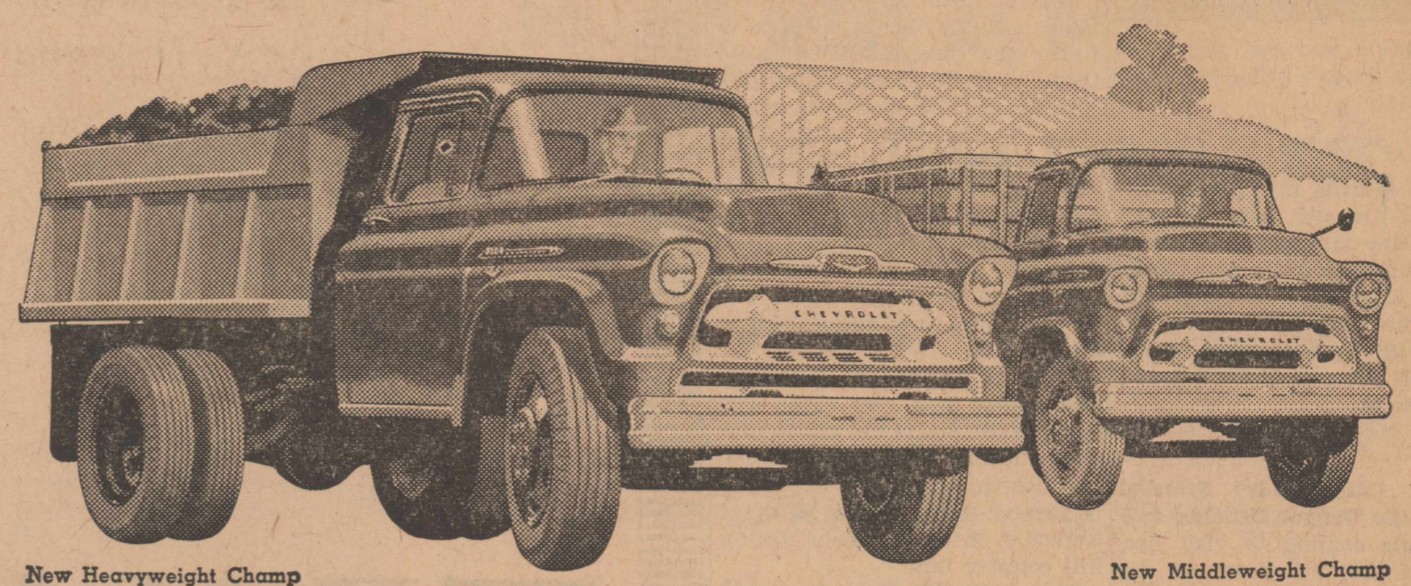
**V. L. Smith Speaks At Breakfast**

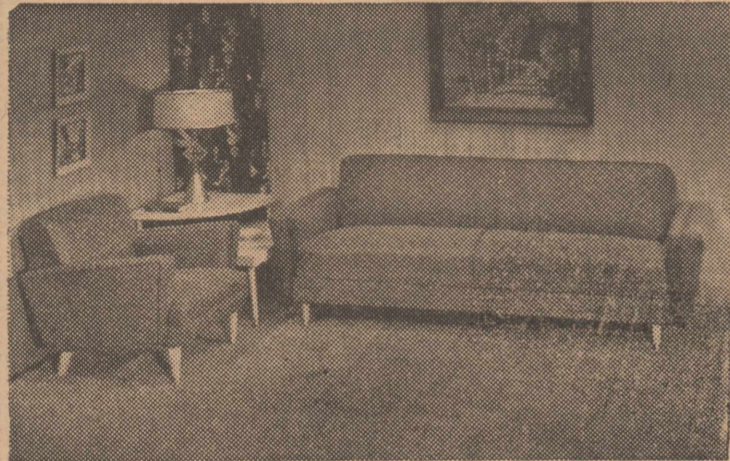

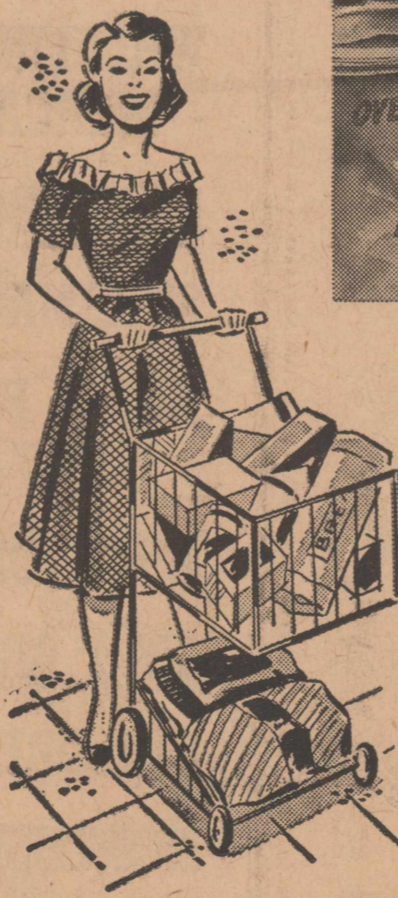

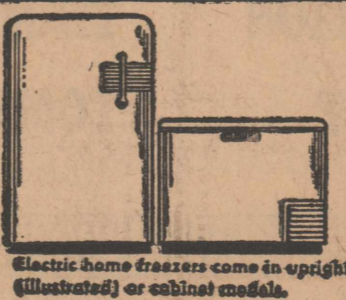
