Third grade students each had made a sandwich for a soldier, putting a note and signing their name on it.

Kindergarten students waved at the soldiers as they arrived in Silverton. The soldiers waved back and honked the horns on their trucks.

The event was sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce and Fire Department, with lots of help from Silvertonarea residents who provided over 1,000 sandwiches, at least 31 freezers of homemade ice cream, brownies, fruit, group supplied bags of cucumber, celery and carrot sticks, and these were very popular with the soldiers.
