Texas recently voted to allow it to expand by \$300 million to a total funding of \$1.25 billion. That's a sizeable leap from the \$25 million it started out with 35 years ago.

But all this good work would have gone down the tubes recently if a tax bill before the Senate had been approved as written.

The tax bill contained a provision denying tax exemption to bonds issued to fund consumer loans. This was intended to prevent bond programs for such loans, but it would also have effectively shut down the Texas Veterans Land Program.

The provision already included several exceptions, including student loan bonds and qualified mortgage bonds for veterans.

they are appropriate. There is plenty of input and discussion by consumer groups, state and federal agencies, and the PUC staff before any rate changes are made," he said.

As for choosing which service might be the best for a particular customer, Harris emphasized that each customer will make his or her own choice.

"Some customers use the telephone a great deal. Other customers do not make many local calls," he pointed out. "Those who use the phone extensively probably would want to stay with flat rate service. But those customers who don't make many calls might well find measured service to their advantage. Some customers might even want to consider changing calling habits in order to take advantage of potential savings," he said.

Harris noted that the Lifeline plan proposed by the company has been widely lauded. "Customers we've talked to see Lifeline as a positive effort to assure continued telephone service for persons who might not be able to afford service any other way. But Lifeline addresses only part of the need for optional pricing plans. Many customers want, and could benefit from, local measured service as well."

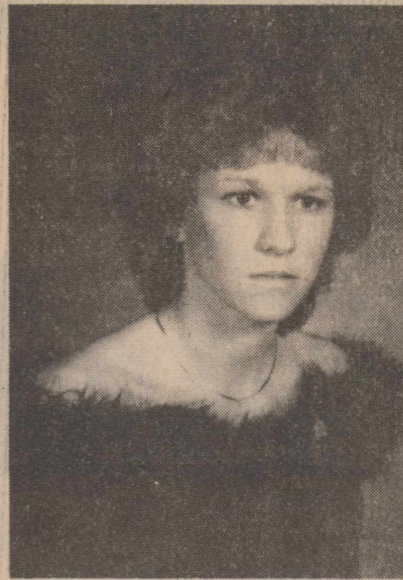

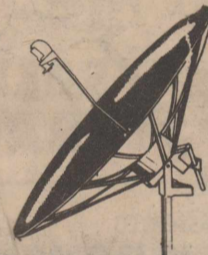
