**Attention** Dog **Owners** 

> HB 2065 Effective 9-1-91 Ch. 822, Subch D, Health & Safety Code

Added to regulate vicious dogs. Owners are required to register, restrain and obtain liability insurance in the amount of at least \$100,000 to cover damages from attacks by dangerous dogs. A dangerous dog is one that is designated by the animal control officer because it is outside its required enclosure and makes an unprovoked attack causing bodily injury or commits unprovoked acts and causes a person to reasonably believe that the dog will attack and cause bodily injury. Appeals from animal control officer's decision that the dog is dangerous go to the local municipal court or to JP not later than the 30th day the owner is notified that a dog is designated a dangerous dog. Appeal from minicipal court of JP as in other civil cases.

#### Sec. 822.044

Owner is guilty of Class C misdemeanor if dog makes unprovked attack outside pen and causes bodily injury. If dog causes serious bodily injury or death, owner is guilty of Class A misdemeanor. Convicting court may order dog destroyed. City attorney may file a civil suit to collect a civil penalty not to exceed \$10,000 which may be retained by the municipality.

#### Sec. 822.045 (a)

A person who owns or keeps custody or control of a dangerous dog commits a Class C misdemeanor if the persons fails to register, restrain or obtain liability insurance coverage.

#### Sec. 822.047

Cities may also regulate dangerous or vicious dogs, as long as municipal ordinance is not breed (s)-specific and is at least as stringent as state law provisions.

#### KING HOMER LOREL HAILE

Homer Lorel Haile is the youngest son of Lucius Beaver (L.B.) and Z.T. Braddock Haile. He was born Sept. 24, 1916 in Dickens County, Texas, about 70 miles east of Lubbock. The Hailes had three other sons, Orville, who died in infancy and the late Verlon and Arlyn.

Lorel remembers the move made to Sherman County when he was five years old during the winter of 1923. The family took a room with kitchen privileges at what is now the home of Marillyn Albert. The two young brothers, Arlyn and Lorel started to school in Stratford, but Lorel was told he was too young after a time, when temporary living quarters were built on their property southeast of Stratford, they moved there in March of 1923. The teacher at Coldwater School said it was okay to send Lorel on with Arlyn. That is "how-cum" the two brothers graduated the same year.



> Keep in mind that the smaller the particles are, the faster and easier decompostion will be. Large twigs and limbs from woody plants should be reduced into smaller forms before being placed on the Nearly anything that was once pile. Leaves with a waxy or shiny take longer to decompose. Pine grass clippings, kitchen wastes needles should be well mixed into

> > Frequently turning the pile will greatly speed the composting process. To turn the pile, use a pitchfork to mix the raw matter on the outer sides with the hot, "cooking" compost in the center.

> > the organic decomposes, the temeperature inside the pile rises. You'll know when the decaying matter has run out of oxygen and needs to be turned because the temperature inside will noticeably drop. After each turning, the pile should peak temperatures within a few days before cooling again.

The extra effort involved in frequent turning can pay off handsomely. A well-constructed pile, turned with a fork every three days, can produce usable compost in as little as 12 days during bottom layer of brush to hold the summer. On June 28, 1991, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (Southwestern Bell) filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (Commission) to add a new optional service offering for business Private Branch Exchange (PBX) Trunk customers called Digital Loop Service. The application has been assigned Docket

Digital Loop Service provides digital transmission of circuit switched voice and data communications between the customer's premises and the central office. This service allows the customer to use a 1.544 Mbps facility capable of delivering up to 24 line terminations. Southwestern Bell will provide Digital Loop Service within the customer's serving central office where facilities are available.

If approved by the Commission, the rates for the Digital Loop Service facilities will be \$445 per month for each digital transmission loop arrangement which provides a capacity of up to 24 line terminations, plus \$3 per month for each line termination and \$9 per month for each channel termination. The proposed rate for the unlimited use of the central office varies from \$12.25 up to \$18.90 per month for each line termination depending on the rate group classification, determined by the customer's location. Southwestern Bell estimates revenue of \$2.1 million from this offering during the first year.

As proposed by Southwestern Bell, customers who currently receive digital loop compatibility through facilities installed under a special construction agreement will have the option to receive their current digital loop arrangements pursuant to the Digital Loop Service Tariff or continue to pay their current charges until they make a change of location or account. Any increase in the number of line terminations to a customer's current digital transmission loop arrangement will be provided pursuant to the proposed Digital Loop Service Tariff; however, the customer will continue to have the option of paying current charges for the existing digital transmission loop capacity. Southwestern Bell's proposal to "grandfather" existing digital loop facility arrangements is subject to review and approval by the


