California Woman Punched Repeatedly By Police Officer Arrested Again



Los Angeles, CA — Marlene Pinnock, the African American homeless woman who was filmed being punched repeatedly by a California Highway Patrol officer last year, has been arrested again and taken to the Los Angeles County Medical Center for psychiatric evaluation.

She was reportedly spotted around 2:30am walking on the shoulder of the busy I-10 highway. Officers picked her up and

took her to Los Angeles Medical Center for mental health evaluation.

Sgt. Jose Nunez, a public information officer based in Los Angeles County for the highway patrol, said, "They made verbal contact with her and she quickly became verbally uncooperative, didn't want to respond to what they told her. As they neared her, it escalated so they needed to take physical control of her."

He added, "The officers were concerned because it is unlawful to be on the shoulder of the highway and they were not able to spot a disabled vehicle near Pinnock," Nunez said.

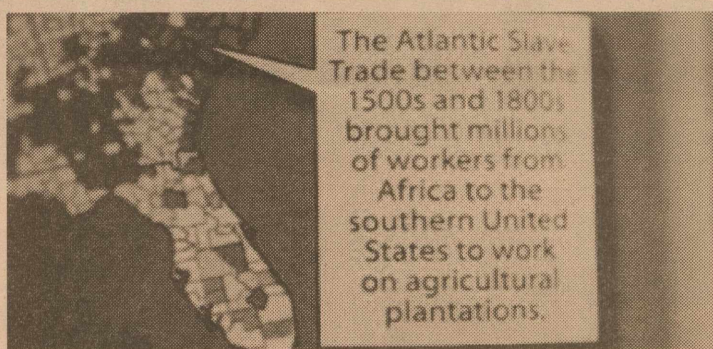
Upon arrival to the Los Angeles Medical Center, Pinnock was placed on a 72-hour psychiatric hold.

Regarding the incident on July 1, 2014, where Pinnock was repeatedly punched in the face by a California Highway Patrol officer, she eventually settled a lawsuit for \$1.5 million.

Black Lives Matter in Textbooks Too — McGraw Hill School Textbook Says African Slaves Were "Workers"

Nationwide — A ninth grade World Geography textbook published by McGraw Hill is currently underfire because of a caption in the book that says that describes African slaves as "workers." The term "workers" implies that the slaves received wages.

In addition, the discussion of slavery appears in a section within the book called "Patterns of Immigration" and the word immigration is being criticized because it implies that they willfully immigrated themselves.

Roni Dean-Burren, a Texas mom, whose son brought the matter to her attention, saw something else. She says that the textbook said some Europeans worked as indentured servants for "little to no pay," but doesn't mention anything about the forced labor African slaves endured.

"This is erasure," she told The Washington Post. "This is revisionist history — retelling the story however the winners would like it told."

She also posted a video on Facebook about it that immediately went viral and has more than 1.8 million views.

So what does McGraw Hill have to say about this?

Well, they posted a statement on their Facebook page, saying: "[We] conducted a close review

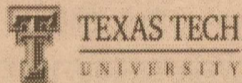

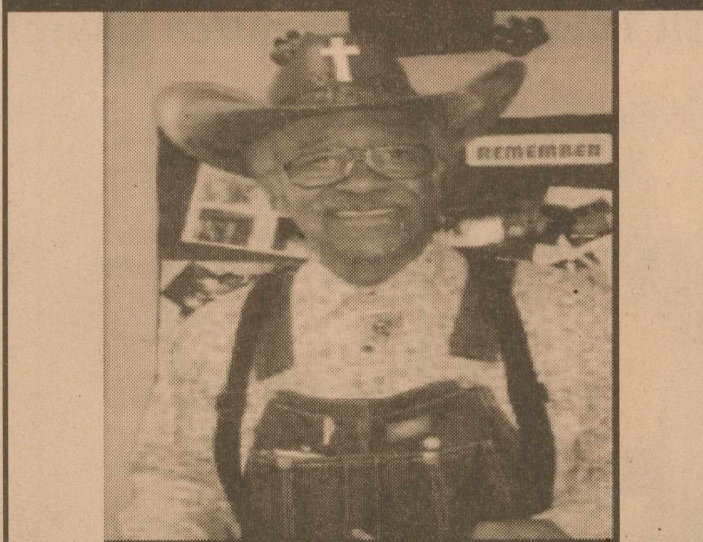

In Cinque

Three weeks ago, the United States of America has been graced with the presence of the Catholic Pope Francis. Letter to the Editor Donald Trump Thrashes Black Lives Matter "I Think They're Trouble"

have a civilized or centralized structure or formal leaders.

Trump also used his O'Reilly interview to jab at Democratic presidential candidates who have stumbled while addressing Black Lives Matters. Senator Bernie Sanders had a campaign event while former Secretary of State Hillary Clinton and former Gov. Martin O'Malley of Maryland were both criticized for saying "all lives matter," a phrase some people feel minimizes the "Black Lives Matter Movement."

O'Malley subsequently apologized, causing Trump to label him disgusting little weak pathetic baby." "I think it's disgraceful the way they're being catered to by the Democrats," Trump told O'Reilly. "And it's going to end up kicking them you know where. I don't think it's going to end up good."

Tarrant County College Chancellor Erma Johnson Hadley Dies

Fort Worth, Texas -- Erma Johnson Hadley, the first woman and African-American to lead Tarrant County College, has died.

Hadley, 73, died Thursday, October 1, 2015, of pancreatic cancer, the Fort Worth Star-Telegram reports.

Hadley was a founding faculty member of Tarrant County College, beginning her career in 1968. In 2010, she became the college's fourth chancellor.

"Mrs. Hadley oversaw its steady growth," the Star-Telegram reports. "Under her leadership, TCC's enrollment grew to 57,424 last fall, an increase of 26.7 percent from the fall of 2008. On her watch, TCC opened an aviation learning center at Alliance Airport and more recently, an innovative energy technology school at its south campus."

"Erma was laser-focused on the students we serve," Tarrant County College Board President Louise Appleman said in a message sent to faculty and staff Thursday. "Every decision she made was driven by her deep desire to provide access to higher education for our community and for that education to pave a path to success in today's workforce. We will miss her terribly and I personally have lost a dear friend."

Erma Johnson Hadley grew up in Legget, in East Texas. It was a small town, and she was the first African American from her high school to go to college. She went on to get an MBA, and spent her career in education.

"When her mother would walk her older sister to school in the mornings, and she was like 3, she would cry because she wanted to stay," says Gwen Morrison, a longtime friend and trustee for the Tarrant County community college district. "So she always wanted to learn."

Morrison says they bonded over their shared love of education. For both of them, it was a transformational force. And that's what drove Johnson Hadley to make sure everyone could benefit from it like she did.

"It's that commitment to make certain not only that educational opportunities are there for everybody, but that people feel comfortable getting engaged in that opportunity," Morrison says.

Johnson Hadley started at TCC in 1968 as a business professor, teaching classes at the newly established Northeast



campus. In a video produced by KERA, you can hear her passion for the job.

"I was having the time of my life. Because I was teaching so much more than my subject matter. I was teaching about black people, I was teaching them about getting along. And my students were very receptive. So we had kind of a love affair going on," she recalled.

So when she was asked to move into the administration, she wasn't sure -- leave the classroom behind.

"And my husband said just think of the number of people you can impact at the district office versus what you're impacting in the classroom. And I said OK," she said.

Bill Lacey says she made a huge impact. He's a retired vice chancellor at TCC. First in the personnel department, bringing talented faculty to the system. As Chancellor, he says, Johnson Hadley inherited a school that was in something of a rut, and refocused on rigor and service to students.

"She pulled, pushed, maybe even badgered, and Tarrant County started to move. And she had this laser focus on student success."

Lacey says he can't imagine a Tarrant County College without Erma Johnson Hadley.

T. J. Patterson, Sr. of Lubbock served on the Board of Trustees of Paul Quinn College with Hadley.

"She was an outstanding person," said Patterson.

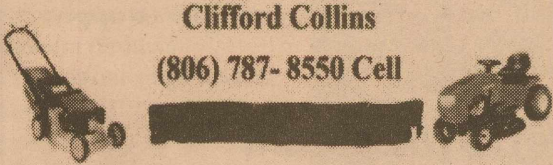
TCC names acting chancellor

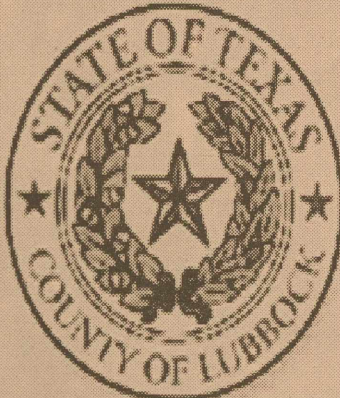

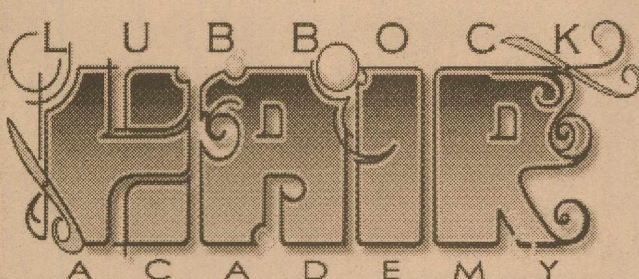

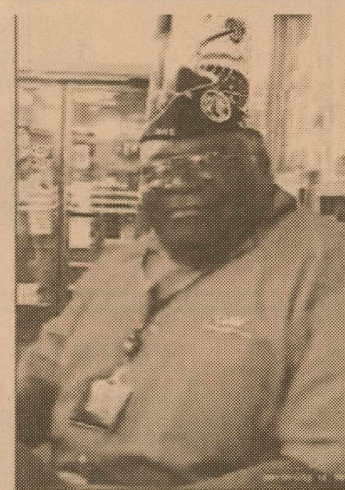

An Open Letter To Community

On the behalf of the African American Unified Umbrella Corp/The Way, we would like to express our deepest appreciation for all the donations we received to support our "Stop The Violence Campaign". The funds were used to travel to some of the hotbeds of youth violence around the country: Chicago, Los Angeles, and New Orleans. Although every single community in this country is touched by youth violence, these cities seem to have the most frequent occurrences. And these trips were necessary to gain a clear understanding of the causes and the cures for this spiritual and social epidemic.

Our most recent trip was to Chicago. It was the second time we visited that city this year. When we drove around the South side of the city, we encountered sadness and many heavy hearts because two days before our arrival another promising and talented young man, Dequiris Cannon, was shot and killed while sitting in a car a few blocks from his home. When we did some additional checking, we found that nearly everyday, this year, someone has lost their life by the hand of a young person in this country.

Later that evening, we attended a meeting at a neighborhood church on the very issue, "stopping the violence among our youth." The pastor of the church had everyone give their opinion of why they thought all these killings were taking place. Each person spoke from their heart. And we saw and heard outpourings of emotions that moved many as tears. There were young girls, young women, mothers, grandmothers, and one, sole, young man in attendance. Absent in attendance were fathers, grandfathers, and other young men.

The next morning, I attended the young man's funeral. You can never be fully prepared to deal with the loss of a loved one, especially when it is your child whose life has been cut short before its time. That was the sentiment that Dequiris' dad shared when he spoke about his son. He was a great son, brother, friend, student, and an athlete attested to by others. Now these violent deaths have a face. We felt the pain up close. We saw first hand how "youth violence" impacted one of the largest African-American communities in this country. We sensed the feelings that newspaper headlines and 15 seconds television news clips can not convey. When we gave our personal condolences to Dequiris' parents, we saw they were suffering with immeasurable grief. This was a horrific and senseless murder that put unbearable sorrows on a family. It greatly saddens us and our organization that this tragedy has been repeated hundreds of times around the country.

These are the problems we see:

- * Removal of prayer in schools;
- * Too many fathers are not actively engaged in their children's lives;
- * Children having children; and;
- * Epidemic high levels of idleness and unemployment among our youth.

Please help us continue our struggle against "youth violence" with your donations. We have a plan to address these problems. And we promise to dedicate our life and to use our voice and energy to "Stop the Violence."

arrival of African slaves in the U.S. as a forced migration and emphasize that their work was done as slave labor."

So will they update the book to be more accurate?

Apparently, not right away. The Washington Post says that the next hardcopy version may not be printed for a while because the current edition of the book is brand new.

Dean-Burren, comments, "I know they can do better. They can send out a supplement. They can recall those books. Regardless of whether you're left-leaning or right-leaning, you know that's not really the story of slavery. Minimizing slavery in any way is a way of saying those black lives, those black bodies, that black pain didn't matter enough to give it a full description."
