## New Head Basketball Coach Hired By Rotan School Board

The members of the Rotan School Board officially hired a boys head basketball coach last Monday night, according to Superintendent Alton Fields.

Bruce Merrel, a coach with 10 years experience, was hired. He has been at Dalhart for the past 8 years. Prior to that he was head boys basketball coach at Memphis.

He and his wife, Vicky have three daughters: Monica Lee, age 7, in the third grade; Stephanie in the first grade and Jennifer, 6 months old.

In the Superintendent's report to board members last Monday, Fields reviewed (1) future board member training to com-

ply with the state mandated requirement of 20 hours. (2) the possibility of establishing a vocational class for the 8th grade. (3) reviewed the insurance settlement on the school complex roofs and damages. (4) informed the board that the Junior High cheerleading corp will be comprised of 5th graders and (6) reviewed with board members the bid submitted by Grimmitt Brothers concerning the moving of dirt at the proposed new track field site.

The board authorized the purchase of a school water well. The well is expected to be east of the junior high school or east of the cafeteria and will cost approximately \$2,000.

Fields reviewed the results of the TEAMS testing with board members. This will be printed comparing Rotan results with averages for Region 14 and the state in a later issue of the newspaper.

The board adopted a job description for counselors, custodians, librarians, aides, and teacher-coaches.

The board reviewed and identified 11 changes that will be implemented concerning board policy changes. These are scheduled to be passed in the July meeting.

Rotan school board members reviewed the Rotan Student Handbook. Reviews are underway at the

current time and the book is expected to be submitted to be printed after the July board meeting.

In final action, the board was informed by Superintendent Alton Fields of the retirement of Betty Strayhorn.

### Roby Church Of Christ Bible School

The Roby Church of Christ Vacation Bible School will start Monday, June 23rd and go through Friday, June 27th. Hours are 9-11 each morning.

There will be Bible classes for 3 years of age through 7th grade.

The theme this year is "Walking With Jesus". Everyone is invited to attend.

### F.C. Hospital Board Fails To Reach Quorum

The members of the Fisher County Hospital Board failed to draw a quorum to their regular monthly meeting last Monday night, according to Fisher County Hospital Administrator Gary McGee.

"In all probability, the June meeting will not be rescheduled", said McGee. The board only had routine matters planned for June's meeting, so pending approval of Glen Copeland, Board President, the June and July meetings will be combined.

The Fisher County Hospital will soon be implementing a new electronic claims billing process, according to Administrator Gary McGee.

The new billing system will greatly reduce the turn-around time the local hospital is currently having to wait for insurance claim monies to be returned on Medicare claims.

The local hospital is currently having to wait between two months and two and a half months for claim monies to be returned. This new system will cut that time down to 12 to 15 days, according to McGee.

"It will greatly improve our cash flow", said McGee.

The new system will be compatible with their present computer system and

the installation of software is expected to take place at the end of next week. McGee said he hopes to be using the new automated billing system by the end of July.

### F.C. Ministerial Alliance Census To Be Completed

The Fisher County Ministerial Alliance religious census will be completed on Sunday, June 22nd, at 2:00 p.m.

Some of the previously assigned census assistants were unable to participate in the first census gathering on May 18th causing

several Rotan streets to be uncounted.

The streets in question are Burnside, Lakeview, 3rd street and 5th street.

The census is extremely important in helping Fisher County churches meet the needs of Fisher County

individuals.

### Kathy Spencer Honored At State 4-H Roundup

Two 4-H Leaders from the Rolling Plains area were among 28 in the state honored at the 1986 Texas 4-H Roundup at Texas A&M University June 11.

Kathy Spencer of Roby and Evelyn Sursa of Guthrie were recognized as the top adult volunteer leaders in the Rolling Plains District of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, The Texas A&M University System. The Extension Service is the parent organization of 4-H.

Each of the leaders was presented the Texas 4-H Salute of Excellence Award provided by the Texas 4-H Youth Development Foundation, the service organization of 4-H, through a grant from the Texas Farm Bureau Insurance Co. of Waco and the Raymond Dickson Foundation of Hallettsville.

Spencer is a veteran 4-H leader of 12 years, serving the Roby Junior High 4-H Club, the Rotan Junior High 4-H Club and the Fisher County Junior Leader 4-H Club. She was responsible for organizing a youth teen center for Fisher County and for establishing a center council of 4-H members and adult leaders. The center now has more than 100 members. She also was

instrumental in setting up a 4-H exchange program in 1983.

Spencer has provided leadership for training programs in method demonstrations and record-books and has co-ordinated the share-the-fun project. She serves on the 4-H and Youth Subcommittee of the Fisher County Program Building Committee, is an officer in the Roby Athletic Club, and is a volunteer at the county nursing home.

Sursa, who serves as county clerk for King County, has been a 4-H leader for eight years. She has provided leadership for a wide range of 4-H programs and activities in home economics, agriculture and related areas.

Sursa has chaired the 4-H and Youth Subcommittee of the King County Program Building Committee and currently chairs the overall program building committee. She has been bookkeeper for the county fair and project show and has been treasurer of the county horse club. She also is active in the county and district adult leaders associations.

The 4-H leader also is active in a number of community development projects and in the Extension Homemakers Club.

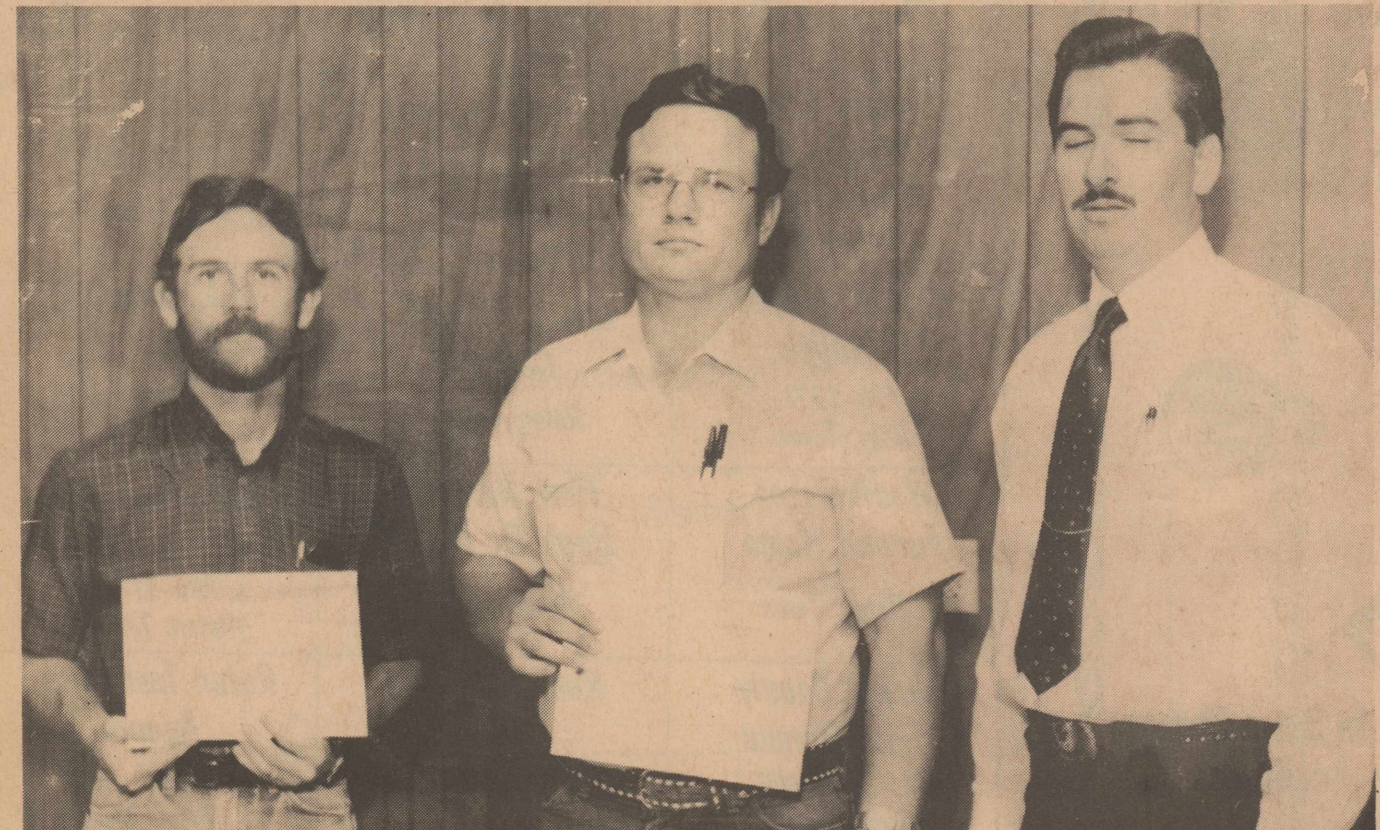

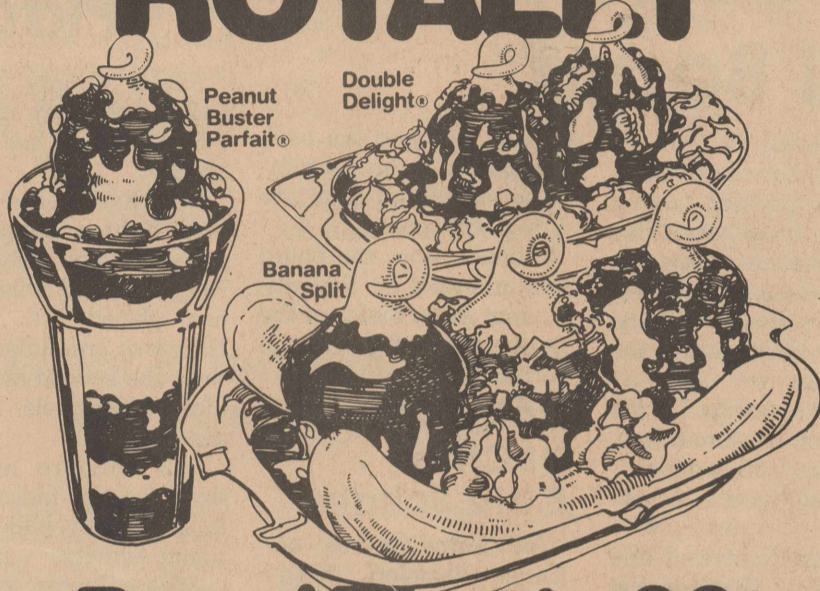

## Tax Planning

By James Rodgers

GENUINE TAX REFORM  
(It's Not Law Yet)

Just when tax reform appeared to be dying at the hands of special interest groups, Bob Packwood, Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee, took swift, bold moves to bring forth a genuine tax reform proposal. The bill trades off most deductions and credits for sharply reduced tax rates.

Included in this latest reform proposal are these provisions:

\* Two tax rates, 15% and 27%, would replace the current 14 rates ranging from 11% to 50%.

\* The current top corporate tax rate of 46% would be reduced to 33%.

\* Both the personal exemption and the standard deduction would increase. The personal exemption in 1987 would be \$1,900, increasing in 1988 to \$2,000. The standard deduction for joint filers would increase to \$5,000.

\* Contributions to IRA plans would not be deductible for individuals who have some other pension plan. The tax deferral on earnings in IRAs would continue, however.

\* The "paper losses" generated from tax shelters would be eliminated.

\* The 10% investment tax credit for business equipment would be eliminated, but depreciation for equipment would be made more generous.

\* Itemized deductions that would be retained include mortgage interest payments on homes, charitable contributions, state and local income taxes, real estate and personal property taxes. The deduction for sales tax paid would be eliminated.

\* Interest deductions on non-mortgage items would be limited to interest income.

\* A stiff 20% minimum tax for individuals and corporations would be established. Tax-exempt bond income would not be affected.

There is wide support for the Senate proposal, but keep in mind that it's not law yet. Don't make important financial decisions without first checking the status of tax reform.

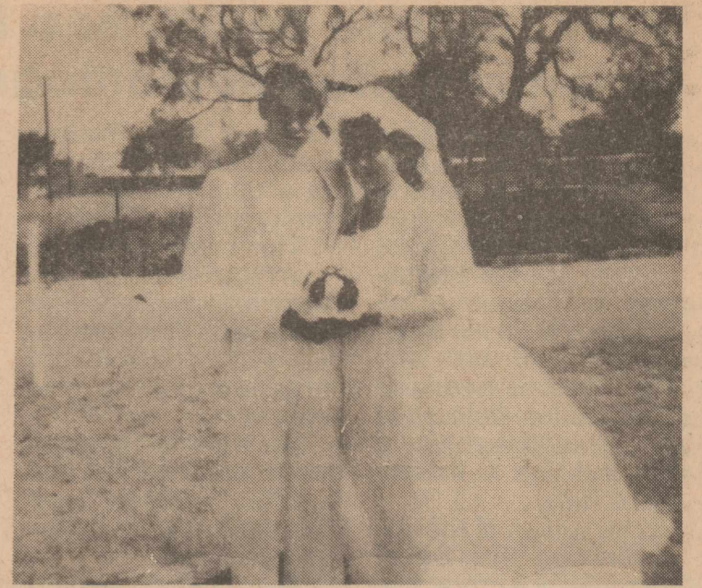

# County Agent Report

By Richard Spencer

Area pork producers have the opportunity to participate in a U.S. Department of Agriculture sponsored statewide election, July 7-11, to help select individuals for appointment to an industry-wide body that will administer a promotion, research and consumer information order for pork.

All pork producers in Texas are encouraged to vote in the elections. Candidates receiving the highest number of votes in each State will be eligible for appointment by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture to the State's allotted positions on the National Pork Producers Delegate Body.

The Delegate Body, consisting of approximately 165 producers, including two or more members representing each of the 40 states and four importers, will be responsible for administering all aspects of the pork order.

Voting in Fisher County will take place at the Extension Office at the Courthouse in Roby. The office will be open for voting each day Monday-Friday from 8:00-5:00.

Pork producers can vote in any county in their home State after signing a voter registration list certifying that they are pork producers in that State. Pork producers are urged to vote in person at the County Extension Office. If that is not possible, an absentee voting packet containing a ballot and registration form may be obtained from Jim Epstein, National Pork Producers Election, P.O. Box

23762, Washington, D.C., 20026-3762; telephone (202) 475-5407. Absentee ballots must be postmarked by July 11, and received at the above address no later than July 18.

Votes will be tallied at 9 a.m. on July 15 at the local county office of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service. The public is invited to be present at this official counting, and the results will be forwarded to the Secretary for consideration.
