Kamala Harris Accepts Historic Vice-Presidential nomination, promising 'We will speak Truths'



Senator Kamala Harris, Democratic Vice President Nominee

Harris reintroduced herself to American voters in an acceptance speech that embraced her multicultural background, focused heavily on her family story and envisioned an America without Trump.

Making history as the first Black woman and the first Asian American to run on a major-party ticket, she spoke of the women who fought for equal and civil rights before her and of her immigrant mother, who instilled in her a passion for public service.

"I keep thinking about that 25-year-old Indian woman, all of five feet tall, who gave birth to me ... On that day, she probably could have never imagined that I would be standing before you now and speaking these words: I accept your nomination for vice president of the United States of America."

She offered a vision of America "where all are welcome, no matter what we look like, no matter where we come from or who we love, a country where we may not agree on every detail, but we are united by the fundamental belief that every human being is of infinite worth, deserving of compassion, dignity and respect."

"A country where we look out for one another, where we rise and fall as one, where we face our challenges and celebrate our triumphs together," she said.

"Today that country feels distant. Donald Trump's failure of leadership has cost lives and livelihoods," she continued.

Harris took only a few swings like that at Trump but mostly focused on her past and the country's future.

Speaking about racism, Harris said, "It has no eyes, and yet it knows exactly how we see each other. And how we treat each other. And let's be clear — there is no vaccine for racism."

She pledged that she and Biden would always be honest with the American people about the challenges the nation faced, a seeming dig at Trump's downplaying of the coronavirus.

"We will speak truths," she said, "and we will act with the same faith in you that we ask you to place in us."

With a single phrase, Kamala Harris illustrates the historic nature of her nomination: 'My chitthis'

It was a single word tucked into a 2,033-word speech, as easily missed by a casual listener

as it was a ringing signal of the historic nature of Harris's vice-presidential nomination.

A Tamil word illustrating her mother's Indian heritage, Harris tucked it into a reference about her diverse background and the all-encompassing way in which she defines family.

"Family is my husband Doug, who I met on a blind date set up by my best friend," she said. "Family is our beautiful children, Cole and Ella, who as you just heard, call me Momala. Family is my sister. Family is my best friend, my nieces and my godchildren."

And then it came. "Family is my uncles, my aunts," she said. "My chitthis."

The word, which refers to her mother's sisters, resonated and marked a subtle reference to the history of her nomination as the first Black woman and first Asian American woman to run for vice president on a major-party ticket. It was quickly noted around the world by South Asians, on social media and elsewhere, as a new moment in political recognition.

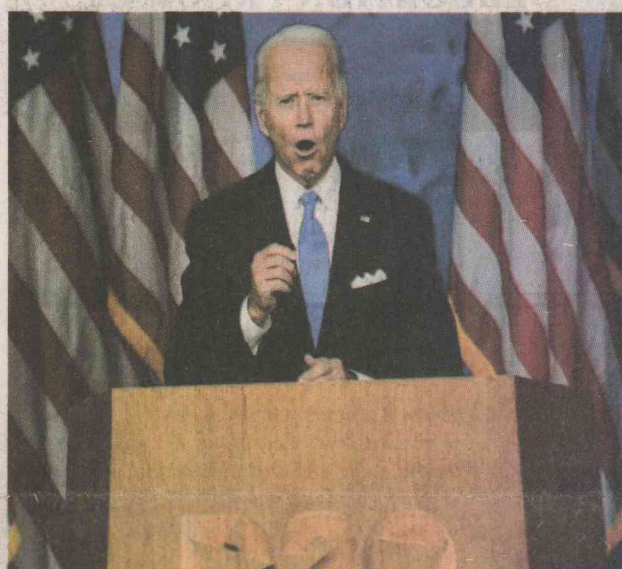

Joe Biden Accepts Democratic Party Nomination for President



WASHINGTON — Democratic presidential nominee Joe Biden accepted his party's nomination Thursday with a pledge to serve "all Americans" as a uniter and a healer.

"I'll be a Democratic candidate," said Biden, but "I will be an American president. I'll work hard for those who didn't support me, as hard for them as I did for those who didn't vote for me. That's the job of a president, to represent all of us, not just our base or our party. This is not a partisan moment. This must be an American moment."

Biden's speech projected stability, humanity and trustworthiness, qualities that he portrayed as the antidote to four years of President Donald Trump. Yet he never once mentioned Trump by name, surprising some viewers who expected Biden's speech to echo searing critiques of Trump delivered earlier this week by former President Barack Obama and others.

Biden's message was much more focused on unity, hope and promise than it was on drawing a contrast between himself and Trump. **Continued on Page 4**



"PANDEMIC VOTING"

November 3, is roughly thirteen (13) weeks away and from the moment there was talk of voting by mail, I have received e-mails almost daily to contact federal officers, Congressmen and women and the President to alleviate the hardships on the United States Postal Service.

It appears that the President of the United States, along with some of his big party campaign donors feel that if voters are permitted to mail in their ballots because of the pandemic, that he will lose votes and not be re-elected. Consequently, mail has been slowed down tremendously by removing machines from the post offices which could sort over 30,000 pieces of mail in a very short period of time. Besides that, many outside mailboxes have been removed, causing mailers to have to find a place to post their mail which may not be as convenient as before. In addition, to removing sorting machines and mailboxes, friends of the President have been installed in high positions in the post office hierarchy and experienced heads of departments have been moved, creating pandemonium in the post office.

Until 1971, the United States Post Office was a cabinet entity of the U. S. Government. It was one of the few departments specified in the U. S. CONSTITUTION. The establishments of roads mentioned in The CONSTITUTION were for the purpose of expediting the mail. The Pony Express needed roads to take the mail from one place to another in fair time. In 1971, during the Nixon administration, the Post Office was made into an independent agency under the executive branch of government and called the U. S. Postal Service, rather than department. The Postmaster General is no longer a cabinet member. The current

Postmaster General was not appointed by the President but yet he has far reaching influence as to the person who now holds that position and whom had little knowledge of what he is supposed to do. His employment has a great influence on the slow-down of the services and the need for financial input into the services. Party politics are at play and the American people are not just suffering from the pandemic brought on by the Coronavirus but the plague existing at the U. S. Post Office.

I do not foresee any immediate miracle for better postal services, but I can imagine that every soul, able or disable, get 'in cinque' and find a way to the voting polls on November 3 and vote. This time, I am being partial.

The National Black Chamber of Commerce And humble ventures Are Providing \$150,000 To Black-Owned Bars and Restaurants

Accepting Applications Now!

Early-stage effects of COVID-19 and lockdowns have disproportionately hit minority businesses. Analysis from the National Bureau Of Economic Research reveals 41% of Black business owners disappeared in April. Additionally, according to a Global Strategy Group survey, just 12% of Black and Latino business owners who applied for aid received what they had asked for. Twenty-six percent said they received only a fraction of what they had requested. Half say they anticipate closing in the next six months.

"Supporting Black-owned restaurants is one practical, actionable way to stand in solidarity with the Black community now, and always." - Bon Appetit Only 130 Black-owned restaurants received PPP loans over \$150,000, according to a report by Restaurant Business Online. Low numbers of federal stimulus loans to Black-owned restaurants reflect bad data collection and historically weak lending to people of color. Yet among companies that filled out the race question, just 1.3% of them were Black-owned, which demonstrates a long-term problem in small business financing.

Black-owned borrowers are simply less likely to get loans for their businesses, which is particularly important in a capital-intensive restaurant industry that depends heavily on financing for establishments to get off the ground.

gram went through the private lending meant it was always going to be racially discriminatory," said Sarah Crozier, senior communications manager with Main Street Alliance, a small business advocacy group. "The industry has financial redlining problems, and just on the data alone it has data collection problems."

The lack of loans is due in part to a lack of Black business ownership overall. Just 7% of U.S. businesses before the coronavirus pandemic were Black-owned, according to data from a University of California, Santa Cruz study last month.

By contrast, about 13% of the population, and about 13% of restaurant employees, are Black, according to federal data. To many advocates, some of the disparity in business ownership can be traced to challenges with financing—and those problems were reflected in the Paycheck Protection Program.

Advocates argue that the problem lies with the way the fund was created, which relied on private lenders to administer the funds, using the U.S. Small Business Administration's 7(a) program.

The data highlights the systemic neglect of minority business owners and the dire situation many are facing alone, which is why the National Black Chamber of Commerce (NBCC), in partnership with humble ventures, is announcing financial relief assistance to Black-owned bars and restaurants.

Together, we will be awarding \$150,000, in total, to Black-owned businesses through the program/application process outlined below:

Selection Criteria

NBCC and humble ventures will be supporting Black-owned bars and restaurants impacted by COVID-19. Two levels of approvals will review completed applications before being accepted and awarded the amount. Eligible businesses must be at least 51% Black-owned, registered with a physical United States address, have a bank account that accepts electronic payments, and have been in business for at least two years. Applicants will be required to complete a Form (one per business) requesting specific information including, but not limited to, ethnicity, contact informa-

tion, and supplemental documents for proof of work. Acceptable award expenses will go towards payroll, personal protection equipment (PPE), PPE training and materials, technology upgrades, mortgage or rent payment, and operating expenses.

The donations will be dispersed immediately upon acceptance. The awards (lump-sum up to \$2,000) will be sent electronically to the awarding business.

Biden Accepts Presidential Nomination

As President, Biden said, the first thing he would do is work to get the deadly coronavirus pandemic under control.

"We'll develop and deploy rapid tests with the results available immediately. We'll make the medical supplies and protective equipment that our country needs. ... We'll make sure our schools have the resources they need to be open, safe and effective. We'll put politics aside," said Biden.

"We'll take the muzzle off our experts so the public gets the information they need and deserve, honest, unvarnished truth. They can handle it. We'll have a national mandate to wear a mask. Not as a burden but as a patriotic duty to protect one another. In short, we'll do what we should have done from the very beginning."

Speaking alone on a flag-filled stage in Wilmington, Delaware, Biden had the challenge of creating drama and tempo for his words without the benefit of a supportive crowd from which to draw energy.

Nonetheless, the 77-year-old Biden, who became a U.S. senator at age 30 and served 36 years in the upper chamber, gave the speech of his life. He achieved moments of true emotion, anger, hope and sadness, and he made none of the verbal stumbles he sometimes does, remnants of a stutter he has worked to overcome his entire life.

"I will be a president who will stand with our allies and friends," said Biden. "I will make it clear to our adversaries that the days of cozying up to dictators are over," he added, a reference to Trump's warm relationships with several autocratic leaders around the world.

"Under President Biden, America will not turn a blind eye to Russian bounties on the heads of American soldiers. Nor will I put up with foreign interference in our most sacred democratic exercise — voting."

Biden's speech capped a four-day virtual convention that largely went off without a hitch. This was a significant accomplishment, given that no one had ever attempted to put on a virtual nominating convention before. Every minute of the eight hours

over four nights was uncharted territory.

Democrats featured a half-dozen prominent Republicans who endorsed Biden, and a slew of everyday Republicans who also support the former vice president. They put centrists on display night after night, and largely relegated the party's loudest progressive voices to the wings.

Whereas Trump's political speeches rely on energizing his supporters with constant references to who is a "real" American and who isn't, over and over on Thursday, Biden stressed inclusion and unity. The task facing the country is so great, he said, that it cannot be accomplished by a nation divided.

"Let us begin, you and I together, one nation under God, united in our love for America, united in our love for each other. For love is more powerful than hate, hope is more powerful than fear, light is more powerful than dark," said Biden. "This is our moment. This is our mission. Let history be able to say at the end of this chapter of American darkness began here, tonight, as love and hope and light joined in the battle for the soul of the nation."

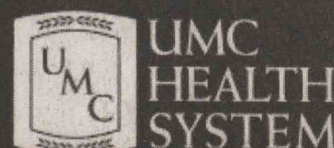

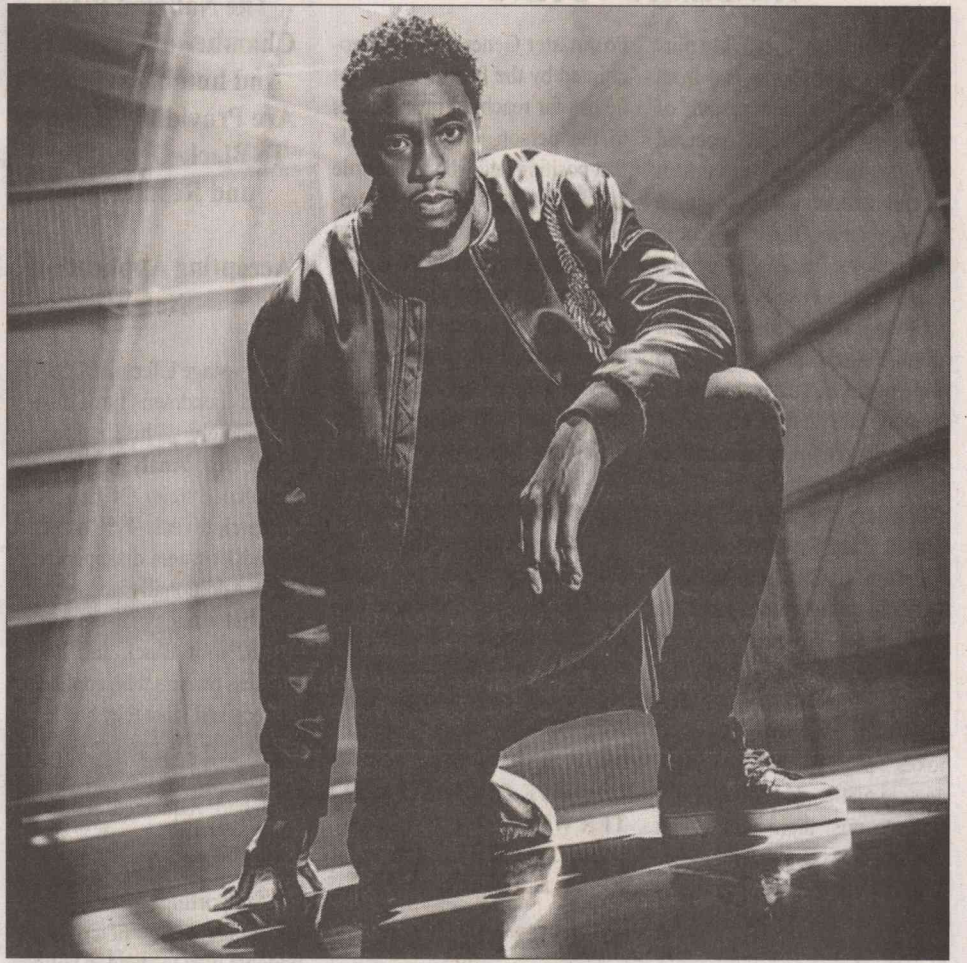

'Black Panther' Star Chadwick Boseman Dead at Age 43



Actor Chadwick Boseman, who played black icons Jackie Robinson and James Brown before finding fame as the regal Black Panther in the Marvel cinematic universe, died Friday of cancer, his representative said. He was 43.

Boseman died at his home in the Los Angeles area with his wife and family by his side, his publicist Nicki Fioravante told The Associated Press.

Boseman was diagnosed with colon cancer four years ago, his family said in a statement.

"A true fighter, Chadwick persevered through it all, and brought you many of the films you have come to love so much," his family said.

"From Marshall to Da 5 Bloods, August Wilson's Ma Rainey's Black Bottom and several more — all were filmed during and between countless surgeries and chemotherapy. It was the honor of his career to bring King T'Challa to life in Black Panther."

Boseman had not spoken publicly about his diagnosis.

Born in South Carolina, Boseman graduated from Howard University and had small roles in television before his first star turn in 2013.

His striking portrayal of the stoic baseball star Robinson opposite Harrison Ford in 2013's "42" drew attention in Hollywood and made him a star.

His T'Challa character was first introduced to the blockbuster Marvel movies in 2016's "Captain America: Civil War," and his "Wakanda Forever" salute reverberated around the world after the release of "Black Panther" two years ago.

The character was last seen standing silently dressed in a black suit at Tony Stark's funeral in last year's "Avengers: Endgame."

"You don't have the same exact experience as a black actor as you do as a white actor. You don't have the same opportunities. That's evident and true," he told the AP while promoting "42."

A calendar invite will be sent out as the meeting date approaches. Other specific information will be posted via several media outlets, forthcoming.

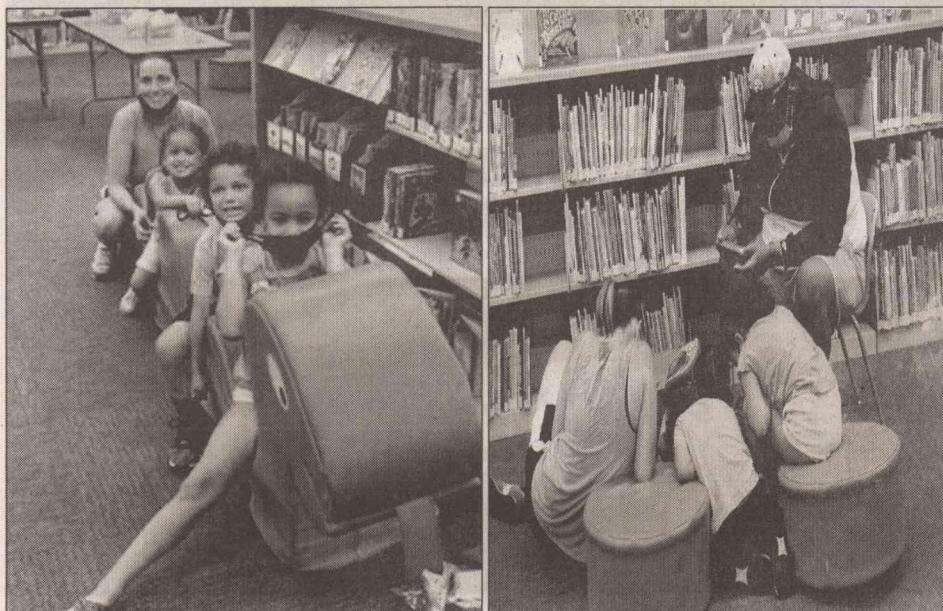
