Glover said the picture appeared gloomy at the outset of the storm Monday night. Power lines iced to about an eight of an inch but rain melted the ice before any damage had resulted.



The average yield of fifty-five varieties of grain sorghum was 4,563 pounds per acre in one of the 1959 grain sorghum tests at the High Plains Research Foundation. Dr. T. C. Longnecker, go to Horatio, Ark., to visit Director, announced today.

The hybrids and varieties were planted June 18 and had a total of 12 inches of water in three irrigations of 4 inches each on August 5, August 24 and Septvisit Mr. Huggins relatives in ember 8.

> The top twelve in this test were close in their yields. Each hybrid or variety was planted in 100 foot plots in four different locations throughout the test area. The two were harvested to determine the grain yield. The average yield of the four plots for each variety is the basis of the vield report.


