Showmanship awards will again be sponsored by the Fisher County Young Farmers.

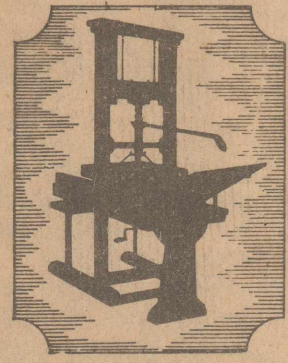

The Rotan Junior Livestock Show was conducted last Saturday with a total of 48 animals entered in the annual event. There were 8 lambs, 17 steers and 23 head of swine.

The lambs were shown in two divisions-medium wool and fine wool cross. In the Medium wool division Stephanie Hunsaker took first; Amber Martin, second; Christie Parr, third and Julie Parr, fourth. In the Fine Wool Cross division-Melissa Burk, first; Melissa Burk, second; Stephanie Hunsaker, third and Janet Martin, fourth. The grand champion lamb went to Stephanie Hunsaker with her

146 pound first place medium wool. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Morrow Hunsaker. Reserve Champion went to Melissa Burk with her 122 pound fine wool cross. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Vic Burk.

In the steer division, exhibitors showed their animals in four classes. Light, light medium, medium and heavy. In the light weight division-Brad Long took first and third place honors, Mark Hargrove was second and Monte McKinney was fourth.

In the light medium weight division-Rocky Roberts, 1st; Mark Hargrove,

2nd; Evette Gruben, 3rd; George Reyes, 4th and Rob Fryar, 5th.

Rocky Roberts had the first place medium weight; Evette Gruben 2nd; Blake Morrow, 3rd and Lane Landes, 4th.

In the heavy weight division Evette Gruben was 1st; Rocky Roberts 2nd Rob Fryar, 3rd and Blake Morrow, 4th. The Grand Champion went to Evette Gruben with her 1310 pound first place heavy weight steer. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Wilber Gruben. The reserve champion steer went to Rocky Roberts with his 1175 first place medium weight

steer. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Harold Roberts.

A total of 10 animals were entered in the gilt division. There were three classes, light weight 3; medium weight 3 and heavy weight 4. Randall Clawson took first in the light weight class. Second went to Missy McKimney and third to Mandy McKimney.

In the Medium weight class, Michael Hull was first; Lonnie Foster, second and Traci Hull, third.

Steve Dickson took first in the heavy weight class; Billy Wayne Speck was second, Shanna Speck, third and Phillip Matthies, fourth. The Grand Champion gilt was owned by Steve Dickson, son of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Dickson, while the Reserve Champion went to Billy Wayne Speck, son of Mr. and Mrs. Billy Speck.

In the barrow division a total of 13 animals were entered. The three classes were-light weight, 4; medium weight 5 and heavy weight 4. In the light weight class of barrows Mitch Whitefield was first; and second; Glen Overby was third and Mandy McKimney, 4th.

In the Medium weight class-Steve Dickson was first; Jan Posey, second; Lance Ragan, third; David Carreon, fourth and John Frank Soliz, fifth.

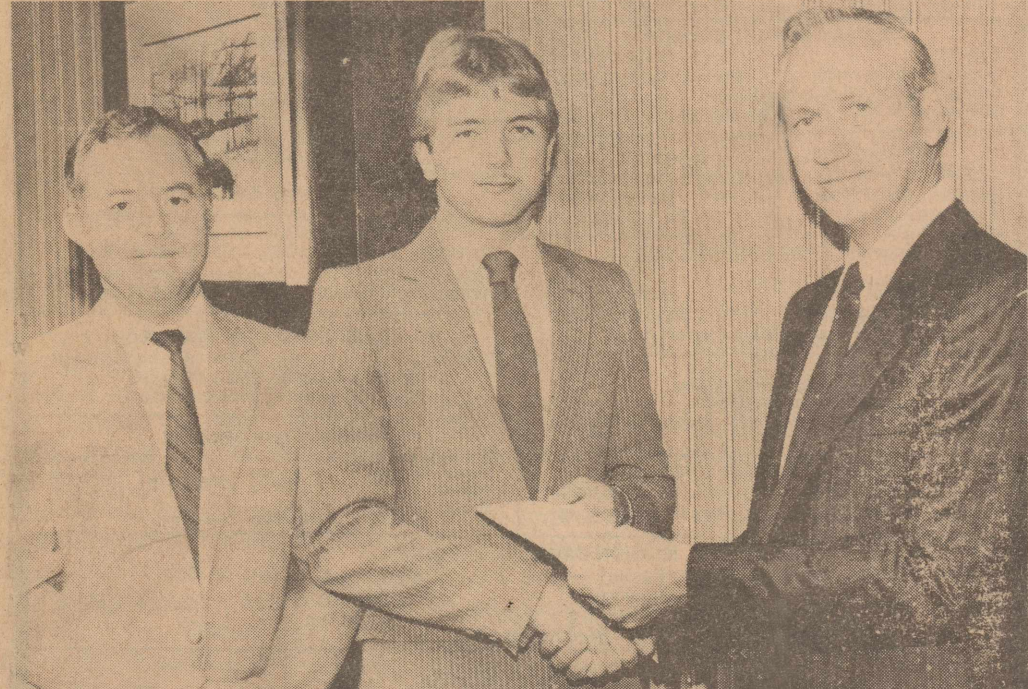

Tax Planning

IS TAX PLANNING POSSIBLE?

With President Reagan and the Congress struggling to keep tax reform alive, taxpayers have the increasingly difficult task of trying to make financial decisions without knowing what the rules are going to be.

The latest plan is the tax bill recently passed by the House. Some of the main provisions of the bill include:

- Changing individual tax rates from the current 14 rates running from 11% to 50% to four rates, 15%, 25%, 35%, and 38%.
- Increasing the current personal exemption of \$1,080 to \$1,500 for itemizers and \$2,000 for non-itemizers.
- Retaining the current deductibility of state and local taxes
- Excluding 42% of capital gains and taxing the remaining portion at a top rate of 22%. Currently 60% of gains are excluded; top rate is 20%.
- Decreasing corporate tax rates from the current 46% top rate to 36%.
- Repealing the current investment tax credit and spreading depreciation deductions over a longer period, but indexing the depreciation system for inflation.
- Repealing income averaging and the married couple, two-earner deduction.
- Leaving a 25% individual and corporate minimum tax.

Most of the provisions would take effect January 1, 1986, except for the tax rate cuts which would be put off until July 1, 1986.

The Senate is expected to make significant changes in the House Bill to bring it more in line with Reagan's initial tax proposal. What the final bill will include or whether there will actually be a tax overhaul bill in 1986—remains very unclear. We can only repeat what we've been saying all along: where major financial decisions are concerned, stay in touch with your tax advisor.
