

# **SBA Economic Injury Loans Available for Drought Victims**

Businesses in some Texas ter assistance through other counties can now apply for low Federal agencies; however, interest Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the U.S. drought disasters can apply. Small Business Administration (SBA). These loans are available to help businesses meet normal operating expenses that cannot be met due to the effects of a disaster. Drought that occurred from September 15 - December 31, 2003, caused many farmers reduced incomes which may have had an adverse economic effect on businesses depending upon these producers. Farmers and ranchers are not eligibile for this loan program but may be eligible for disas-

Businesses in these counties are eligible to apply: Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Collingsworth, Donley, Gray, Hall and Wheeler.

To obtain an application or receive additional information, interested business owners may call the SBA toll-free and ranchers to experience at 1-800-366-6303 or TDD 817-267-4688 for the hearing impaired. The deadline for filing an application is December 28, 2004.

Due to the weather, many producers experienced crop losses and were not able to purchase goods and services at normal levels. Businesses who are dependent upon these producers may have experienced decreased sales, reduced gross profit margin, in-
