This happened last October, following a continuation of Turkink atrocities upon the Armenian race. Fifty thousand were thus deported but thousands and thousands died from exposure before reaching a Near East Relief station. Those that did arrive were in the last stages of death from exposure. and thousands of operations were performed on frozer limbs.

"Did they get food, clothing and shelter. No. Supplies were low. They got some soup, some black bread, and for clothing they got old flour sacks and burlap bags. For shelter, they were turned out again into the mountains and the bitter winter, because there was no room for them and only sufficient supplies left for the 10,000 orphans in that section. How many of them later died from exposure, no one knows.

POLO PLAYED FOR CENTURIES

Drachenfels, or Dragon's rock, named Game is Known to Have Been in Exletence for More Than Two Thousand Years.

> two thousand years there have been twelve varieties of the game of polo. The earliest form known was primiive, consisting of feats of horsemanship and skill. The early Persian form described in Shamana was a highly organized game with rules, played by four on each side. In Persia, in the Sixteenth century, the grounds were 300 by 170 yards, and the play resembled the rough football of the same period in England. This game became more highly organized in the next

The Byzantine form played at Constantinople in the Twelfth century used a leather ball the size of an apple and a racquet. The Chinese game, vogue about 600 A. D., was played with a light wooden ball. The Japanese form, popular in feudal i still survives under the name of dakin. or ball match.

In an ancient Indian variety the sides are ranged up on opposite ends of the grounds and the ball is thrown This is probably the form of the gome which reached India from Persia and is represented today by Manipur and Gligit polo, though these forms are rougher than the old Indian game.
