### 12,000 Area Farmers OK Wage Ceiling

Sweetwater, Abilene, Wichita alls and Childress areas favored placing of wage ceilings on ng and picking the current p in 39 counties of northwest Texas. There were only about 600 farmers in this area who opposed the establishment of a ceiling.

Because of the unusual interest of the cotton growers, the State Board of Stabilization and Price Ceiling was asked to hold hearings and to take testimony of cotton farmers in this area. The hearings were held last week at Sweetwater and Vernon.

Testimony of farmers representthis area indicated that it was almost a unsnimous opinion that price ceilings should be put on pulling and picking this year's cotton crop. The State Board, as a result of the hearings, placed a ceiling price of \$1.25 for pulling and \$2.00 for picking. hauling and service charge, delivered at the gin, was given a ceiling of 25c per 100 pounds up to a distance of 15 miles, and 30c per 100 pounds over 15 miles.

Because of this action by the State Board and requests of the farmers, it will, therefore, become unlawful for any farmer within the 39 counties, which include Knox County, to pay a pulling or picking price in excess of that set by the State Board. garding wages applies to all farmers at all times.





Today, our government has ac knowledged the debt the people as a whole owe to the migratory agricultural workers of our country, and passed an emergency act approved by Congress in 1943 and re-enacted on February 14, 1944. which assigned to A & M College Extension Service, the responsibility of recruiting, training and placement of farm was performed by other agencies. the last of which was the United States Employment Service.

The main objective of the Extension Service Farm Labor program is to obtain the maximum utilization of farm labor, especially the migratory worker
