Anthony May was named to the President's List for the fall semester at West Texas A&M. He is a iunior majoring in engineering technology and also is a member of the Buff Football Team.



# Silverton Man **Indicted For Pornography**

A man accused of inducing children to perform sex acts recorded in photographs and on video was indicted recently by a federal grand jury, according to a report in the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal.

Stephen L. Assiter, 54, of Silverton is charged with conspiracy to produce child pornography, four counts of interstate transport of child porn and three counts of receiving obscene material through interstate commerce.

According to court documents. Assiter and a woman, who was not indicted, recruited minors to perform sexual acts on film.

Authorities confiscated a CD-ROM containing images of child pornography, computer video files of girls and boys performing sex acts and obscene computer images including depictions of bestiality.




