Mrs. Blackburn **Succumbs Here**

Services honoring the memory of Mrs. Eliza Blackburn, who died Dec. 31, 1957, in Olton Memorial Hospital, were held Wednesday afternoon in First Baptist Church.

Mrs. Blackburn was 86 years of age. She had been in ill health for several years, and had been hospitalized for about three weeks.

Rev. Chester A. Watt, Lovington, NM, officiated at the rites. Mrs. Blackburn was born Oct. 13, 1871, at Nacogdoches. She came to Olton with her husband, George Blackburn, in 1924. He preceded her in death April 22, 1933.

Arrangements were under the direction of Lemons Funeral Home, Plainview, with burial in Olton Cemetery.
