"Few city people realize or are told that most price support loans are repaid. It's a fact that over a 25-year period CCC has been repaid 84 cents on every dollar loaned in price support activity.

"Who's feeding at the public trough?" asks Doane's. "Subsidies in industry started back in the colonial days. The same magazines that harp about agriculture with such inaccuracy are receiving postal subsidies, even after rate increases. It is estimated that in 1956 the postal subsidy to 14 large magazines amounted to \$38,775,000. The postal deficit in behalf of business was greater in the 1945-56 period than the cost of CCC price support programs for the past 25 years."

What is the answer to these charges, Mr. Benson?
