Roby School Board Sets Open House For New Gym, Band Hall

The members of the Roby School Board accepted the recently completed band hall, gymnasium and dressing room complex from the construction management firm at last Monday night's board meeting and

made the final payment on the construction and authorized administrative personnel to proceed with a planned open house of the new facilities.

Roby School Superintendent Jimmie Laurie an-

nounced that the open house of the new facilities would be Monday, April 16th from 1:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. with inter-school demonstration basketball games conducted as well as tours of the new facili-

ties. Boys and girls will each play one game in the new gymnasium, refreshments will be served and tours given parents and interested parties.

The total costs of erecting the new band hall, dressing room facility and gymnasium amounted to approximately \$701,133.00, according to Laurie. Construction costs actually ran \$577,422 while architect fees amounted to \$44,306; construction management fees were \$68,505 and extra bid items were \$10,900.

The board re-organized officers at the Monday meeting with all three officers re-appointed.

Gayle Morgeson will continue to serve as board president; Judy Mauldin was re-elected Vice President and June Wright was re-named board secretary.

Roby School Board members hired Tim Smith, a native of Ralls High School and graduate student at Texas Tech as the new band director replacing Steve Ratliff who resigned in February.

Hospital Board To Study Expansion And Remodeling

The members of the Fisher County Hospital Board will meet next Monday, April 16th for their regular monthly meeting and at that time will conduct board election for the re-organization of the officers of the board, according to

Gary McGee, Fisher County Hospital Administrator. Other items expected to come before the board include the energy conservation survey conducted by Burr Engineering of Austin; a discussion of the expansion of the Fisher County Hospital and a discussion on enclosing the nursing station.

According to McGee, the board will discuss a hospital expansion program but will probably not act on anything at the April

meeting. He indicated that there were only 3 days during the recent high-census period when a few additional beds could have been used at the hospital for patients.

With respect to the enclosing of the nurses station, McGee said board members would discuss this matter and possibly vote on enclosing the nurses station with a partial glass partition and a half-door in order to make the area more private.

Rotan School Board OK's Concession Stand Bid

The members of the Rotan Independent School District board of trustees met last Monday night and accepted two teacher resignations, re-aligned the officers of the board and acted to initiate bids on the construction of a football field concession stand and renovation at the elementary building.

Board members accepted the resignation of Dickie Lepard, high school social studies teacher and head boys basketball coach and Mrs. Fred Hawkins, junior high special education teacher.

In the area of board re-alignment, Leo Long was re-elected to the position of Rotan School Board president; other officers include: Pete Fowler, Vice President; Roger Blackwelder, Secretary and Larry Landes, Assistant Secretary.

Board members voted to advertise for bids on (1) a metal building to house the concession stand at the football field (2) a concrete slab for an addition to the football field house and (3) renovation to the elementary school floors.

Board members are in

hopes of receiving a bid on the concession stand in the area of \$17,000 to \$20,000, according to Leo Long, Board President. The concession stand project will also include rest rooms and a laundry/storage area. Board members, at last Monday's meeting discussed the project and if bids are "in-line" will construct the concession stand at the north end of the field in the area of the dirt road that runs north of the scoreboard area.

Board members are in hopes of expanding the field house by adding a

room of the south side of the building to be used as another dressing room.

The final bid to be accepted will be on renovating the floor at the elementary building. This project is anticipated to cost between \$9,000 and \$12,000.

Board members approved associating with Region 14, Education Service Center for the 1984-85 year. Cost is \$3.00 per ADA student.

Rotan School Board members reviewed the honor point system and agreed to continue with the present policy.

There were a total of 192 write-in votes for candidates to fill a position on the Rotan City Council in last Saturday's election.

Candidate Hooper Shelton, an announced candidate, received a total of 304 votes, second in balloting was Gary Dickson with a total of 250 votes and third went to Charles Atwell, write-in candidate with 114 votes.

There were a total of 346 votes cast in the election.

619 Hospital Ballots Cast

A total of 619 ballots were cast in last Saturday's Fisher County Hospital Board election that returned three incumbents to three posts on the board, according to Gary McGee, Fisher County Hospital Administrator. Board members Raford

Hargrove polled 548 votes, Dave Williams captured 545 votes and Frank Mitchell received 539 votes in the election.

The board will meet on Monday, April 16th to elect officers for the new board and swear in new members.

FILING TIPS FOR THE FRANTIC

The deadline for filing your 1983 Federal Income Tax Return is just around the corner. The deadline this year is April 16th since the 15th falls on a Sunday. As you prepare to meet this year's deadline, consider these options and suggestions:

1. If at all possible you should meet the filing deadline on April 16th. The penalty for filing your return late is presently 5% of any additional tax due per month up to a maximum of 25%.
2. If you file your return near to or on April 16th, send your return certified mail, return receipt requested. This will clearly substantiate a timely filing of your return, thus avoiding late filing penalties.
3. Get an automatic four-month extension (by filing FORM 4868) if you cannot meet the deadline. You must also include a payment for an estimate of the tax you will ultimately owe with the extension. Additionally, if 90% of the total tax you ultimately owe is not paid with the extension, a penalty of 1/2 of 1% per month will be charged. The penalty is in addition to the normal interest charged on the unpaid balance which is currently running at 11% compounded daily.
4. The filing of the automatic extension also extends the deadline for making an IRA contribution for 1983 until August 15th.
5. If you are filing your return or getting an extension and you are also making your first estimated tax payment for 1984, be sure to send two separate checks with your correct social security number on the face of each check. If you are unsure about the proper handling of your tax matters as the filing deadline approaches, consult your tax advisor for the options available to you.

Rotan Boys Track Team Finishes Fifth At Aspermont Meet

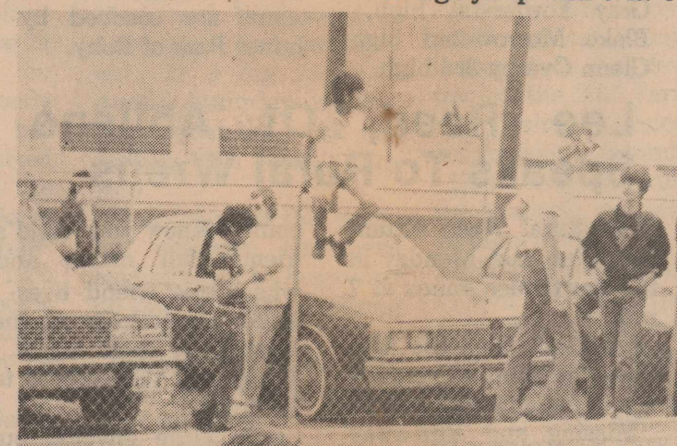



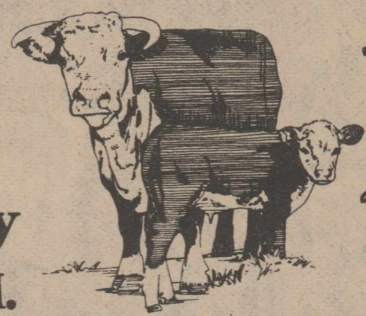

Shelly Hayes broke her record, set the previous week, with a toss of 127 feet 2 inches in the discus competition.

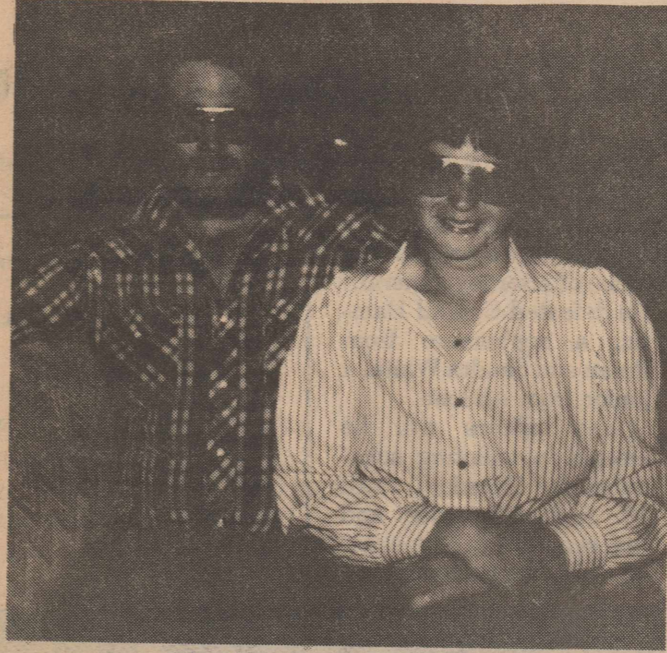
The relay team of Barbara Williams, Mary Williams, Cheryl Reese and Cathy Conner set a new sprint school record with a

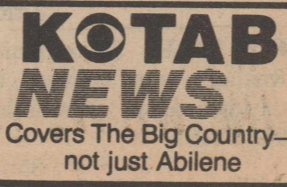

Federal Land Bank Association Holds Annual Meeting In Austin

The Federal Land Bank Association of Roby which serves Fisher, Nolan, and Taylor counties is one of 49 associations across the State sharing \$5.2 million with their borrowers.

This action is a result of a "grass root" movement among the directors of the Federal Land Bank Associations in Texas. Recognizing the adverse times which agricultural producers are experiencing, the official delegates at the Federal Land Bank of Texas' annual stockholders meeting in Austin, Texas last week approved the use of some \$5.2 million that would normally have been paid to the associations by the Bank to forego an interest rate increase on the Bank's variable rate loans.

Since the Federal Land Bank in Austin is the prime lender, the only way it has to increase its earn-

ings is through an increase in the variable interest rate plan. The Federal Land Bank had planned an increase in its rate on March 1, 1984, to offset a projected loss for 1984; however, association directors of the locally owned and managed Federal Land Bank Associations across the state recognizing their excellent financial strength developed through good management practices and sound loan policies over the years, voted unanimously to forego some \$5.2 million in income which would normally be paid to the associations by the Federal Land Bank for making and servicing loans. By voting to forego this income, the Federal Land Bank will not increase the variable interest rate to all of its variable rate borrowers at this time.

This action is an example of the Land Bank System's continued policy to maintain strong and viable

operations which enables it to be a reliable and low cost source of credit during both good and adverse

times. The Federal Land Bank has \$2.420 billion in vari-

able loans outstanding to some 31,000 farmers, ranchers, and rural residence borrowers.

Provisions of the Texas Property Tax Code permit a one-time initial application for residence homestead exemptions rather than requiring annual application as in previous years.

However, taxpayers who have never received a residence homestead exemption on the homes in which they were residing on January 1, and those who became 65 years old or disabled during 1983, must make the one-time application this year in order to receive exemptions for 1984.

In order for a property to qualify as a homestead, it must meet four tests.

- It must be owned by the person or persons claiming the exemption
- It must be designed or adapted for human residence
- It must actually be used as a residence
- It must be occupied as the principal residence of an owner who qualifies for the exemption.

DISABLED VETERANS who have not received an exemption previously, an application must be filed before May 1 with the Appraisal Office in order to receive the exemption for this tax year. However, persons who were granted the exemption in 1983, do not need to reapply in 1984.

Those listed to qualify for the exemption are:

- a disabled veteran
- a surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as long as the spouse remains unmarried
- a surviving minor child of a deceased disabled veteran, if the veteran's spouse does not survive the veteran and if the child is both under 18 and unmarried
- a surviving spouse of a person who was killed while on active duty, whether the spouse is remarried or not at the time of the application
- a surviving minor child of a person who was killed while on active duty, if the child is both under 18 and unmarried

AGRICULTURAL VALUES

All persons who wish to have their property taxes based on open space value and did not sign an application in 1983 (italics) must file proper application this year with the Appraisal District.

Persons who signed for valuation of their property under the open space application in 1983 do not need to sign up again. Any person who has purchased land from another person in 1983 file an application as the new owner for 1983.

RENDITIONS

All persons whose property lies within the Fisher County Appraisal District whether it be real property or personal property shall render such property for taxation between Jan. 1 and May 1 of this year.

Renditions and applications must be made on forms provided by the Appraisal District of Fisher County office. Rendition forms are available in the Appraisal District office of Fisher County which is located at the Fisher County Courthouse, Rooms 113,114,115, Roby, Texas.

The Appraisal District will mail the necessary forms upon request.

13th Congressional District Hearing Set

Congressman Jack Hightower announced that two days of hearings will be held in the 13th Congressional District to give the public an opportunity to comment on the development of the 1985 Farm Bill now being planned by congressional committees.

Hightower, who will chair the hearings, has scheduled them for Monday, April 23, at 2:00 p.m. in Amarillo, and Tuesday, April 24, at 10:00 a.m. in Vernon. Both meetings will be held at the Texas A&M University Research and Extension Center in those communities. Farmers, ranchers, agribusiness, and all other interested representatives of farm concerns are invited to attend and testify, as is the general public.

"I want to give food producers and others in our part of Texas a chance to tell Washington exactly what they believe should be done to make our farm programs work better," Hightower said. "I will be taking the actual transcripts of everyone's testimony back to the full House Agriculture Committee, and it will become part of the record for the committee members to review as they develop the 1985 Farm Bill."

"It's very difficult if not impossible for most people to take time to go to Washington, so I thought we should try another

approach," Hightower said. "It's essential that we start early this year to establish more effective, long-term solutions to the problems we now face in our farm communities, as well as future problems that we can see down the road. It's also essential that the policy makers in Washington hear directly

from the people who know the most about the problem," Hightower said.

Individuals interested in testifying should provide a written copy of their testimony if possible. An official stenographer will also record all testimony for eventual presentation to the House Agriculture committee by Hightower.

Those wishing to testify should contact the nearest Hightower district office in Amarillo, Vernon or Wichita Falls. The number of people wishing to speak will be limited by the time available. Comments should be limited to no longer than ten minutes per person as much as possible.

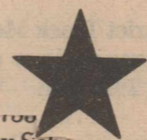

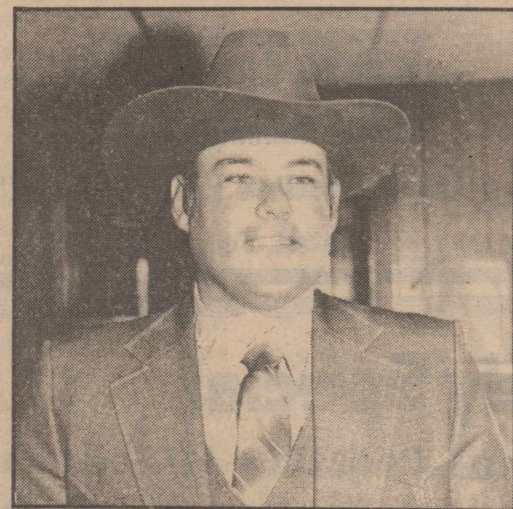
